FOLLOW THESE POINTERS ON REFRIGERATION CARE

- Defrost whenever frost becomes 1/4-inch thick.
- Cover all liquids. Keep defrosting tray dry.
- Don't set cold-control any higher than necessary. Use quick-freezing sparingly.
- Make sure door gaskets seal tightly. Keep free of grease.
- Don't crowd shelves. Air circulation is vital to efficiency.
- Don't store hot foods. Let them cool first.
- Don't open door oftener than necessary. And close it quickly.
- Keep refrigerator clean, condenser coils dust-free.
- Oil open unit models periodically as instructed. Sealant units need no oiling.
