Six Ways to Avoid Waste in the Use of Your Electric Washer and Iron

- 1. Disconnect iron at wall outlet when called to stop or telephone or when over ironing is interrupted by other duties.
2. Sprinkle clothes lightly. Just enough to permit easy ironing out of wrinkles. Excessive dampening wastes heat and electricity.
3. Set heat control of iron at correct temperature for each type of fabric.
4. Avoid using higher temperature than necessary.
5. Plan washing in full capacity of washer. It is more efficient than partial capacity. A number of times but be careful not to overload. Overloading wastes electricity and results in a loss of efficiency.
6. Turn off washer completely when not in use. Do not let it continue to run while you prepare next load.

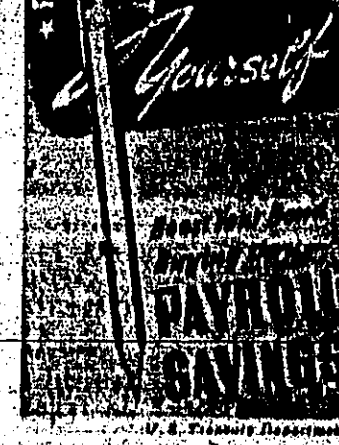
