Captured Allied Airman Beheaded By a Jap Execution In Famous Samurai Fashion Described In Diary Found In the Salamaua Ruins

Alfred Headmaster, Northwest Pacific, Oct. 6.—The beheading of an allied airman captured by the Japanese in New Guinea last March was revealed today by a diary found on the body of an enemy soldier in the ruins of Salamaua.

The diary, written by a Japanese soldier, described the execution in a "famous samurai fashion." The airman was killed by a bayonet thrust into his chest, and his head was severed from his body.

The diary also described the capture of the airman and his subsequent imprisonment in a prisoner-of-war camp. The airman was identified as a member of the United States Army Air Corps.

Pulpwood, East Texas Newest Forest Crop, Plays Herculean Task in the War

Woodville, Texas, news of pulpwood has become a household word. Last year an estimated 2,000,000 cords of it were cut from the pine and hardwood forests in the eastern part of the state and found its way into the hands of the people of Texas and Louisiana.

Almost unbound at six years ago, when a yearly cut of only 800,000 cords was made, the pulpwood industry in Texas is now producing an estimated 2,000,000 cords a year. This is a 150 per cent increase in production in a 15-year period.

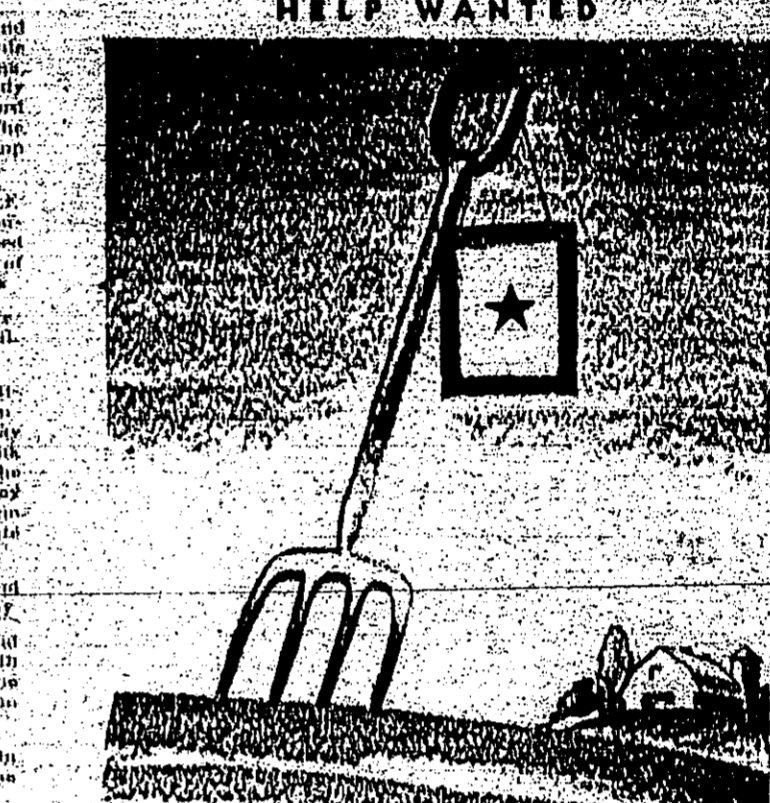

Wartime Lighting Suggestions

HOW TO GET MORE LIGHT FROM YOUR PRESENT EQUIPMENT

Place Lamps to Utilize Light Output Most Efficiently

The amount of useful light you get from a lamp decreases rapidly as the lamp is moved away from the area to be lighted. Conversely, the useful light increases greatly as the light source is moved toward the working area. In the above example, merely by moving the end table lamp eight inches from the far to the near side of the table, the amount of useful light for reading or sewing was more than doubled. Remember this important point and always place chairs close to lamps. You'll not only get more light for your money, but you'll prevent needless eyestrain.

OTHER WAYS TO CONSERVE LIGHT

1. Remove and clean lamp bulbs and lamp bowls regularly. Dirty surfaces reduce light output.
2. Keep shade lamps light. Clean the shade regularly. Repair or replace darkened, broken or perforated shades.
3. Be close enough to the lamp to see all the light it can give you.
4. Avoid direct glare from lamp bowls and shades.
5. Arrange furniture so you don't see your own shadow. Do not have two people sit by one lamp if one can see the other.
6. Turn off lamps when you leave a room.
7. Use the lowest wattage bulb that will give you the light you need.
8. Make sure you have good ventilation.
