We salute the many who are active in Scouting in our area. And we also urge those who were Scouts but who are not active today to remember the Good Turn principle by which they lived as Scouts. Mr. Hudson showed slides depicting Scouting in the 12-county area covered by the Trinity-Neches Council. J. W. Ray was program chairman.

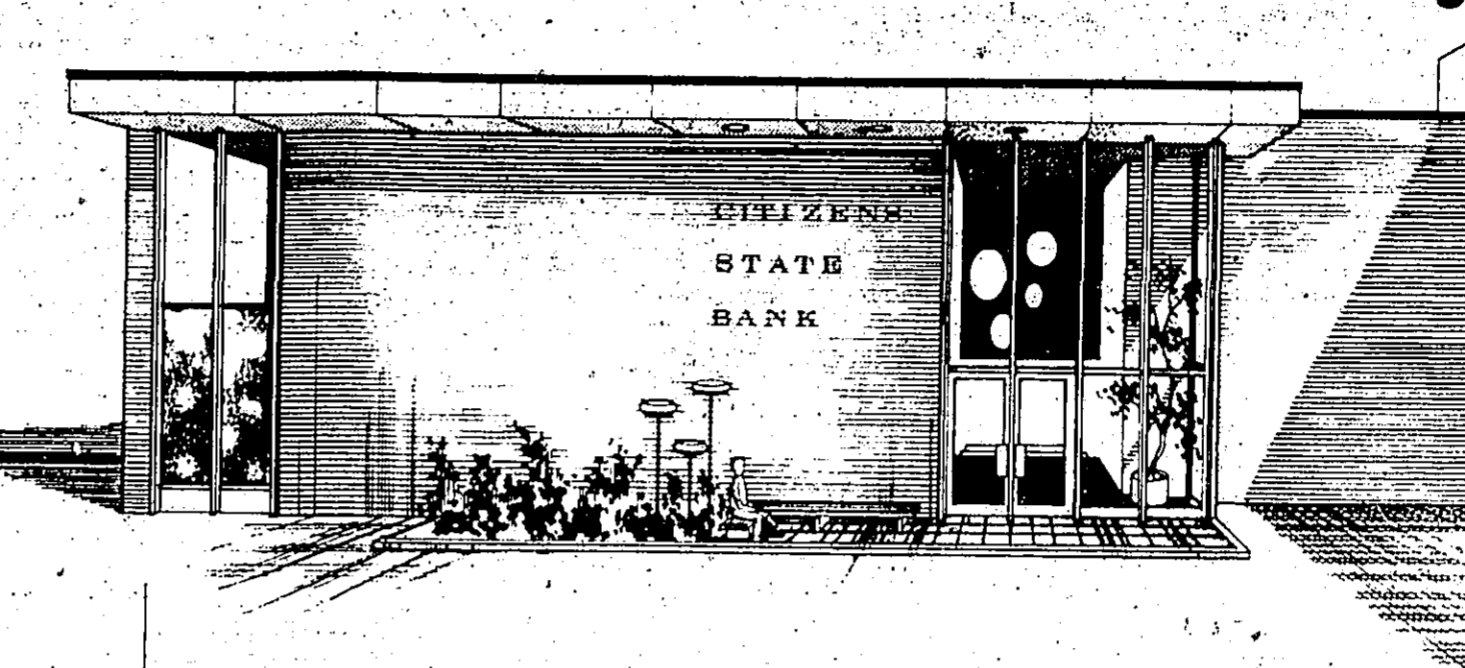
Brother Of Colmesneil Woman Dies In Galveston

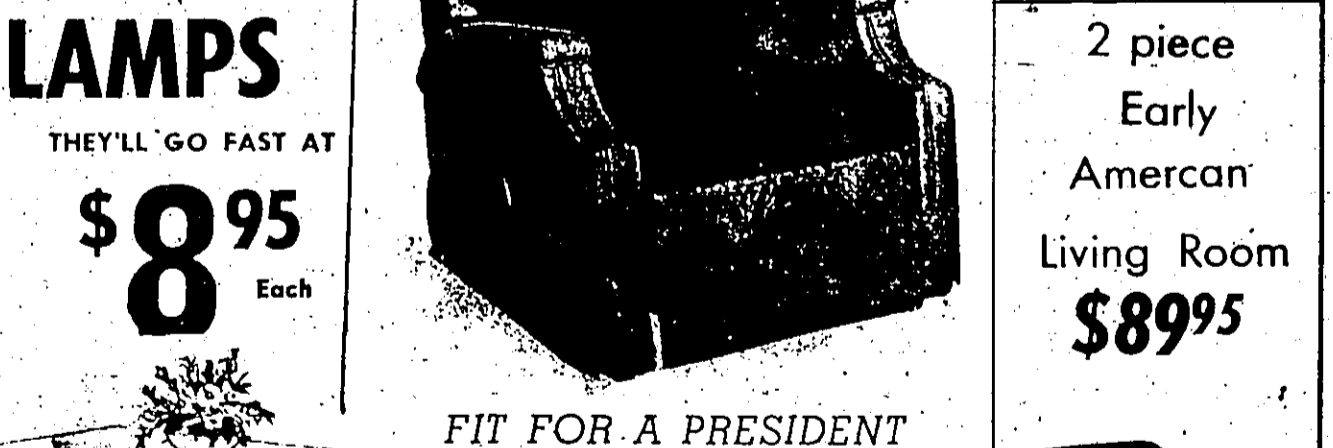
