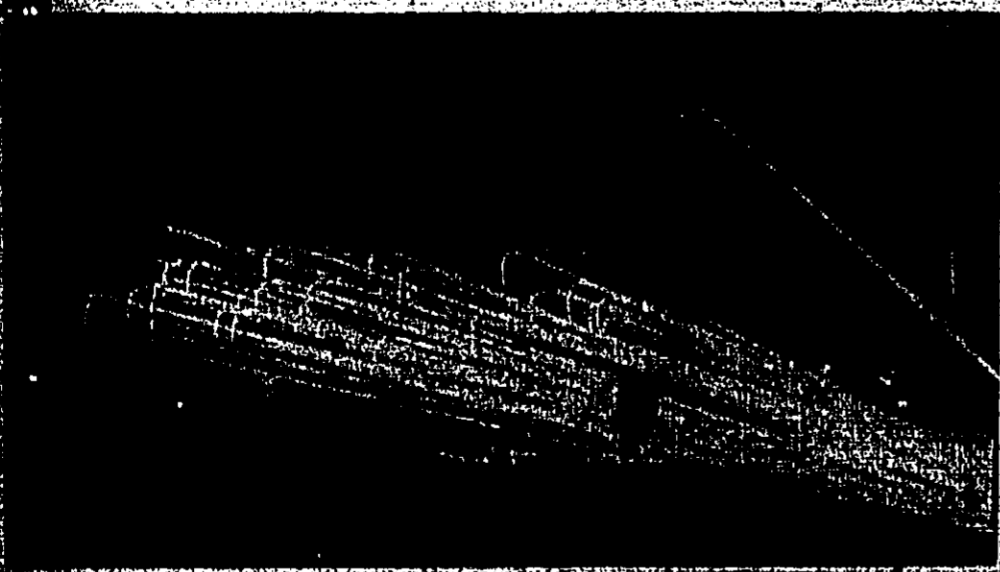

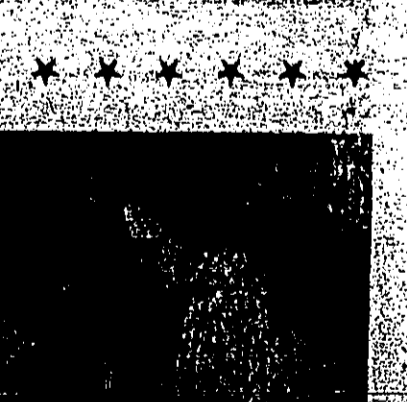

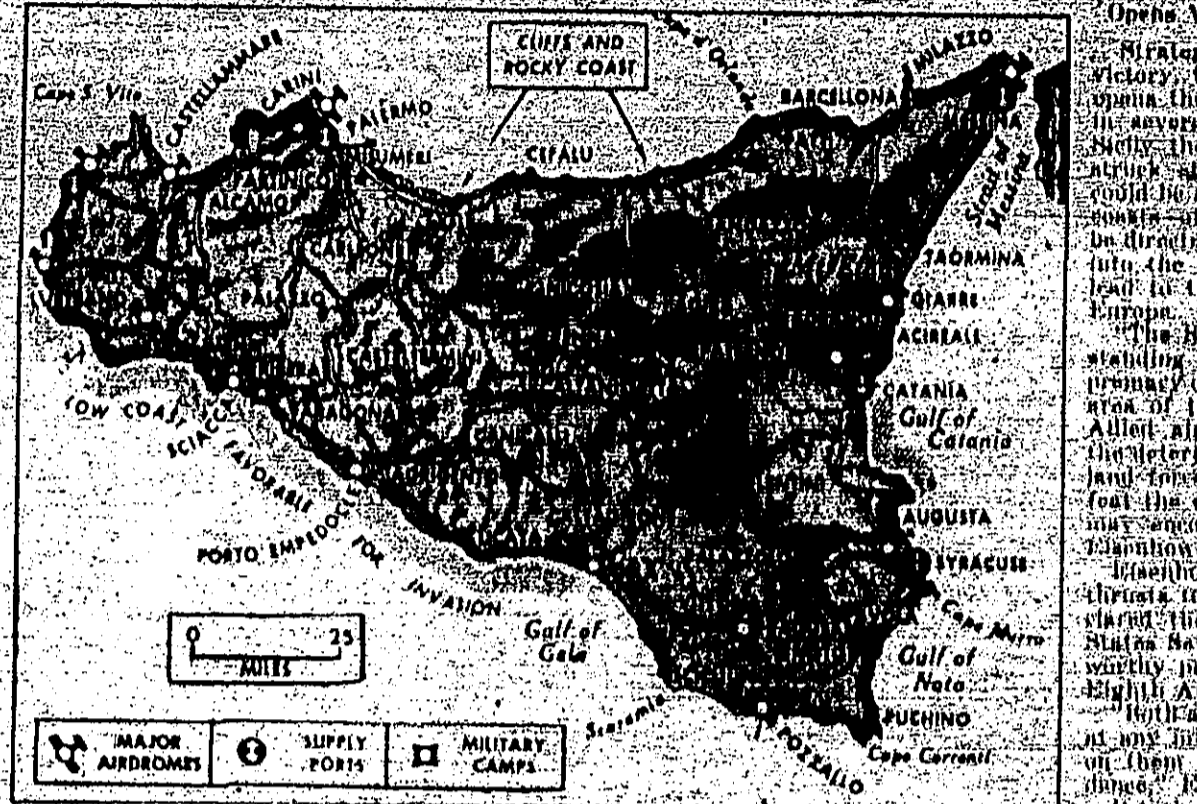

### Value of Plasma

PLASMA, P.Y.K. United Press correspondent, writes from Sicily that plasma was saving the lives of thousands of wounded Allied soldiers.

And while we are on the subject of plasma, the doctors asked me at least a dozen times to write about plasma. Write lots about it, see clear overhead for it, say that plasma is the outstanding discovery of this war, they said.

So I here you folks back home to give and keep on giving your blood. We've got plenty in hand here now, but if we ever run into plasma casualties such as they have in the Russian front, we will need untold amounts of it.

They say plasma is absolutely magical. They say a pint of the thousands who died in the last war could have been saved by it in this war.

They also claim that cases where a wounded man was all but dead and with a few minutes would be sitting up and talking with all the big and calm brain in the face, after an hour or two of plasma.

The doctors asked me to repeat what you have been told by many things at length. It doesn't make any difference what you think about it, and that the normal person has in all the war, the effects from giving his blood.

### Ship Still a Day

President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill recently announced that a total of over forty U-boats were sent to the bottom of the sea during heavy fighting in May, June and July. The statement by Roosevelt and Churchill made it clear that during a lull in Allied anti-submarine operations the U-boats would not be able to disrupt sea communication between the United States and Europe in the future.

### Big Inch Pipe Line

The Big Inch crude oil pipe line from Cushing, Texas, to New York and Philadelphia, according to Ralph K. Davis, acting Petroleum Administrator for War, showed in a 24-hour test run 228,000 barrels of Texas crude through the 48-inch diameter pipe line and into storage tanks. The Big Inch pipe line had a test run of 228,000 barrels a day during the summer.

The line, financed by the government and built by the War Emergency Pipe Line, Inc., is the longest oil pipe line of 48 inch diameter in the world.

### Horns From Bomb And Torpedo Health

Navy physicians, using new methods of treatment with abnormal success, have reported that taking the horns of Navy men who have gone through the hell of fire from bombs and torpedoes, explosions or the torment of superheated steam.

Some of the 76 burn casualties admitted to the Norfolk, Va., Naval Hospital in recent months have had as much as 90 percent of the body surface consumed by second and third degree burns—yet there has not been one death among them and the great majority have returned to active duty.

### Tire Saving at 35-Mile Speed

Strict observance of the national 35-mile-an-hour speed limit afforded the greatest promise of keeping passenger automobiles rolling for another year, the Public Roads Administration said in the result of a four-year study of passenger car tire wear and tire failure.

Three years out as much as four times as fast as 35 miles an hour as at 35 miles, and speed is the most important factor determining the rate of wear, according to the study, which was conducted by the Public Roads Administration and Iowa State College.
