Four Charged With Killing Does

all from Huntington, were charged in county court Saturday with four counts each as the aftermath of a doe killing spree in northwest Tyler county near the mouth of Caney Creek State game wardens recovin the area, all but two of which the choice hindquarters taken with the rest left lying at the

scene in the woods. Charged in county court with iliegal night hunting, killing a doe, and hunting deer in closed season were Jim Sullivan, Joe Q. Sullivan, Oscar Lee Cooper and William F. Smith. All four were also charged with trespassing in justice of peace

Each man appeared before County Judge Jeff Mooney Saturday, All but one Joe Q. Sullivan (brother of Jim Sullivan) pleaded guilty to the charges. Joe Q. Sullivan entered a plea of not guilty to all three charges. Judge Mooney fined the three \$100 and costs on each of the night hunting with artificial lights and hunting deer in closed season charges and \$50 and costs on the charge of killing a doe. With costs, the fines for each man totaled \$336.25. Although they had allegedly killed the eight deer recovered by the game wardens, they were charged with only one count each. Judge Mooney also revoked hunting privileges of the three for one year and gave each a 30 day suspended jail sentence.

In justice court, Justice of the Peace Joe Loggins fined each of the three who pleaded guilty \$50 and costs on the trespassing

charges. Joe Q. Sullivan was released on bonds of \$250 on each count Monday and will be tried on the three charges before a jury. Two of the other men paid their fines and were released.

According to game wardens, the men parked their car across the creek in Angelina county and crossed over into Tyler County to do hunting. They were hunting in pairs, one man carrying a light and the other a high-powered .22 calibre rifle. Following a kill, the men would hang the doe in a tree and return later to cut the choicest part of the venison.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT APPROVES CURBING AT SPURGER, WARREN

A proposal by Tyler County to provide curb, gutter and storn sewer at Highway intersections in Spurger and Warren was approved this week by, the State Highway Department.

The proposed work is at FM Road 92 in Spurger extending from .1 mile south of FM 1013 of FM 1943 and north .5 mile. Montgomery.

Tyler County went along with the rest of Texas and the nation an its choices for President and Vice President in the General Election Tuesday.

President Lyndon Johnson carried the county by a margin of 1769 to 1217 over Senator Barry Goldwater in unofficial returns tabulated Tuesday night. The commissioners court made the official tabulation Wednesday and the results will be approximately the same.

In what was heralded as a close race in both the county and the state, the county followed the state pattern and gave Senator Ralph Yarborough a surprisingly strong vote over his Republican opponent George Bush. The unofficial tabulation of boxes by the Press Tuesday night showed Yarborough 1726 to Bush 1290.

Representative Jack Brooks handfly carried the county over John Greco, his Republican opponent, by 1934 to 1197.

In only two boxes, Chester and Camp Ground, did the Republicans manage to come out on the top side of the count. Chester gave Goldwater a small margin over President Johnson, 74 to 71. The box went for Bush over Yarborough, 75 to 68. In. other races, the box gave the Democrats a small margin. Brooks carrying it 80 to 70 over Greco and other Democratic candidates receiving a comfor-Governor's race in which Connally received 80 votes to 48 for Crichton.

Camp Ground also gave the Republicans a small majority in the races for president and U.S.Senator and Second District Congressman. Goldwater received 19 to Johnson's 14, Bush 23 to Yarborough's 10, and Greco 19 to Brooks 14. Other races were carried by the Democratic candidates.




