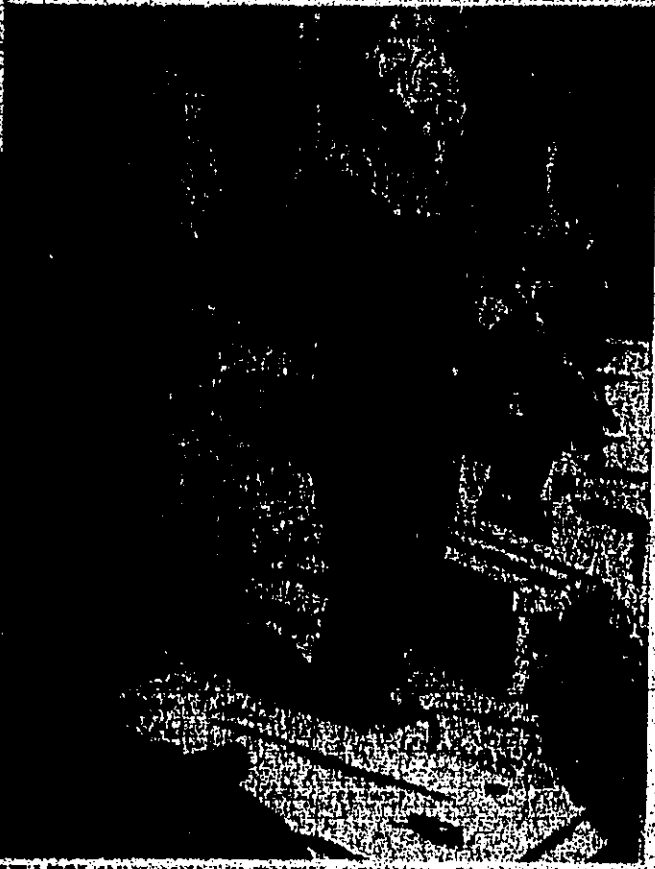

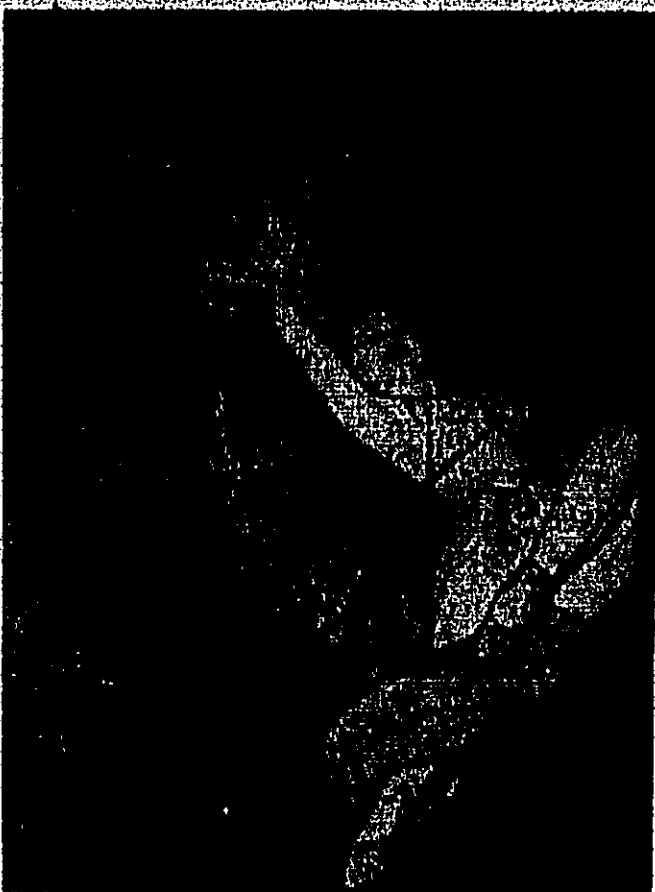

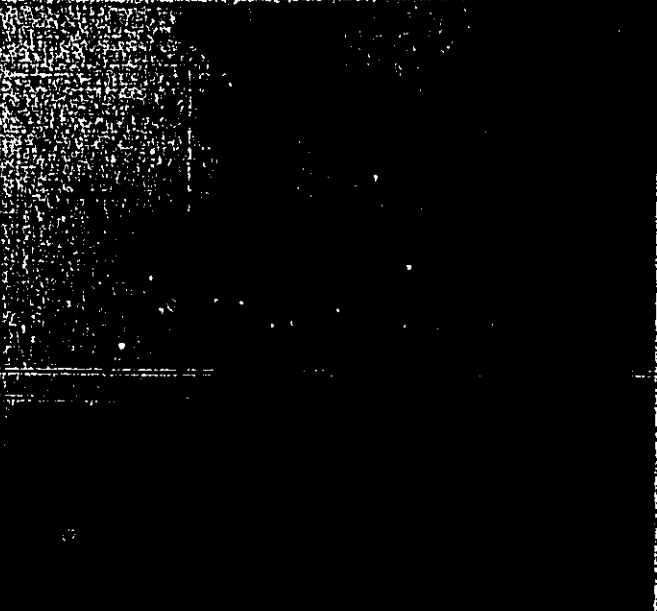
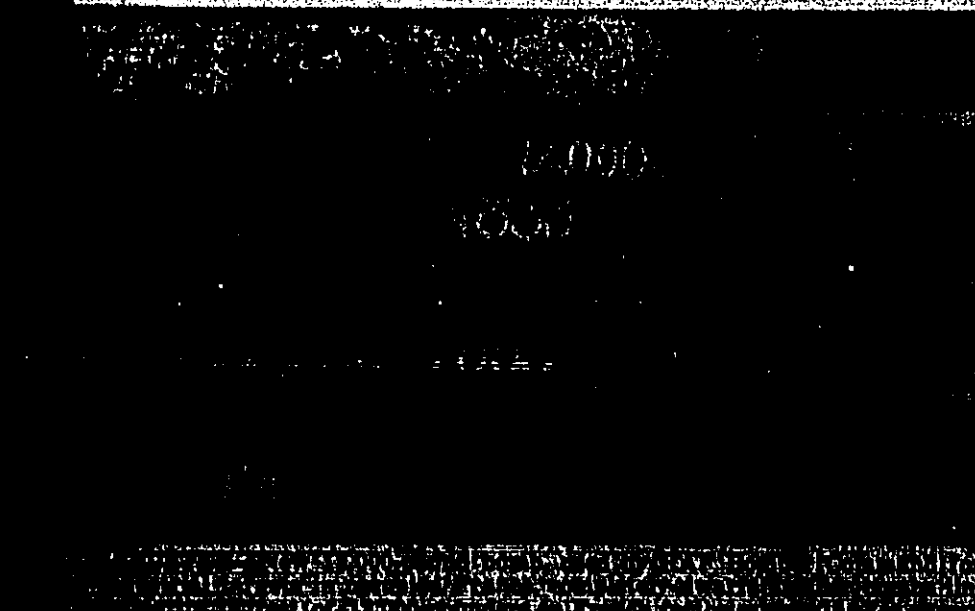

A Quick, Economical and Effective Method for Treating Turkeys
 An effective, quick, and economical method for delousing turkeys has been found in the use of nicotine sulphate solution applied to the lower part of the abdominal region of the turkey.

The method of treatment is so quick that each bird can be treated in 10 to 15 seconds. It is so economical that the A. M. Texas College Experiment Station flocks of 200 turkeys were treated with only seven quarts of nicotine sulphate solution. It is so effective that it killed all the body and feather lice in 10 to 20 minutes so that no lice could be determined by ordinary examination; particularly the lice which are found on the birds until 10 days after treatment. With most methods a 100 per cent loss in production is necessary earlier than this. No harmful effects on the turkeys as a result of the treatment could be determined.

Value for Intestinal Worms
 It is very important to keep a turkey free of intestinal worms. The presence of intestinal worms is a common cause of loss of weight and production in turkeys.

Prevention of Intestinal Worms
 The best way to prevent intestinal worms in turkeys is to keep them clean and to use a good quality feed. It is also important to keep the turkeys away from areas where there are a lot of worms.

Treatment of Intestinal Worms
 If a turkey has intestinal worms, it should be treated with a good quality wormer. The wormer should be given to the turkey in its feed, and the turkey should be kept clean and healthy.
