URGES MOTORISTS TO CHECK OWN CARS
 A plea for motorists to look to the effectiveness of their own cars and equipment as the first and most important contribution to local safety campaigns was made today by P. H. Powell, Gaudy's dealer here. Safety campaigns are important means for focusing public attention and interest on safety problems, but the most safety-minded drivers are useless to avoid an accident if his brakes give out or his tires slip on slippery pavements. Consequently, he became a safety driver a motorist should get such material and see that his brakes are good and his tires have the traction necessary for a quick start and drive safely. Mr. Powell explained the importance of brakes and tires by pointing to the number of accidents caused by the inability to stop suddenly. If brakes were good, the car would stop. Next he pointed to the ground at only four points where four tires are on the road. Therefore, if one tire is smooth, the car will slip. Although the tires are good, the ball joints, knuckles, and other parts must be checked. A car from a shop should be checked and repaired.
