Tyler county isn't the only East Texas county which finds itself facing a bond issue to take care of right-of-way for the state's big highway improvement program in this area. Shelby county is planning a \$500,000 bond issue to provide the necessary funds to match state right-of-way spending in that county.

Panola county will have to provide \$400,000 with a bond issue to take part in the state highway building program in that county.

Angelina county voted a \$750,000 bond issue last year, and the money is earmarked for acquisition of right-of-way on state, federal and farm-to-market roads in that county.

East Texas counties are glad to see the highway department on this big road improvement program, but the only way they can participate is to provide the necessary right-of-way. And none of them have enough right-of-way money on hand to even begin to take part in the program.

So far, Angelina county is the only county in the area which could start tomorrow with a highway improvement program with the state.

A tourist seminar for Tyler and surrounding counties will be held at Woodville Community Inn on April 4 and 5, according to Clyde E. Gray, chairman of the Tourist Development Commission of the Tyler County Program Building Committee. The Woodville Chamber of Commerce will be co-sponsor with the commission. The seminar here will be one of 20 which have been announced by Governor John Connally which will be held at Texas locations throughout the state. Only cost to those attending is a \$2 registration fee. To insure the growth of the tourist industry, Governor Connally said, we must prepare our citizens to assist visitors in the discovery of our vacationland Texas. A tourist seminar will help a community successfully with other areas and other states in the lucrative national tourist market.

The governor said that tourist seminars will also help the Texas Communities Division of the value of economic importance of the tourist industry to Texas.

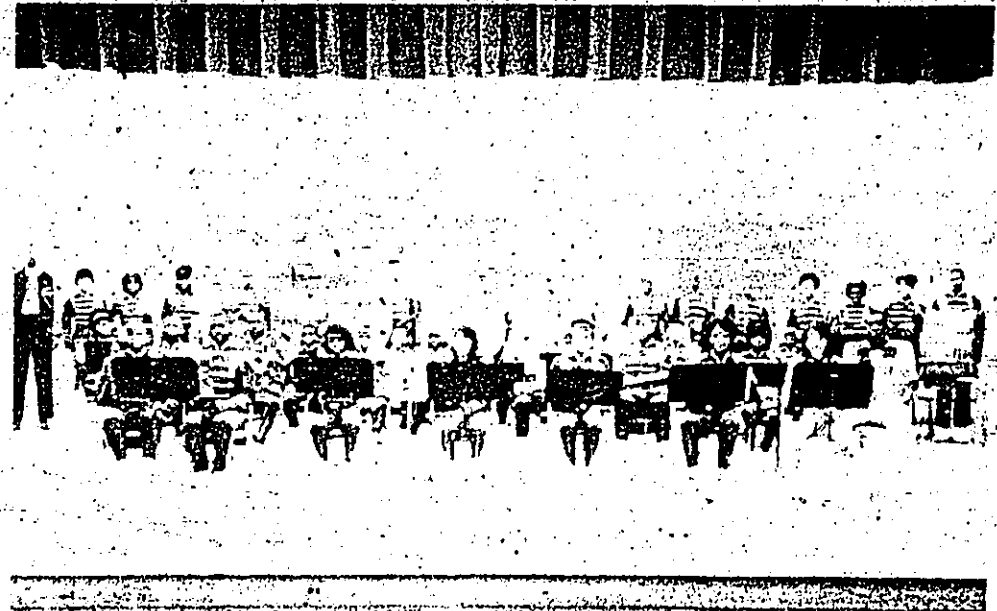

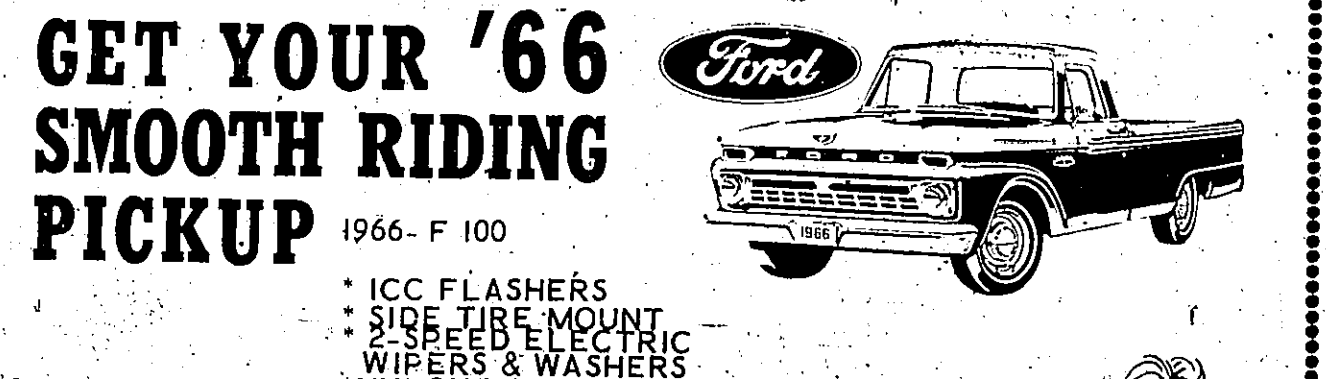

While the Legislature in special session on Sept. 1, 1965, the Coordinating Board for Texas as Colleges and Universities recommended a whopping increase of nearly \$160,000,000 in appropriations for its state institutions during the coming biennium.

That would bring the total 1967-68 spending level to \$429,100,000 for the tax-supported college-university system, including \$52,000,000 for public junior colleges.

Board also concluded that "primary responsibility" for doctoral degree programs should be restricted to four schools: The University of Texas, Texas A & M University, Texas Technological College and the University of Houston.
