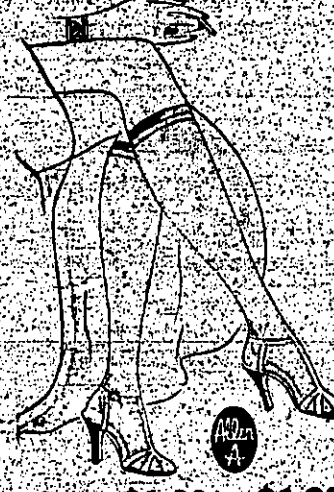

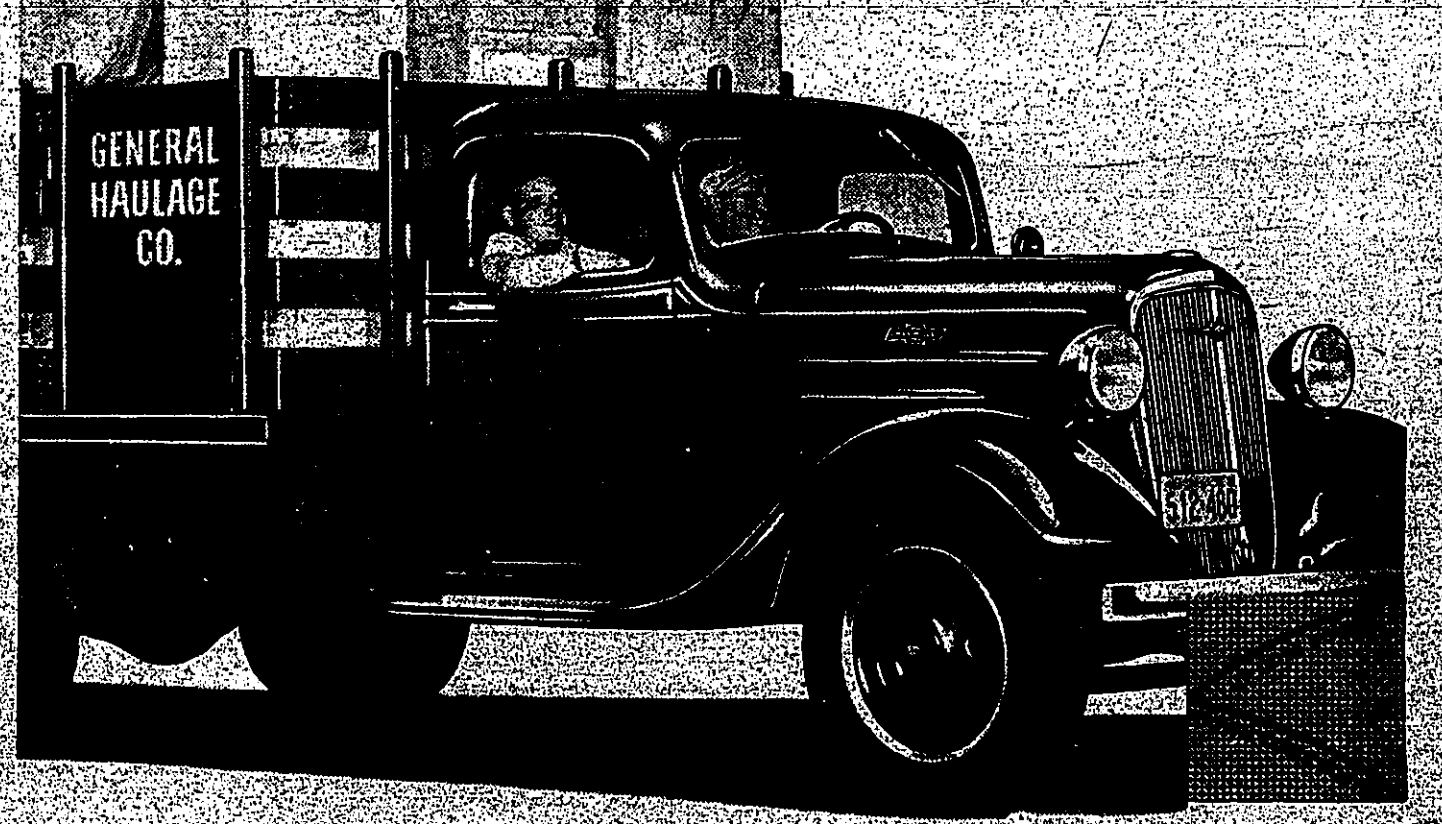

SUN'S TOTAL ECLIPSE DISCERNABLE JUNE 19
Washington, May 28.—The greatest sky show of the year, the total eclipse of the sun on June 19, will be witnessed by the largest group of scientists and their instruments ever assembled for such an event. A total of 40 expeditions, including three from the United States, will be spread out along the shadow path of the eclipse, stretching northward across Europe and Asia to make what is expected to be an almost continuous record of the event. In addition to the customary astronomical observations, astronomers here say, efforts will be made to use the first time many new types of instruments which are expected to reveal new scientific facts. About 25 of the 40 expeditions will be made up of Russian scientists.
