Dear Sir: I trust that you will pardon me for writing you again with reference to the Old Age Pension Bill, but there are many people in my district who are directly interested in this legislation and I would like to give them the following information:

The bill has been passed and signed by the governor and some revenue has been provided. The state board has been appointed, and in the near future, local administrative bodies will be appointed to receive applications. It is going to take some time to get the Pension Board properly functioning as there will be over 100,000 applications.

In my opinion, the pensions are now certain and I sincerely trust that the good people of my district will not have cause to worry further about the matter.

I therefore want to give my personal assurance to the deserving people in my district entitled to benefits under this law that in my opinion the benefits will be paid as soon as it is practical to work out proper plans for administering the relief.

SAVING THE BOOSTER'S PLUM BEARING TREE

Several of the county egg structures who have viewed the big plum tree at the rear of the Booster plant, have definitely decided that the tree was about to fold up and do a fade-away as far as yielding more fruit.

This writer attended the Colman school fall, last fall and caught up with everybody's friend, Dr. James G. Gee, Professor of Horticulture, at the Huntsville college. He mentioned this tree and O. O. Dr. Gee immediately began a scientific talk about bugs, poison worms, and a lot of figures, etc. I didn't understand the last combination, but perfectly, and told Miller to start over. Miller makes a record for himself and says Willard's tree and will not want it about a dozen of such a tree on some trees I have examined somewhere in or about Huntsville.

Miller came down, inspected, dug into branches, while washed, fertilized and dug in and around the roots, poured in some of the "flea" smelling talcum powder we ever used, and straightened up and exclaimed, "Say Willard, I've got your tree saved, but I want you to know I'm boss here about and do not want any horticultural experts monkeying with this plum tree, save and except Dr. James G. Gee. All this tree needs now is several sprayings, some commercial fertilizer next spring. You'll find it not necessary to go into mourning over the sudden death of the best plum tree growing in East Texas."

FIRST THANKSGIVING DAY

The first Thanksgiving day was proclaimed for the purpose of giving thanks for the colonists' health that had allowed them to survive the first rigorous year in America. Dr. John W. Brown, State Health officer, asks that citizens of Texas give thought to their own health at this season of the year.

Although we have experienced one of the longest depressions in history, the people have retained their health to a remarkable degree. Last year Texas was one of the few states to show a further decline in deaths among infants.

During the last 50 years health departments have been established for the purpose of preventing disease. While their activities have been hampered by a lack of funds, a great improvement in the general health has resulted. During this period the life of the average person has been increased by 25 years. In other words a baby born now is expected to live 48 years longer than than if he had been born in 1888.

So let each give thanks for the methods that have helped in the conservation of life and also pledge to assist in furthering the work being done to improve health conditions throughout the nation.

F. F. AS-TAN LEATHER

The fourth year vocational agriculture class of the Colman high school has been tanning leather recently. The first hides taken to tan by the class was November 24, and Monday the first hide was finished and leather ready for use. The leather tanned was chrome leather which will be used by the boys to make bridles, halters, and harness. The first hide was furnished by W. H. Gilchrist, president of the Colman school board. He furnished the chemicals and the boys tanned the hide on Saturdays.

Several other hides will be completely tanned this week. Any farmer in Tyler county desiring horse tanned leather is invited to inspect the leather that has been tanned. The boys and instructor of vocational agriculture will tan hides and arrangements can be made for the tanning by sending a copy of Miller's leaflet, members of the Colman school club, in this issue.

Roosevelt's Next Birthday Party

Infantile Paralysis again stalked through the land this last year, adding thousands of new victims to the several hundred thousand already crippled. The need of continued effort in their behalf is greater than ever, and once more the call is made for you to participate in the campaign, which for the past two years you all have aided so generously and with such outstanding to communities all over America.

President Franklin D. Roosevelt, as everyone knows, has again consented to lend his birthday, Jan. 30, for another nation-wide series of Birthday Balls for the benefit of these Infantile Paralysis sufferers.

We are fully aware that the success of the Birthday Ball held last year was due to splendid cooperation, not only of the people of all of America, but of the citizens in all walks of life everywhere.

The President has approved the suggestion that 70% of the proceeds used by each local Birthday Ball be retained in the community to be distributed to local or adjacent charitable hospitals or for the benefit of local infantile paralysis clinics in the local committee districts. This allotment was approved last year; the plan worked well and has been approved throughout the country. 30% of the proceeds will be turned over to the National committee for delivery to the President to be presented by him to the Georgia Warm Springs Foundation for the continuation and extension of its part in the national fight against Infantile Paralysis.

You were a tremendous help last year in securing for us a member of your community to serve as general chairman for your local birthday ball, and in cooperating with him. We are today communicating our request to this same chairman to act again in a similar capacity.

GUNS OF HUNTERS TAKE 37 LIVES

It is presumed that the nation's dead by the auto route has failed to become news. Monday's papers failed to state the dead over the week end with the auto accident route.

But to keep up with the killings the following story was published on the front pages of some of the leading Texas Monday a. m. papers: Chicago, Nov. 24—Hunting guns have taken the lives of 37 hunters this season, a survey disclosed Sunday. Most of the victims were concentrated in the northern tier of states with New York reporting the most fatalities. Its deer season, closed November 1, cost the lives of 18 hunters. Three have been killed since. The wounded and injured numbered 84.

Maine and Minnesota were second and third in hunting fatalities with 13 and 10 respectively.

By sections the deaths reported were: New England, 23; Eastern, 21; Midwestern, 33; Western, 7; Southern, 3.

The deaths from week end motor accidents on Monday, Nov. 10, were reported at 88.

RECKLESS DRIVING IS MOVIE SUBJECT

Los Angeles, Nov. 22—Probably the most powerful indictment ever written against reckless driving is the article, "And Sudden Death," which appeared first in the *Reader's Digest* and later in pamphlet form and still later in *The Booster*. So graphically are the consequences described in this denunciation that many judges have made offenders buy 10 and many automobile clubs sent it to their members. Paramount has purchased the title and will produce a picture based on safety.

Something About Rabies Symptoms

Woodville is, without doubt in the middle of an epidemic of rabies or hydrophobia. Under such conditions I would seriously advise that the untrained, not depend upon his diagnosis of the disease. However, all most people are of the opinion that it is always their neighbor's dog that develops rabies and never theirs. They are apt to expose themselves to the disease during the early stages of the disease or when a dog does not show typical symptoms of rabies.

The average person will run from a dog that is running wild from the local parties and get because of lack of knowledge will right into a dog that is not vicious, but yet one that shows typical symptoms of rabies.

Most people think that rabies is a curable disease as the usual form of the disease is a matter of a few days. The disease is one in which the symptoms show up independent of the usual pattern of the brain is involved.

Listed below are some of the more typical diagnostic symptoms of rabies. Every symptom listed is present in one particular case or are they all present at the same stage of the disease. Any of the following symptoms should warrant one to consider the case of rabies and that the dog or the laboratory proves that it is not rabies. If the dog lives he did not have rabies. If the laboratory finds the negat bodies in the brain it is positive that he did.

(1) Any dog that shows a drooping of the lower jaw should be avoided.

(2) A dog that has a change of voice while barking or howling is also suspicious.

(3) One that shows a sudden change of disposition, either changing to an extra friendly dog or becoming extra vicious or becoming extremely nervous exemplify this.

(4) Often the paralysis is noted by the corners of the mouth being drawn back which causes the dog to have a grinning appearance.

(5) The brain disturbance is often noted by the pupil of one eye being larger than the other.

(6) Often the victim is unable to swallow normally and the owner thinks the dog is choked.

Watch for those symptoms; they may save you from the expense and worry of taking treatment or better still they may prevent one of your child's being with this incurable disease.

The compelling appeal of the most famous of Red Cross world war posters has been adapted by the distinguished artist Lawrence Wilbur in the 1935 Red Cross roll call poster.

"The Greatest Mother in the World" was the title given to the original creation of Alonso Bart Foringer, eminent mural artist and illustrator of New York. The poster gave the keynote of the second war fund drive of the Red Cross, and millions of copies were distributed throughout the nation.

The posters are distributed through 5700 Red Cross chapters and 5,000 teachers in an appeal to every man and woman to join as a member during the annual roll call.

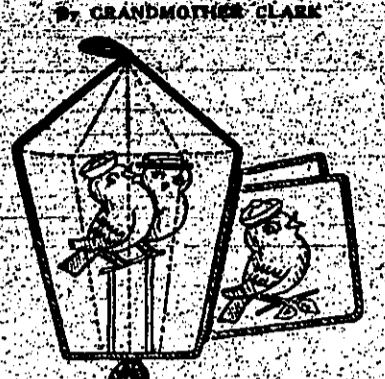

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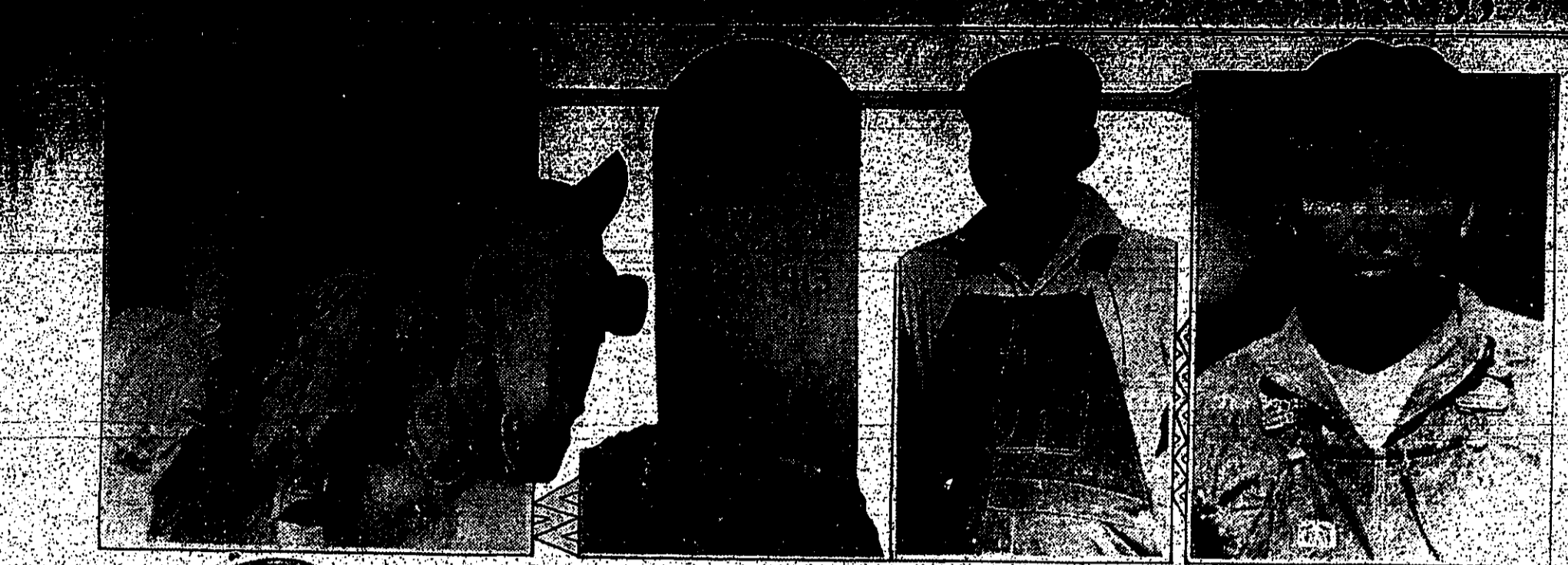
