Internal Revenue Questions And Answers

Q--We had some heavy medical expenses this year. So far, we've paid only part of the bill. Can we deduct our entire medical bill or just what we paid in last year's return?

A--Only the amount you paid last year should be used as the basis for figuring your medical expense deduction. Also, the medical bills you paid last year must be reduced by whatever reimbursement you received from hospital and medical insurance plans.

Q--Internal Revenue has asked me to appear for an audit of my last year's return. The man who called me prepared a return for me. Can I get out of this?

A--If you received an audit notice, you should appear. If you did not receive one, you should not appear. If you are audited, you should appear with your own representative.

Q--Last year, I had some wages and \$50 from bank interest. My wife had some interest from a savings account. Should we file a joint return?

A--The best way to determine if you should file a joint return is to compare the tax liability of each spouse if you file separately with the tax liability if you file jointly.

Q--Can I deduct the cost of my car for depreciation?

A--Yes, you can. The amount you can deduct depends on the type of car and the year it was purchased.

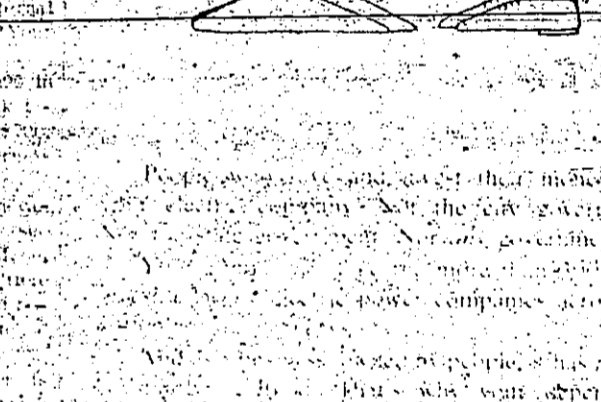

'Holiday With Light' Will Be GSU Exhibit At World's Fair

An all-new, lively musical review "Holiday With Light," will premiere at the electric utility companies' exhibit, the Tower of Light, when the New York World's Fair opens its second season, April 21.

Sponsored by 150 of the nation's investor-owned electric utility companies, among which are included Gulf States Utilities Company, the Tower of Light was chosen on the list of successful exhibits during the 1964 World's Fair. The total of 150 companies made the electric utility companies' exhibit the most popular at the fair, with an estimated 19,000 persons riding the giant electrically-powered turntable through the musical show daily. On peak attendance days anywhere from 27,000 viewed the show.

The show, which uses a variety of techniques including spectacular lighting effects, a high-contrast musical score and a new place in the fair, is a most comfortable, seated in newly installed revolving seats, will spend about two minutes in each chamber as they are transported through the show.

The new show uses a holiday theme to tell the story of electricity in a fanciful, light-filled way. A new character, Reddy Kluwert, long a

familiar figure in Gulf States advertising and the modern symbol of electric power, for most of the electric industry will be introduced in this year's show. Ben Franklin appears out of the past to join Reddy who offers to bring Ben up to date on the progress made with electricity since he flew his kite in a thunderstorm and discovered electricity. Then Reddy, Ben, and the audience are off on their tour of seven of America's most festive holidays.

Ben, represented as a three-dimensional animated figure, resembling an oversized light bulb, has the same qualities as his namesake who is recognized as the traditional figure who suggests inventiveness, thrift, and free enterprise. Reddy is also an animated, three-dimensional figure, electrically lighted and controlled.

The audience will see seven holiday scenes, New Year's Eve, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Mother's Day, Father's Day, the fourth of July, and Christmas. And at the same time, will be told in song and story of the contribution electricity makes to daily living.

The show maintains the aura of a musical fantasy and sparkles with a variety of elaborate scenes. Among them are a stirring fourth of July sequence brilliantly illuminated with electrical fireworks; a music hall number featuring Reddy and Ben as the last of the red hot daddies; and a Christmas episode featuring the world's largest Christmas ornaments. After the Christmas scene, vi-

sitors descend to the ground floor of the pavilion where they may view the source for the 12-billion candlepower Tower of Light. They will also see an all-electric climate conditioning sequence and a new research exhibit on electric power.

The research exhibit will show how the investor-owned electric utility companies are finding new ways to create, transmit and use electricity. Such as the future conveniences as all-electric automobiles, electric TV shoppers, all-electric light ways and electrically climate controlled cities of the future are depicted in the exhibit.

In the Court of Light, a glass wall separates visitors from the battery of 12-powerful xenon bulbs, light source for the Tower of Light beam. The beam is activated nightly in a special ceremony in which celebrities pull the golden light switch.

The new musical score was composed by Les Pockriss, composer of such popular songs as "Catch a Falling Star," "Johnny Angel" and "Itsy Bitsy Teeny Weeny Yellow Polka Dot Bikini." Sidney Brooks, who helped create three other New York World's Fair presentations, wrote the lyrics and script. The sets were designed by Fred Fox, who has designed sets for over 200 Broadway productions.

With the installation of comfortable seats on the giant revolving turntable, visitors will be able to enjoy the dazzling and delightful 1965 Tower of Light show in uncrowded comfort.

FHA Announces Loans For 1964

L. J. Cappelman, state director of the Farmers Home Administration, announced that 247 loans to individual families have been made in Texas under the provisions of the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964, which is one of the powerful weapons of the United States Department of Agriculture being used in President Johnson's all-out war on poverty program.

These loans were made to individual farmers and rural residents in most sections of Texas. A farm family is a family which is operating a farm they own or lease, and is producing at least a portion of their subsistence from crops or livestock. A rural resident is classified as one living in a town of not more than 2,500 population.

Economic Opportunity loans to farmers may be made to improve their farming operations; to buy more land, livestock, machinery and equipment; construct needed farm buildings; and to pay annual operating expenses for feed, seed, and fertilizer. These loans may be obtained by farm and rural families to finance rural-based, but non-agricultural enterprises. Funds may be used to purchase land, construct buildings, buy and install equipment and pay normal operating expenses of a variety of non-agricultural enterprises such as a farm machinery repair shop; TV and radio repair shop; ladders, spraying equipment and tools to be used by painters and carpenters; blacksmith shop; septic tank and sewage disposal system servicing; custom grass setting and land preparation; saw and lawn mower sharpening shop; post and wood cutting equipment; portable sheep and goat shearing equipment; etc.

Families and single individuals with incomes which are too low to cover basic needs, and who, with the assistance of the Farmers Home Administration county supervisor, are successful in developing a plan of operation which will provide a reasonable prospect of increasing their earnings through a small amount of credit from a farming operation or other non-agricultural enterprise, and who are unable to obtain adequate credit on reasonable terms elsewhere, are eligible to receive the loans.

Farm Subsidies Are Discussed

Farm subsidies have been the target of an ever-growing number of slings and arrows in recent years, particularly from that segment of the population that does not derive its livelihood from the soil.

It is a sad but distinguishing characteristic of most Americans to be 'conservative' in their political outlook when subsidies are granted to other special interest groups, and yet believe that it is only proper and fitting that the federal government dole out vast sums of money if they happen to be on the receiving end.

It is easy for critics to point out that the U.S. Department of Agriculture spent \$10 billion for price supports over the 28-year period ending in 1961. This is indeed an impressive sum, but not quite as startling as it may seem when compared to other government subsidies.

The South Texas Cotton Improvement Association points out, for example, that mail subsidy costs in only a 15-year period ending in 1961 were \$8.2 billion, and that mineral depletion subsidies through a 27-year period ending in 1960 were \$40.8 billion. These are only two of many that are equally staggering.

Another point that the critics tend to overlook is that less than half of the USDA's annual budget is spent on farmers. As an example, in 1964 the USDA sold about \$1.45 billion in surplus farm products for foreign currencies. The cost was charged to the USDA, but the proceeds were credited to the State, Defense, and other agencies.

Emergency food relief abroad came to \$215 million, all charged to the USDA. Payments to Veterans Administration and the armed forces for buying dairy products amounted to \$45 million; cost of school lunch programs came to \$227 million; cost of Forest Service and other conservation programs for the benefit of the public came to \$512 million; and all these were tacked on to the USDA budget.

The cost of programs for stabilizing farm income for fiscal 1964 was \$3.3 billion, compared to \$4.6 billion spent by the USDA for the benefit of consumers, businessmen and the rest of the public. For fiscal 1965 the estimated ratio

is even lower—\$2.2 billion for farmers and \$4.5 billion for the public.

It would seem that farmers have enough problems already. Let's not make the situation any worse than it is.

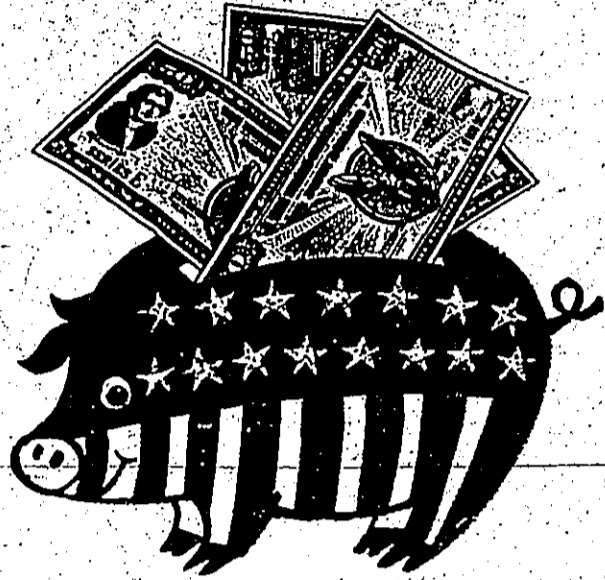

These loans may be scheduled for repayment over periods up to 30 years at an interest rate of 4-1/8 per cent. The cooperative must pledge as security for the loan a property lien and pledge of revenue.

Mr. Cappelman stated that additional information concerning this program may be obtained from county Farmers Home Administration personnel, county and home demonstration agents, vocational agriculture teachers, soil conservation service and agricultural stabilization and conservation service representatives, and other United States Department of Agriculture agencies as well as state agencies. Applications may be filed in any local Farmers Home Administration county office in the State. There are 133 county offices servicing every county in Texas. Applications are usually filed in the county in which the farm family or rural resident resides.
