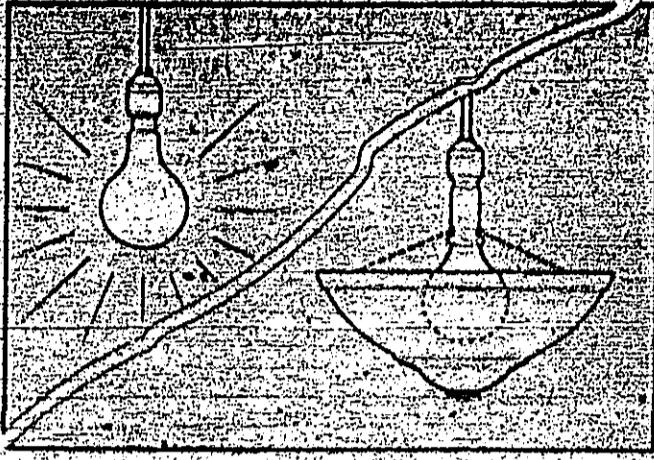








HOW TO GET MORE LIGHT FROM YOUR PRESENT EQUIPMENT



Shade Bare Bulbs

OTHER WAYS TO CONSERVE LIGHT

1. Remove and clean lamp bulbs and lamp sockets regularly. This insures better light output.
2. Keep shade clean. Light reflects off a dark-colored shade or dirty shade.
3. Use clean shade. The light is reflected off the shade. All the light is not lost.
4. Avoid using bare bulb lamps. Use shade lamps.
5. Arrange furniture so that light is not blocked. Use a lamp with a shade to direct light.
6. Turn off lamps not in use. Use a timer to turn off lamps.
