**GETTING OUT OF TICK QUARANTINE**  
Tyler county is under tick quarantine together with other East Texas counties. Work is under way to eliminate this scourge among range cattle and horses, deer, etc. At this time there is not near the number of vats as in the county that the State demands. It has been estimated 112 vats will be needed in Tyler county. The government is building these vats without expense and will continue to do so for a limited time. After that time has expired the county will be required to build the remaining number of these vats and this is a matter that cannot be sidetracked—its the law.

Referring to the vat construction work being carried on in this county under the Emergency Relief, Agriculture, Animal Industry Official Project O. P. 1-18-4, which is under supervision of this bureau, it is desired to bring to the attention of all the slow progress now being made due to lack of sufficient laborers being assigned to this project.

It is estimated 112 vats will be needed in this county. It takes a full working crew of 10 to 12 men about one week (35 working hours per week) to complete a vat. With the 23 men now assigned on this project and with an average of 15 men working each day in this county, it can be seen that if all the men now assigned were to stay on the job it would require 14 more months to complete the program. It is known there are resignations from work projects paying the security wage scale when cover the men can find private employment at higher pay so it will probably require a longer time than the 14 months heretofore stated.

In view of the likelihood of the Live Stock Sanitary Commission Texas designating this county for systematic tick eradication work next spring and further than official information as to date of termination of WPA activities, it is the desire of the Fort Worth office headquarters to try to complete the vat construction work this summer in order to relieve Tyler county from the expense of furnishing the necessary vats, pens, etc., as set out in Sec. 10, H. B. 77, of Texas, called Sanitary Commission, Legislature which reads in part as follows:

It shall be the duty of the County Commissioners of every county in the State of Texas in which the Live Stock Sanitary Commission is authorized to conduct commission in the eradication of said tick in their respective counties and it shall be mandatory upon said Commissioners Court to furnish at the expense of the county, in the counties designated by the Live Stock Sanitary Commission, a sufficient number of dipping vats, pens, shute, and all necessary facilities of the kind and description designated by said Commission, for the purpose of dipping cattle, horses, mules, jacks and ponies under the supervision of inspectors of the Live Stock Sanitary Commission.

The foregoing letter was sent to Judge Tatum who in turn, requested that "The Booster" give it publication. If the vats are not built under this relief labor they will have to be built by Tyler County.

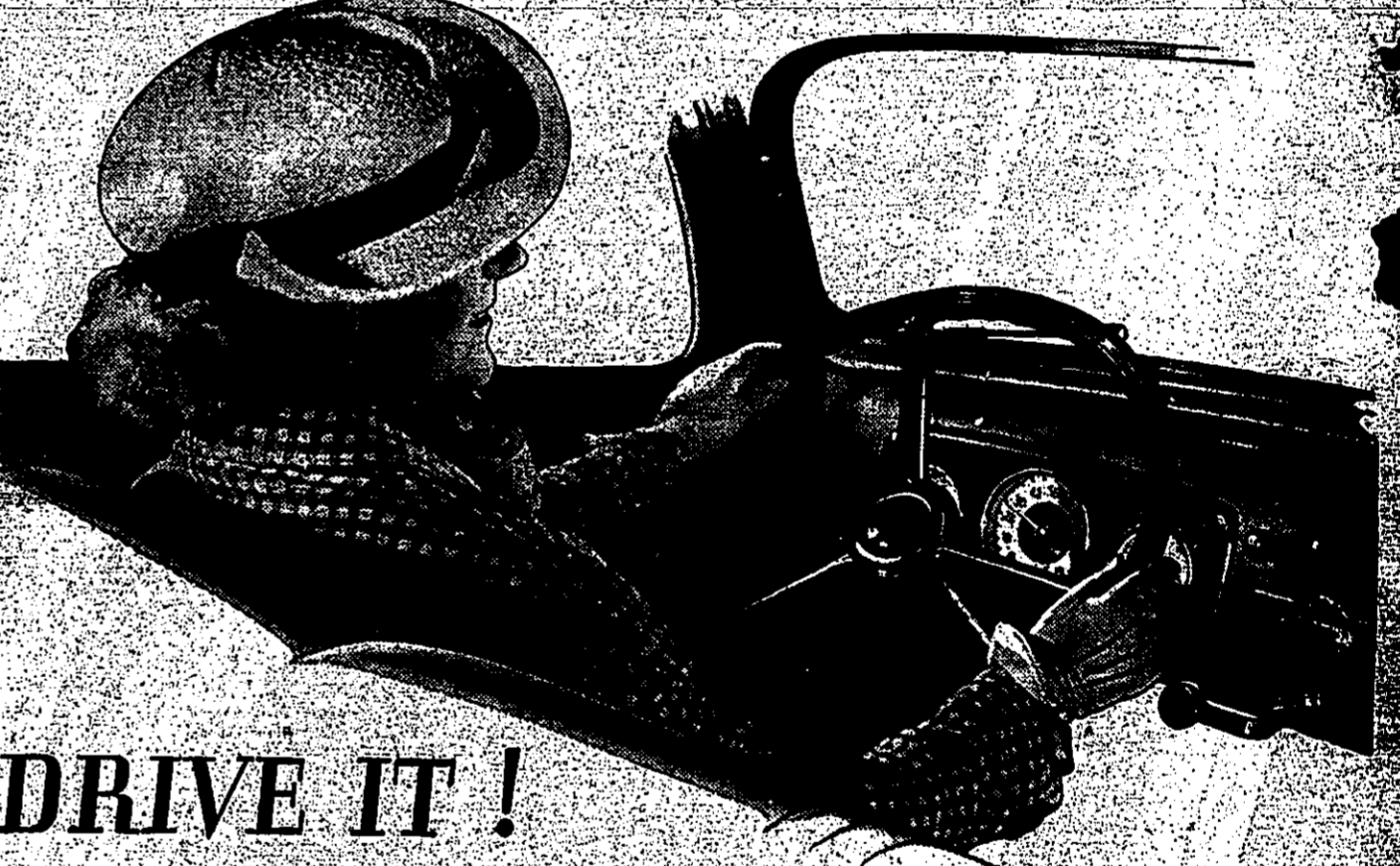
