Out of the 2,485,138 appliances manufactured in 1944 and 1945, General Electric shipped 98%.

At the war ended, we weren't able to get back into production of some appliances as soon as we had hoped, and production rates weren't as high as we had hoped. A number of unforeseen things like material shortages made the job harder.

But there were only 120 days between V-J Day and December 31, 1945, and in those 120 days we partly recovered our factories from war production, and got production started again. We turned out 98% of the

98 per cent of those we'd built since reconversion began were out of our factories. Most of them were in the hands of users.

Then on January 15, 1946, our plants were closed by the strike. Now single electric home appliances had been built or assembled there since August 1945, but our war production had been in your dealer's hands. It was a long time, until we could get production started again. We turned out 98% of the

even faster job than we did in the months before the strike.

But we can't pick up production quite where we left off. Production lines are too complicated for that. A great many things have been changed since the war. We can't get back to the way we were before the strike.
