How Southland treats waste-water

A paper mill does not "use up" water. It reuses it practically. The waste water is not really "wasted" at all. It is recycled. The waste water is used to help produce paper. This does not make the water harmful to health in any way. However, the waste water receives extensive treatment for other reasons. A flocculation tank removes the small, pinpoint-sized wood fibers which escape from the groundwood pulp mill. A recovery plant removes the chemicals in which chips are cooked in the chemical pulp mill. An aerator and a clarifier remove as oxygen-depleting substances which the cooked wood adds to the waste water. The cooked wood also adds a color to the waste water. Solenox has provided the feasible way to remove this color. But research continues. Fortunately, the coloring substance is harmless. After the waste water leaves the mill, it flows through two sedimentation ponds and then continues on to the Angelina River. 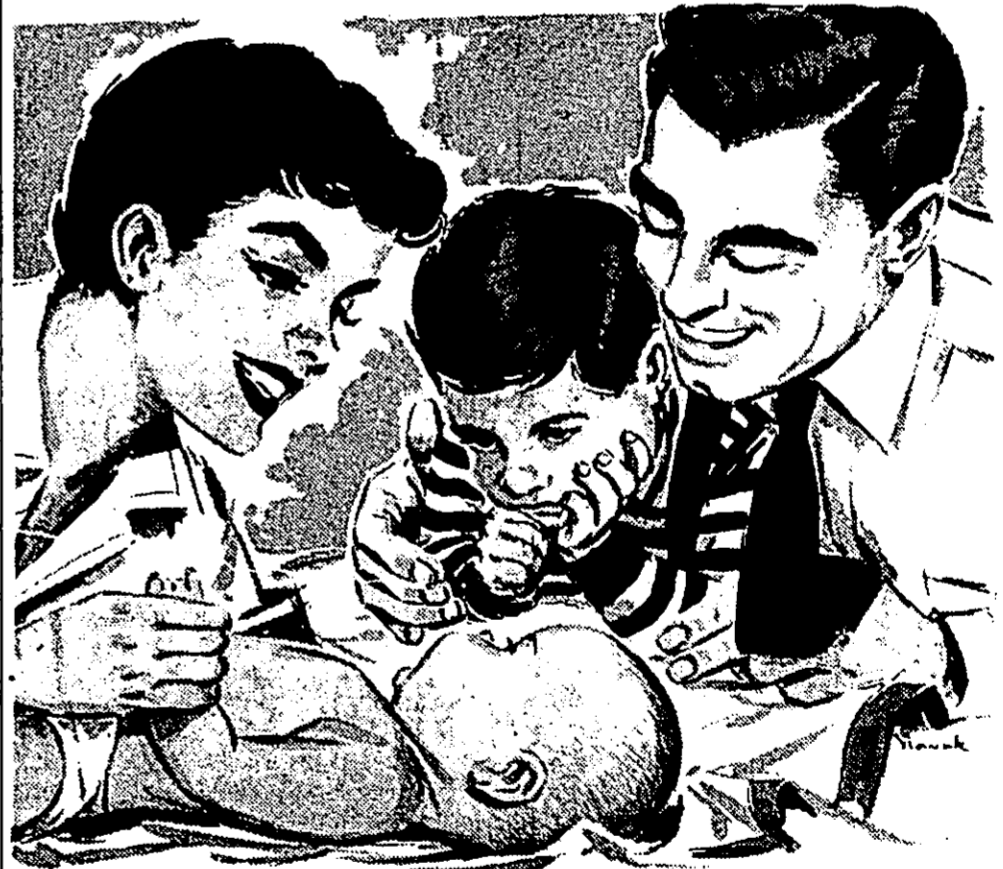
TWO NEGRO CHILDREN BURN TO DEATH HERE
