13-Year-Old Check a Souvenir
New York's Congressman Bruce Barton, with his campaign promise to introduce no new laws, probably will want to meet S. J. Nadel, Dallas insurance man. Mr. Nadel has grounds for asking an appropriation from Congress and is not going to do it, but he denied it was not through any concern for the balancing of the budget that he is foregoing that privilege. The story, as Mr. Nadel tells it, is this: In 1924 the Government, following the 25% refund act of that year, sent him what it figured to be 25% of the income tax he had paid. Later they found a mistake and learned that they had failed to send him the full amount. Immediately they rushed him a Treasury check for the balance. Mr. Nadel stuck the check away in some papers and forgot all about it. He got a letter telling him to cash the check. He could not find it. He got another letter, then several more and finally a personal representative of the Treasurer came to see him. He could not locate the check. The Treasury Department offered to send him a duplicate if he would make bond for the amount. This he neglected to do. Finally, a few months ago, the Treasury Department lost patience and notified him that payment on the check had been stopped, but added that if he desired to push the matter further he might ask the Congressman to introduce a bill in Congress for an appropriation sufficient to pay the amount of the check. Thursday Mr. Nadel found the 13-year-old check, announced that he was going to keep it as a souvenir. It was for 1c.
