## Lions Club Will Hear Talking Machine

A talking machine that recites Shakespeare, sings or speaks with a south westerner's drawl, will be demonstrated to the Woodville Lions Club on Thursday at noon by Mr. Jim Sage, Science Demonstrator for Southwestern Bell Telephone Company.

The talk and song of a computer are just two of many demonstrations featured in his program, "The Speech Chain," on human, artificial and synthetic speech.

He will show how sound is turned into speech, how hearing affects ability to speak, and how speech can be produced artificially.

Sage will explain how human speech is formed, then use a device to produce artificial speech. This artificial larynx was developed by Bell Telephone Laboratories, and now is sold at cost to persons who are voiceless because of defective vocal chords.

He will play recordings of a high-speed computer reciting Hamlet's Soliloquy, and singing "A Bicycle Built for Two." The string computer is accompanied by a computer that sounds like a piano. Bell scientists made these talking machine recordings during their work to improve telephone voice transmission.

Mr. Sage will trace the Bell system's research in speech from the early work of Alexander Graham Bell to current experiments by Bell Labs scientists. He will show a recent Bell Labs invention that sends voices electronically so several phone conversations can be carried over the same pair of telephone wires.

## FFA AND 4-H QUAIL RELEASE IN COUNTY

Tyler County FFA and 4-H Club boys are participating in a Quail replenishing program throughout the county. This project, under the leadership of Game Warden Gene Samford and Agricultural Instructors in area schools, is designed to provide brood stocks of birds to qualified clubs, which in turn, can use them for the purpose of restocking suitable bobwhite habitat created through the club activities. And to provide supervision and instruction in quail management to participating clubs through facilities available through the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

At present, the participating clubs in Tyler County are the Warren Chapter of the FFA, the Spurger Chapter of the FFA, and Fred FFA boys, who attend the Warren High School.

On Tuesday, June 2nd, saw the delivery of some 15 crates of the Bobwhite Quail for distribution in the Warren, Spurger

and Fred areas. According to Gene Samford, the birds are about 8-9 weeks old, and by this fall will be full grown and ready for harvesting. This harvesting can be accomplished by either shooting the birds as game or capturing them for the market.

## COMMUNITY ACTION FORGES AHEAD

The Committee of the Community Action Program and other interested persons met in County Commissioner's Court this past Wednesday night to further discuss and study the advisability of forming a corporation and applying for the federal funds that are available for use in this county.

The meeting was marked by heated discussion on the matter, with those in support of the plan north and questioning of the Federal Agency's willingness here to again explain the program.

Approximately 30 persons were in attendance, most of whom are leaders in the community throughout the county. Other persons were law firm of the County, J. M. Jasper and Kenneth Johnson.

The purpose of the meeting was to hear a report from the temporary committee which has been appointed by the County Commissioner's Court, and to discuss the report with the members of the County Commission.
