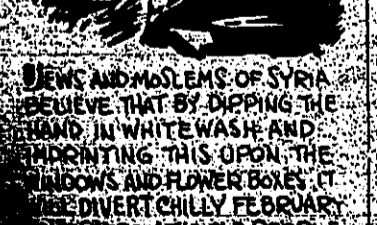

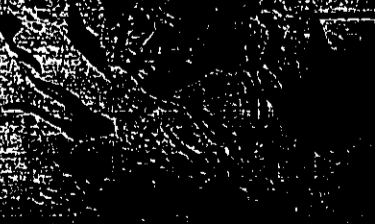

The Social Security Administration has announced that it will cut off 15,000 pension rolls before the end of the fiscal year. This is the first time since the Social Security Act was passed that the number of pensioners has been reduced.

The cuts will be made by eliminating pensioners who have not worked for the required number of years. The cuts will be made in a number of categories, including those who have not worked for the required number of years in a particular industry or occupation.
