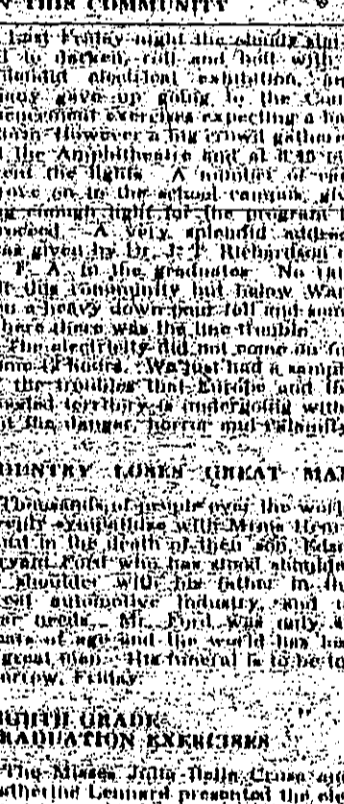
## GOVERNOR REMINDS TEXANS OF MEMORIAL DAY, JUNE 30

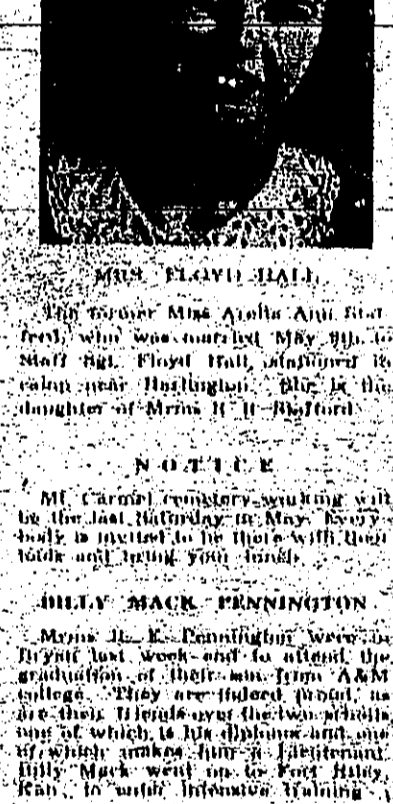

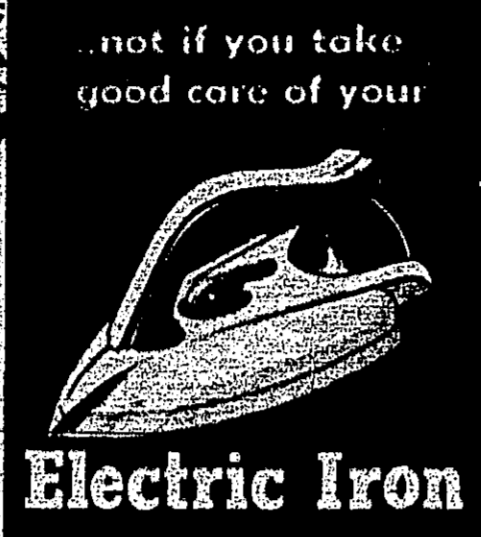

Back in the old days, when ironing was a laborious task, it was often done with a hot flat iron. But now, with the advent of the electric iron, ironing is a much easier and more efficient task.

TIMELY TIPS ON IRON CARE

- Keep bottom of iron clean. Wipe with damp cloth when cool. If necessary, use mild sanding powder to remove sticking starch, but never use soap or plain water. A knife, heated iron may be removed with acetone thinner or paint thinner.
- Clean top of iron with damp cloth or soft brush. Use American Safety Electric Ironing Oil.
- Avoid ironing over buttons, buckles, zippers, and other hard objects that may scratch sole plate.
- Do not let iron get too hot. Ironing clothes too hot may ruin fabric.
- In ironing, iron full pile or woolen material, use iron sock. Constant plugging in and out of wall socket may ruin the terminal points.

- Never let iron cool down. Iron or cloth continuously against edge of the board. Altho it will heat up, you will be irked by a flash of red light.
- If iron sticks, run it over a little salt sprinkled on a piece of old white broad winged.
- Keep the handle tight. A sticky handle causes cord plug to rock on terminals, to scorch, and eventually cause the terminal points.
- Rub the sole plate of iron for about once a month with paraffin or bees wax. Wipe off on paper or cloth.
- Always disconnect iron when not in use. The heat should not heat when standing momentarily, as told in orange listing.
- The wire from a perfectly cold iron will plug in and around (and pulling it away.
