Ben Ramsey was ABSENT when Senate Bill No. 415 was voted upon, which provided money for Tuition of Rural High School Pupils of Texas, see Page 2212 of the House Journal for the 42nd Legislature, Regular Session.

R. C. Musslewhite favors and will actively work for a more equal distribution of the money spent for education. He believes in giving the small school a fair distribution of the money spent in Texas, and will work in co-operation with Governor O'Daniel and members of the Legislature in an honest effort to solve the problems now facing the people of Texas.
