Army PFC Carl T. Mullins, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert E. Mullins, Route 3, Colmesneil, and other members of the 24th Infantry Division participated in Exercise Victory Express, a nine-day field training exercise in Germany, which ended December 17.

The exercise covers 1,600 square miles and includes more than 25,000 men and 6,000 vehicles.
