AVOID CANNING MISHAPS BY FOLLOWING PROPER DIRECTIONS

Although the canning process is a simple one, it is one that must be followed carefully to avoid mishaps. The following directions are intended to help you avoid common canning mistakes.

1. Examine the top of each jar. It must be even and smooth.
2. Leave about one inch head space when filling jars to be processed. This is the space between the top of the food and the lid.
3. Fill the jar to the brim, leaving about one inch head space. The lid should be placed on the jar and the jar should be tightened.

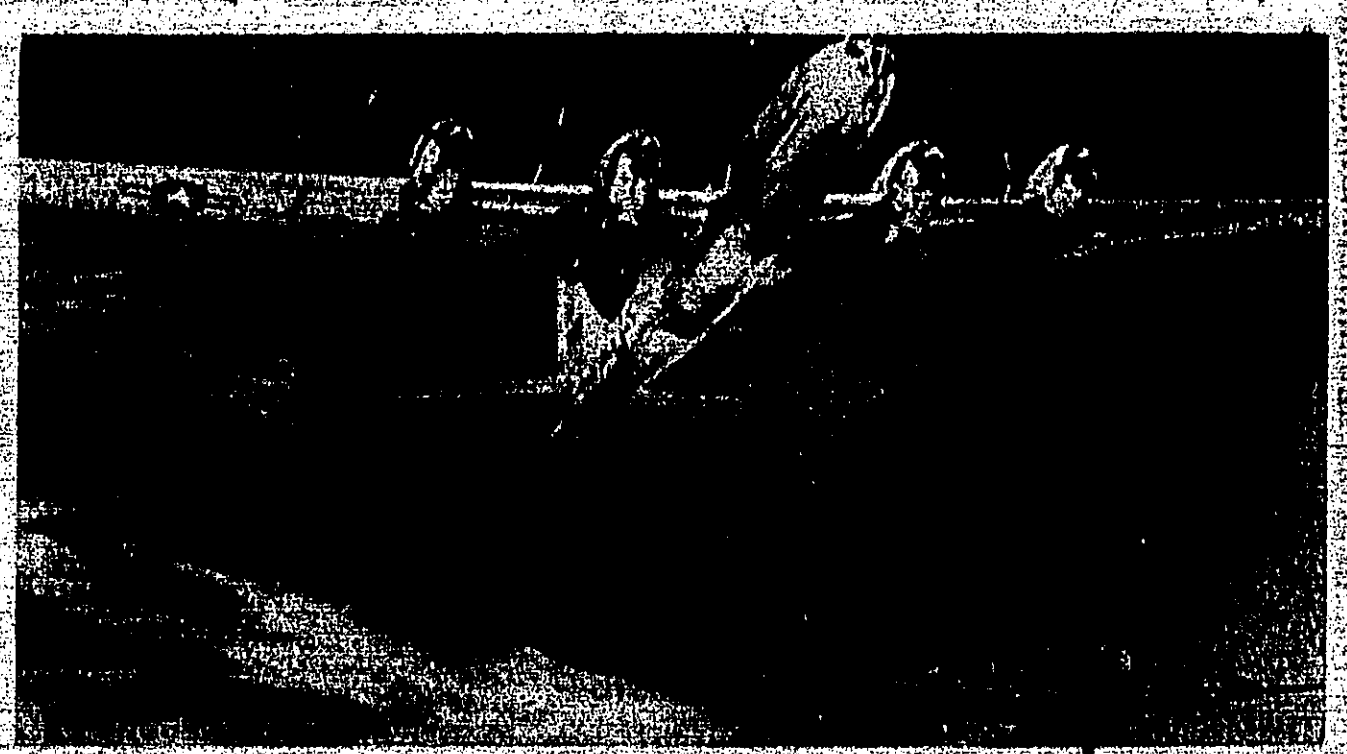

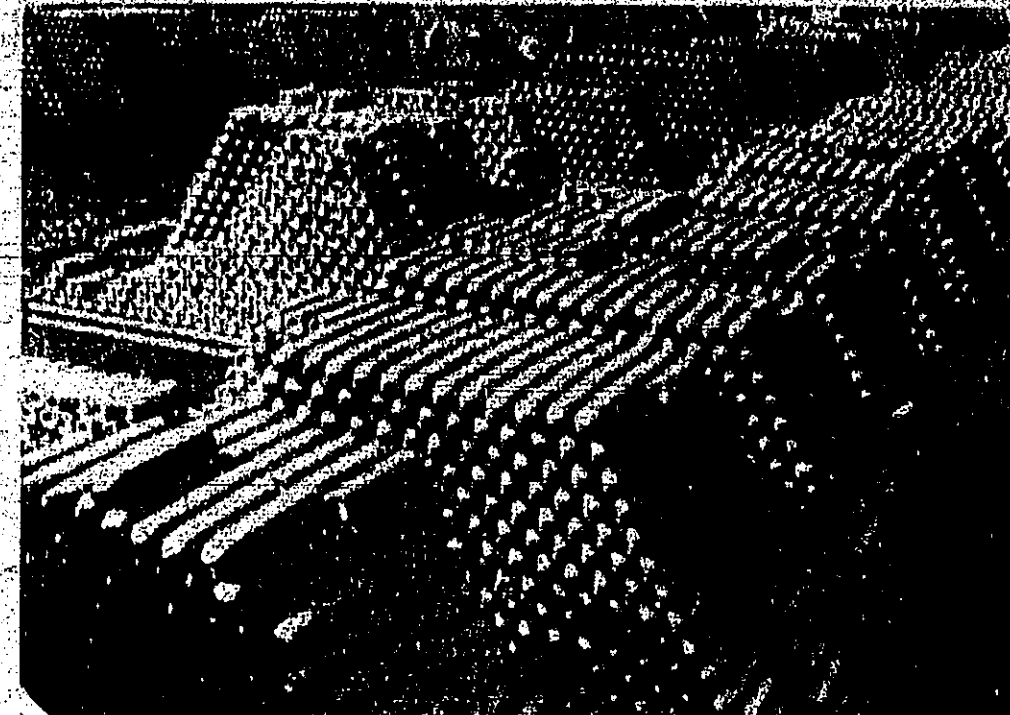

Feeding Greens
How early may we feed our chicks greens? This is a question many growers ask. The answer may be found in the fact that chicks of this age are used to eating small amounts of greens, so it will not shock them to have a larger amount of greens fed to them.

Early Brooding
At about 4 weeks of age or just about the time the flock is divided, chicks may be brooded in pens. This is easily done by having bins of brooder feed on a wall of the brooder house. These pens may be brooded about 10 inches from the floor and extend out toward the brooder about 4 feet. On these 4 feet frames, may be placed a screen about 10 inches apart and 1-inch mesh wire may be tacked to the bottom of the frame. Texas Farm News Reports

Officials of FSA report that 182 dairy cows owned by five clients in Harris county produced 411,248 worth of dairy products in 12 months. This is an average of more than 800 per cow.

The Palmaris government program of experiments with the available rubber plant will continue at least one year longer. Funds have been appropriated for this work, which will be continued in the fall. The rubber tree sections are in the Rio Grande Valley.

Officials of the Texas State Valley Extension Service at Waco, Texas, report that the cotton crop brought more than \$41,000,000. This was \$4,000,000 more than the previous high, which was the total for last year.

Harris county turkey raisers, including A. H. Club boys and Future Farmers, were paid \$10,000 for birds during the last week in May. They were bought by Swift and Company and will go into blocks being built up by the government for shipment overseas.

Forty-four Nubian county 4-H club boys have produced commodities equivalent to the annual food budget of 90 fighting men, according to county Agricultural Agent H. A. Abney. The production includes 20,000 pounds of corn and grain sorghum, 16,740 pounds of milk, 62,000 pounds of meat, 2,700 dozen of eggs, and 40,000 pounds of cotton.

Soil conservation experts are trying to bring the program of the new Bureau of Land Management planting, which is being used in the Southwest, particularly in the Texas Panhandle, over a wide area. The conditions are those of 1935. It is well adapted to strip cropping. It can be planted between rows at the final cultivation of peanuts or corn. Experts say it has more nitrogen in the soil than ordinary legumes.

Boys and girls who helped save the green bean crop of Brown Haven Valley of Brown county are going to receive recognition. County Agricultural Agent C. W. Jamison, who ordered U. S. Troop Corps certificates of service for each of the volunteer pickers, and a Brownwood newspaper is raising money to buy certificates to be worn by the harvesters.

Laboratory tests were being made to determine the possibility of using cotton bolls as a livestock feed. Tests also are being made to determine if they can not be used in making wallboard and fertilizer. The experiment in food value of the bolls resulted from observations which showed bolls disappear rapidly when cattle are turned out to graze after cotton has been picked.

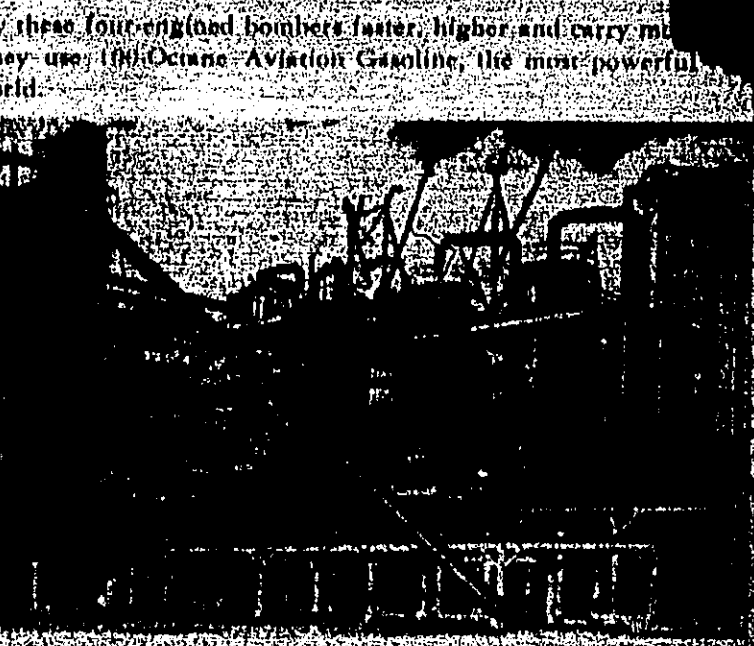
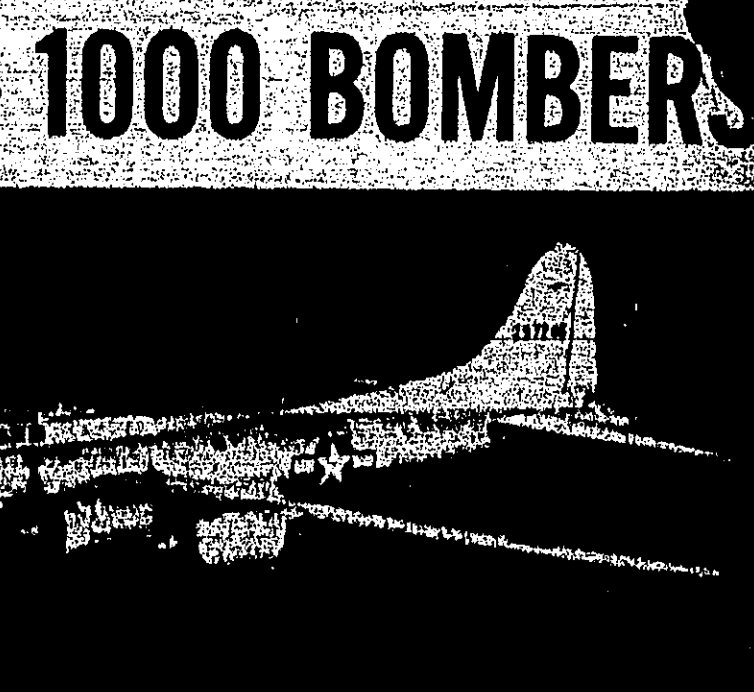
