

Rockland Dam O.K., Needs Cash

The latest report from Washington on the Rockland dam application is that it has been approved by all the government agencies, such as engineering, and lacks only the final allocation to become a fact.

As yet, no stands, the project for providing industrial, agricultural and domestic fresh water in abundance for several counties of southeast Texas (PWA) financed a little over \$12,000,000.

By an act of the State legislature the Lower Neches Valley authority was created as the official executive body for the project. Levying of taxes in the district is prohibited. The federal loan would be paid back through revenue from all present and future needs.

Added argument for the project is offered in such instances as the establishment of the Atlantic Refining company plant at Atreco, which will use millions of gallons of water daily.

B. A. Stokelberg, a member of the Rockland dam board, has been in Washington about two weeks and is pressing the project steadily.

Getting All Keyed Up For Ball Tournament

Excited About Bookbinder Didn't Bind the Whole Book

Austin, Feb. 2.—A bookbinder's mistake 11 years ago, which doubt as to validity of 32 pages of Texas criminal laws.

Started attached in the secretary of state's office, revealed omission of two titles and parts of two others in the official copy of the 1925 codification of the penal code. An attorney for a law publishing company found the error in a study of the archives.

Gov. Alfred, formerly attorney general, anticipated the appellate courts would "split" the error, however, by changing the legislative intent. He said there were precedents for that course.

Sharp question was raised in other quarters as attorneys believed a test case would be filed. A prominent jurist said unofficially that if the articles were invalid prisoners now confined in the penitentiary on convictions of the offenses would be entitled to freedom.

Objections included articles through 399. Missing articles included a portion of chapter seven, title eight, dealing with failure of public officers to perform official duties; all of chapter eight, concerning miscellaneous crimes; all of title nine, defining offenses against morals, decency and chastity; and three articles on title 11 on banking.

Officials theorized a binder in a publishing company caused the mix-up.

Upon passage of the act containing 399 printed pages of laws of the 19th legislature, the binder, who was not a member of the printing press, typed an original copy to be printed. The binder, however, typed an original copy to be printed, but omitted the last 32 pages of the act.

Gov. Alfred, who signed the act, was not aware of the error. He said he had no recollection of the error.

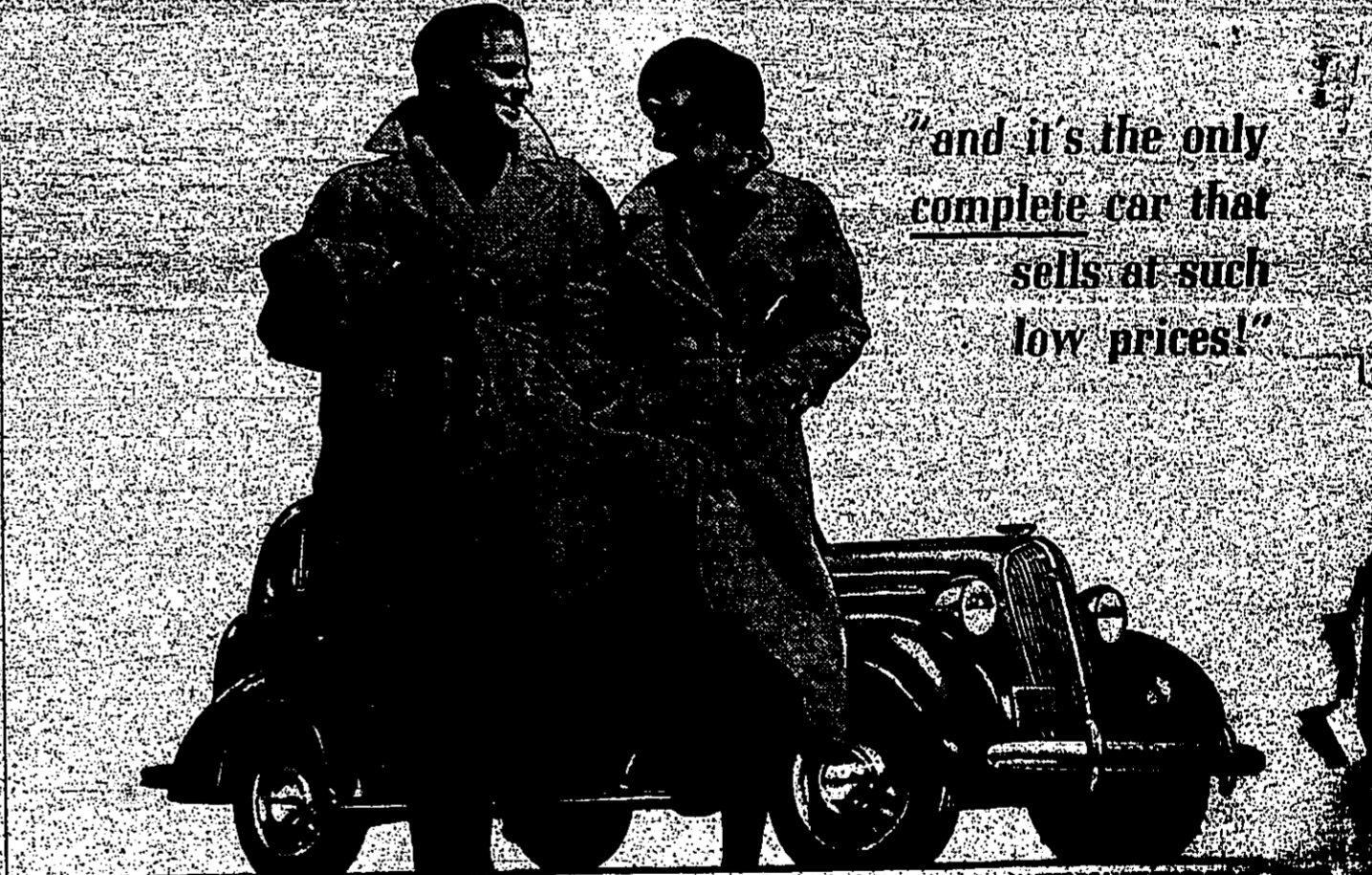
