"You want her to stay here," Wheeler said. "I'm putting you on your honor not to go any further by your jail."

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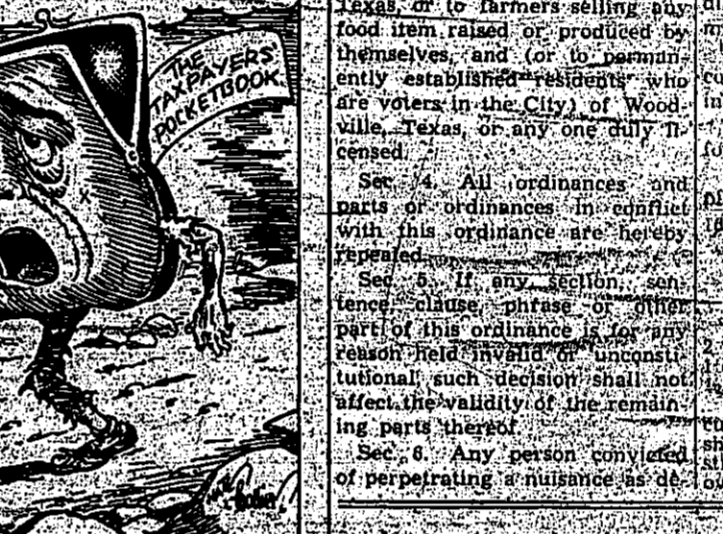

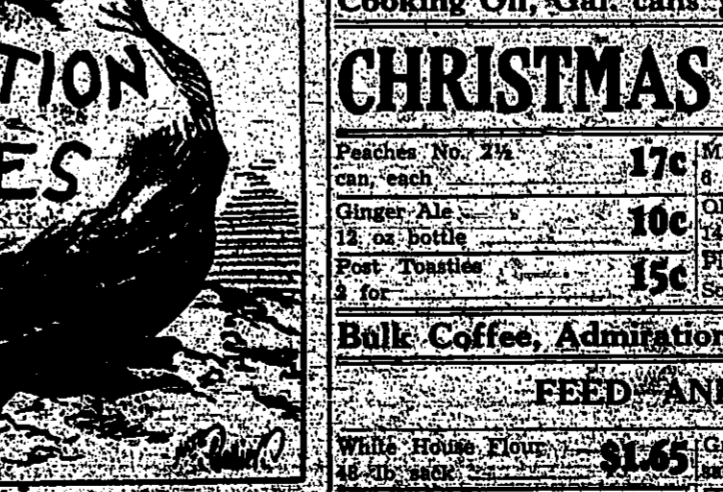

REGULATION AND TAXES

SECTION 1. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to persons employed by or representing any established merchant business in the City of Woodville, Texas...

SECTION 2. The Police Department of the City of Woodville is hereby required and directed to suppress the same and to abate any such nuisance as is described in the first section of this ordinance...

SECTION 3. The Provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to persons employed by or representing any established merchant business in the City of Woodville, Texas...

SECTION 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed and annulled...

SECTION 5. If any section, sentence, clause, phrase or other part of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid, the unconstitutionality of such section shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts thereof...

SECTION 6. Any person convicted of perpetrating a nuisance as defined in this ordinance...

SECTION 7. This ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of its passage...

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall be published in the official newspaper of the City of Woodville, Texas...




