

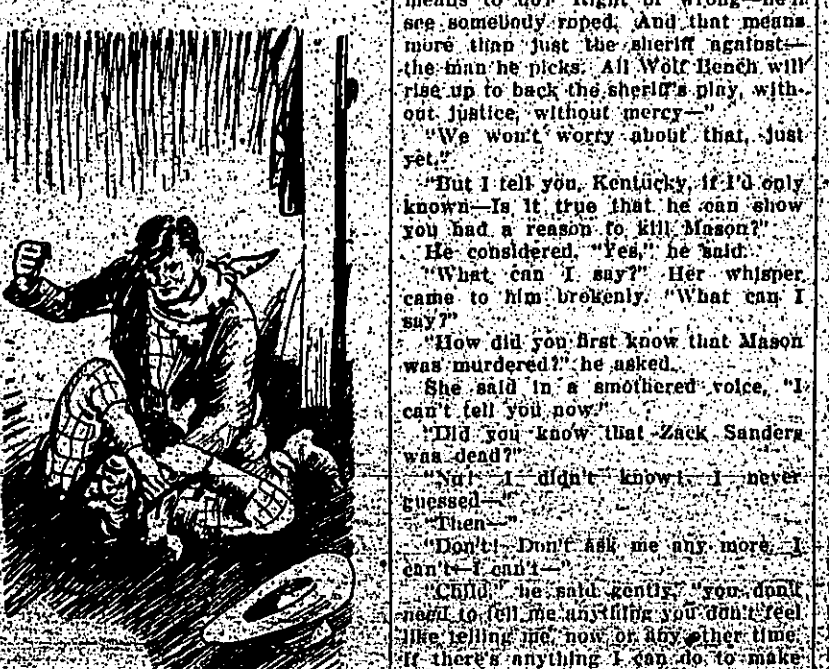

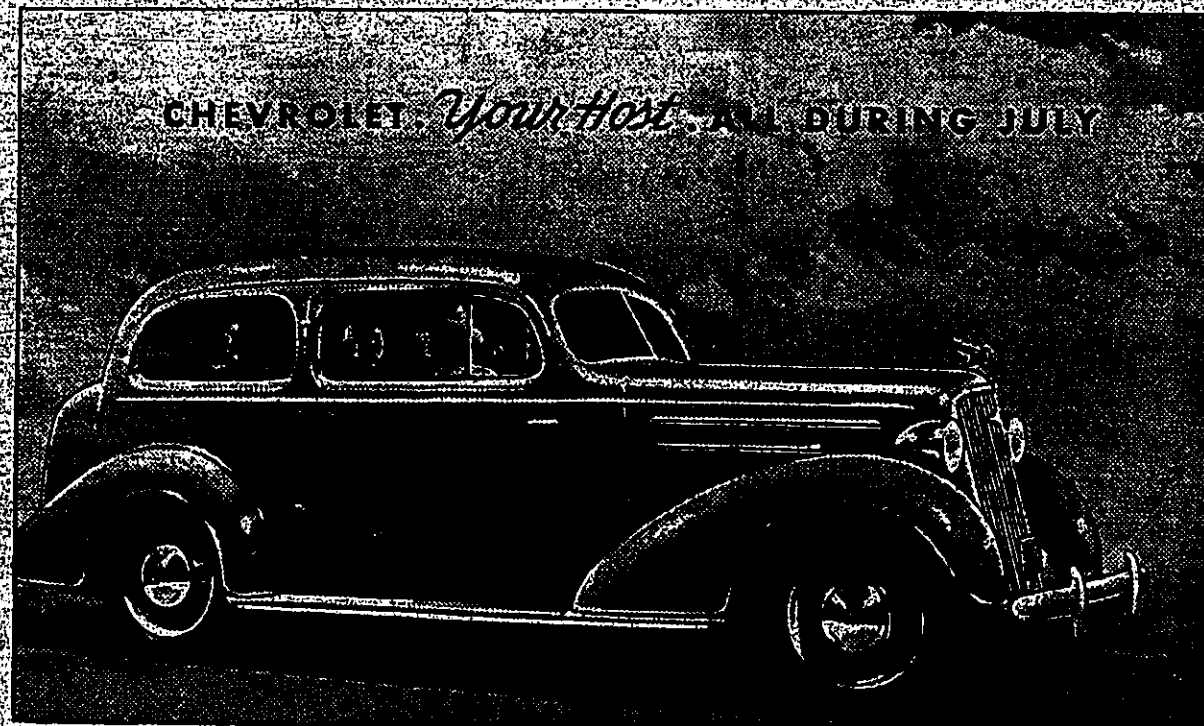

**QUARANTINE AND ISOLATION**

Quarantine and isolation have long been practiced to limit the spread of contagion. Theoretically these measures should no longer be necessary for diphtheria and smallpox. These diseases are absolutely preventable, said Dr. John W. Brown, State Health officer. Practically, however, we still have smallpox with us and cases as well as deaths due to diphtheria occur only too often. Control and preventative measures are now directed against scarlet fever, measles, and whooping cough. Nevertheless, until such measures find more universal application, isolation and quarantine continue to be emphasized. There are in a true sense, essential in the control of disease.
