**[ A Simplified Annual Report of the American Railroads in their third year at war ]**

**IN 1944, the railroads rendered to the American public the greatest volume of service ever performed by any agency of transportation.**

For doing this job, they received about 912 billion dollars. That's a lot of money—but most of it was earned by hauling tremendous tonnage of freight for less than 60¢ per ton per mile and carrying passengers for even less than before the first World War.

While the following figures shown are for all the railroads of the U. S., they fairly well represent the situation of the roads in Texas and Louisiana.

Out of every dollar they received...

- 10 was paid in interest, rent and other charges—a great share of which went to insurance companies, savings banks, endowed institutions.
- 20 was paid in dividends to stockholders.
- 50 was left over in "changes" to cover all such things as restoring roadways and equipment after the war, paying off debts, and providing reserves for the improvement of plants and the modernization of service.
