The Story of Cancer Control

This is Article one of ten such stories which are being published by request of the Harlin Tyler County Medical Association.

No. 1
 A specialist has said that at least four types of cancer could be eradicated as easily as the diphtheria. Today our methods of recognizing, preventing and treating cancer are such that if we could get the correctly informed patient to the correctly informed and equipped physician and dentist, cancer deaths would rapidly fall from second place in the cause of death to a much less significant place.
 He named cancer of the skin, lip, mouth and cervix as the four types that could be eradicated. At present, he said, these types alone claimed 30,000 deaths a year and could be entirely avoided by continuous medical supervision.
 Continuous supervision differs from periodic health examination in that the time of examination is not arbitrarily fixed but is determined by the personal physician and dentist in accordance with each individual case.
 The physician, determining the patient's needs, may call the patient to report each in two weeks, four months or six months, as the case may be. Deaths from cancer are largely due to ignorance. Continuous medical and dental supervision will seek out the cancer before it becomes a deadly disease and will increase the cure of the early stages of cancer to the very limit.
 This means cancer control for all people and the profession so that the patient need not go to the doctor for a "shot" and get either pneumonia or cancer.
 Women's vitality and endurance depend upon the health of the mouth and skin, so that the importance of these two types of cancer control among them is obvious.
 Women smokers do not develop as much cancer of the mouth as men because they practice oral hygiene more scrupulously than men, and are more particular about keeping their teeth clean. Women should never let cancer of the face because they pay attention to the first skin blemish.
 We believe that the best protection from cancer as you have probably heard, is smallpox and cholera, you must see a physician and a dentist to them for an examination but yourself under their continuous supervision. Give them an opportunity by their examinations to discover the little local spots in the skin and the tiny, tiny cancer of the skin and the tiny cancer of the cervix and mouth will be largely prevented and the chances of discovering and curing cancer very much less greatly increased.

'Black Widow' Spider Menace

Several cases of spider poisoning by the bite of the so-called black widow spider have been reported in Texas this year and people who live in rural districts might well take precautions against bites from these poisonous insects, warns Dr. John W. Brown, State Health Officer.

The scientific name of the black widow spider is *Latrodectus mactans*, and it is called the "hour-glass" "black widow" and "hour-bottle spider." Its shiny black round abdomen gives rise to the name of shoe button and the bright red patch which may be shaped like an hour-glass, is responsible for the hour-glass designation. It contains the name "black widow" from its custom of eating its mate. The body of the female is often an inch in length and the long, shiny black legs may stretch over a spread of as much as two inches.

This spider builds its web in dimly lighted places, generally in old holes, garages, and other buildings. Its rough, coarse, irregular web as found under floors in corners, between rafters, but especially under the floors of cellars, sheds, barns, etc.
 "Black widow" has been seen in the Texas Department of Health report to the best method of controlling these insects. Spray the spider with insecticide in cracks and crevices, particularly around the seats of old bolsters as an infallible procedure. But precautions must be taken against bites. As soon as you can, crush the egg mass as soon as you find it. Other eggs do not hatch and hatchlings, although they are being made at the present time to find a parasite which will feed on the egg masses.
 After the sharp stinging bite, wash the part involved in the region of the bite with soap and water. In addition to the pain, there is generally muscle contraction, difficult breathing, cold perspiration, nausea, and an extreme rigidity of the abdomen. If recovery occurs, there is a long convalescence, during which there is weakness, numbness, and pain. There should be no delay in getting a physician in cases of a spider bite.
