THE NOTTOG PAGEANT

GORGEOUS FLOATS WILL WIND
THROUGH MULTITUDE.

ILLUMINATION WILL DAZZLE
This Year's Pageant During Houston
No-Tau-Oh November 9th. Will
Eclipse All Former Parades.

Preparations are maturing for the
entertainment of fifty thousand people
on the night of November 9 in the
city of Houston. The night of the ap-
pointed pageant is the King Nottog and
the Queen Nottog.

There will be twenty illuminated ve-
hicles in the magnificent pageant.
There will be innumerable floats
and outstanding effects, as in
pageants as in former years.
The floats will be decorated with
through the principal thoroughfares,
covering almost every space of the city to
part of a distribution for the throng
that will surely be in Houston to wit-
ness the grand spectacle.

The annual parade of King Nottog
has come to be accounted among the
great annual events of the country. It
takes first place alongside the Mardi
Gras parades of New Orleans each
spring. During the past few years
the managers of the Mardi Gras pa-
geant and the managers of the King
Nottog pageant have been vying with
each other in their efforts to out-
do the other. The result is that with each year
the Nottog pageant, as well as the Mardi
pageant, are more magnificent than
those of the year previous.

Along with the progress toward per-
fection in these features, the attend-
ance increases each year. Last year
there were more than forty thousand
men, women and children lining the
streets of Houston during the parade.
With the increasing popularity of the
pageant, coupled with the
fact that this year will
be all former parades in magnifi-
cence and appointment, the managers
feel that they will be safe on counting
up to a hundred thousand people as an au-
dience this fall.

Provisions will be made to
take care of the number of people that
are expected to attend. The
pageant in Houston has increased
considerably over former years,
and the managers are preparing al-
ready for the crowds.

There need be no fear of pickpockets
during the immense throng, for
the Houston chief of police is
in conference with the heads of the
detective bureaus of Cincinnati, Chi-
cago, St. Louis, Kansas City, Memphis,
Denver, San Francisco and New York,
and picked men hunters from each
city will circulate among the crowd
while hundreds of special officers will
be stationed in Houston on that night from
every city in the State, and among
the officers will be men who have de-
veloped many years of acquaintance
with the professional light-fingered
gang. So adept have these
men become that they know by sight
most of the professional crooks, and
they are so keen that they are able to
arrest a new man in the business as
soon as he appears on the streets.
They know more about the habits and
characteristics of the crooks than the
bookworm man does about the deer.

As a matter of fact, the professional
crooks have given the Nottog a
wide berth during the past three or
four years. They are aware that the
professional man-catchers will be on
the ground and they do not dare risk
being nabbed, for that would mean a
term in the state penitentiary of this
state, and, perhaps, trial and convic-
tion for crimes committed in other
states. At any rate, no one need fear
that his property will be in jeopardy
during the throng that will witness
the King Nottog parade.

During the parade, posters will waft
varnished skeletons through the crowd
with a loud afterthought of sweets
will be shown out to entertain the
throng. There will be a parade
float on all the bands that will be in
Houston during the week. It is ex-
pected that there will be at least a
dozen full bands in the parade.

One of the interesting features of
the pageant is the illumination of the
streets and windows of buildings. Ever
building in the downtown district will
be lit up with myriad of incandes-
cent globes of every shade and color,
forming odd and new effects, while
there will be strings of incandes-
cent globes on each side of the street,
with cross sections at each street inter-
section. The street lights, the illumina-
tion of the buildings, coupled with the
illumination by red fire of the floats,
will produce a gorgeous effect, and only
cellesting Oriental splendor.

All the railways entering Houston
will put on a very low round-trip rate
from every point in the state, with
simple stop-over privileges. The trains
will enter Houston in the afternoon
and early evening in time for all those
who may arrive on that date to view
the spectacular pageant, and there will
be trains out on every road early next
morning for all those who may feel
that they must get back home.
