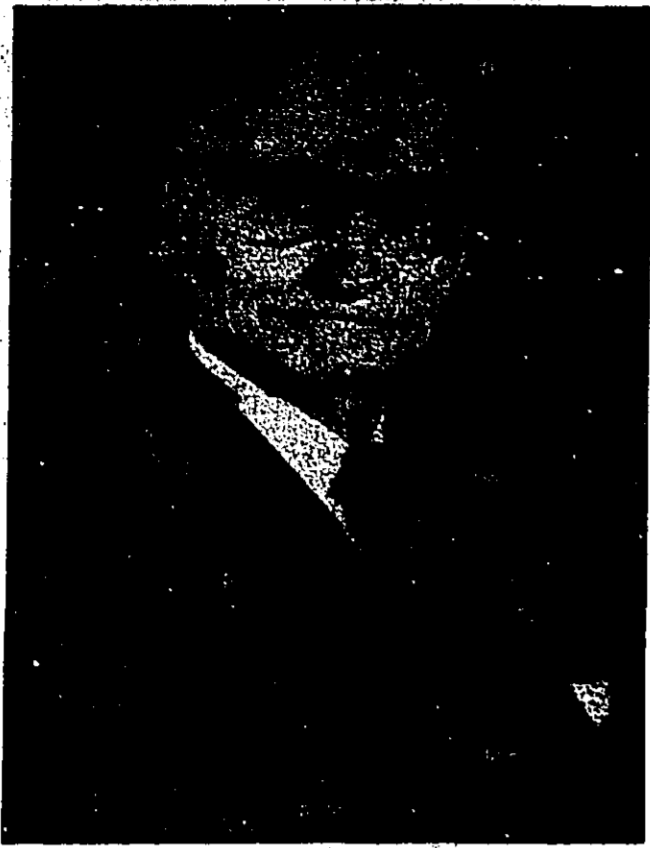


Rites Set Friday For E. W. Tubb

E. W. Tubb, 82, long-time Tyler county business and civic leader, died Wednesday morning in Tyler County Hospital of a heart attack. Mr. Tubb had been ill for several months following a heart attack suffered in Houston, and was in a hospital there before being brought to Tyler County Hospital where he had apparently been recuperating satisfactorily.

Funeral services will be held at 3 p.m. Friday in the First Baptist Church in Woodville. Officiating will be Dr. B. V. Timm of Meridian, Miss., former Woodville pastor, and Dr. Billy F. Simmons, pastor of the First Baptist Church.

Active pallbearers will be Dr. L. G. Burton, Robert A. Mann, Royce L. Reid, S. D. O'Brien, Herbert Sutton and Forrest M. Archer.

Honorary pallbearers will be Sam Reid, Jr., David Mann, Lee Feagin, James E. Wheat, Cecil Smith, Lud King of Huntsville and Terrell Sullivan of Centerville.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Tussie Tubb; two sons, George E. Tubb of Woodville and Sam H. Tubb of Abilene; four grand-children and nine great-grandchildren.

Mr. Tubb was born in Centerville, Leon county, on January 1, 1884. He taught in the public schools of Tyler county for several years after finishing his schooling at Sam Houston College in Huntsville. He became a partner in the mercantile firm of Reid and Tubb in Woodville. For the past 45 years he has been an investor in real estate in the East Texas area.

Bob Murphy Announces For State Senator



Bob Murphy, a 41 year old attorney from Nacogdoches, released his official announcement this week as a candidate for state senator from the 3rd Senatorial District.

Murphy, who lives on a stock farm six miles northwest of Nacogdoches, is married and has two daughters. A former district attorney of Angolia, Cherokee and Nacogdoches counties, Murphy has long been active in East Texas civic, political, and community affairs.

After receiving a degree from Stephen F. Austin State College in Nacogdoches, Murphy served two and one-half years in World War II seeing action in both the Atlantic and Pacific war zones.

He then earned his law degree at the University of Texas while working in Austin.

Murphy was then elected sergeant at arms of the Texas House of Representatives in 1948, county attorney of Nacogdoches county in 1952, and was then elected district attorney of the 2nd Judicial District of Texas for two terms.

An adult Boy Scout leader for many years, Murphy is recipient of Scouting's Silver Beaver Award. A deacon and Spjut School superintendent of his church, Murphy is an active layman.

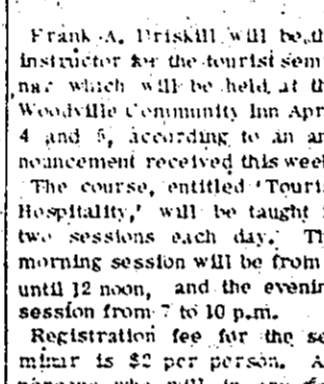
A volunteer fireman for more than 25 years, Murphy is fire captain in the Nacogdoches Fire Department and a vice-president of the State Firemen's and Fire Marshals Association.

In announcing his candidacy for the State Senate, Murphy pledged his efforts to halt rising taxes.

"I shall never vote for a state income tax," Murphy declared, "nor shall I ever vote to extend the state sales tax to groceries or medicine."

"Education, aid to our citizens who cannot help themselves, and agriculture are of concern to me," Murphy continued.

Absentee voting for the county's first bond election will close at 5 p.m. Tuesday, according to Tom Sawyer, district clerk.

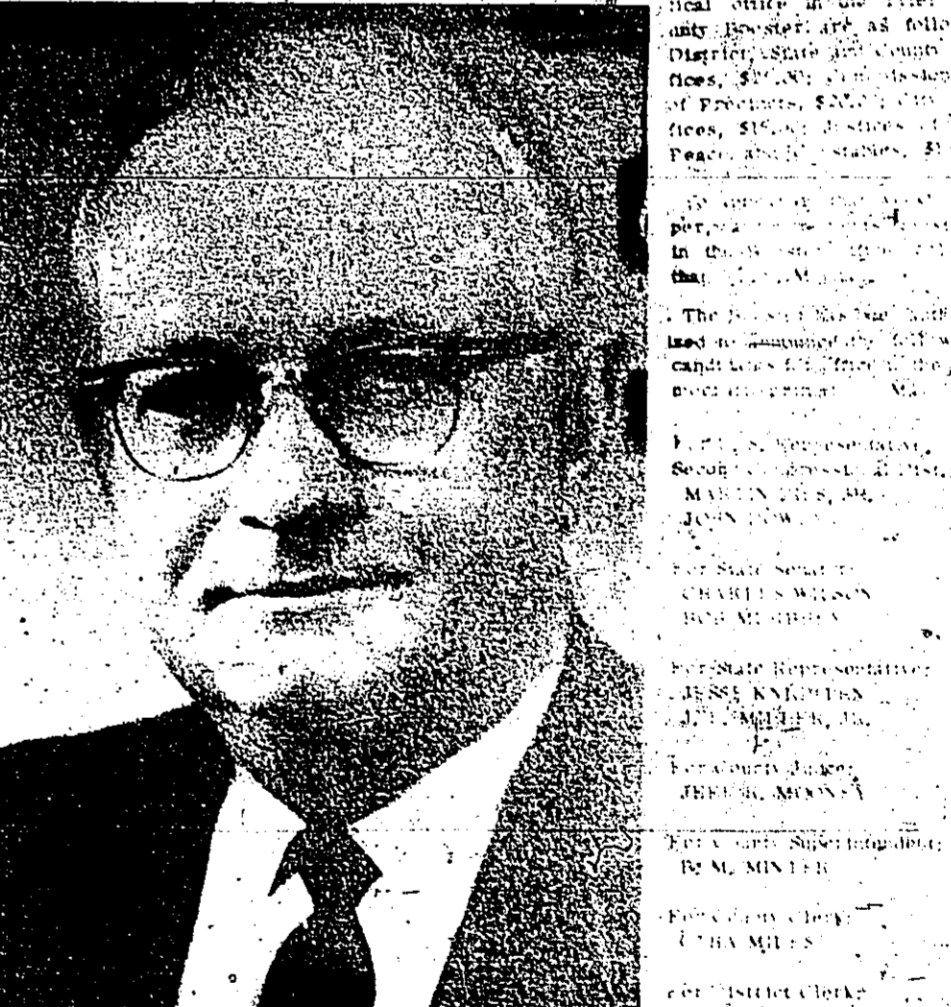

Nursery Notes

Time is growing short in which you can plant bare rooted fruit and nut and shade trees. Bare rooted plants are always much less expensive than ball and burlapped ones.

The ground is in good condition as we have had more moisture this year than in years before. Planting may continue through March. Why not try something different? Chestnut trees not only produce but make pretty shade trees. Japanese Persimmons are pretty specimen plants.

Oil sprays for dormant trees is the most important of all sprays to keep your fruit trees in good shape. When they start blooming, an orchard spray should be used as directed.

There are many complaints of scale on Camellias. About the end of this month use an oil emulsion spray. Repeat 2 or 3 times. Once the scale is controlled, an occasional spraying will keep it so. There will be an oil emulsion that can be used all summer on the market now.

You can fertilize your lawn now, also your trees. Healthy trees, shrubs and grass have an unusual ability against disease and they can be healthy only if they are fed and cared for.

Voters Registration Period Opens

A special 15-day registration period for voters begins today and goes through March 17, according to Tax Assessor-Collector A.L. Thurliff.

The registration is free under the new state voter registration law which replaces the poll tax as a requirement to vote in Texas.

A federal court has ruled Texas a 30-day state of the poll tax requirement removed, and the coming bond election in Tyler County will require a poll tax, and those who purchased a poll tax will not have to register this year during the special period.

All who did not buy a poll tax and who want to qualify for the coming elections will have to register under the new law.

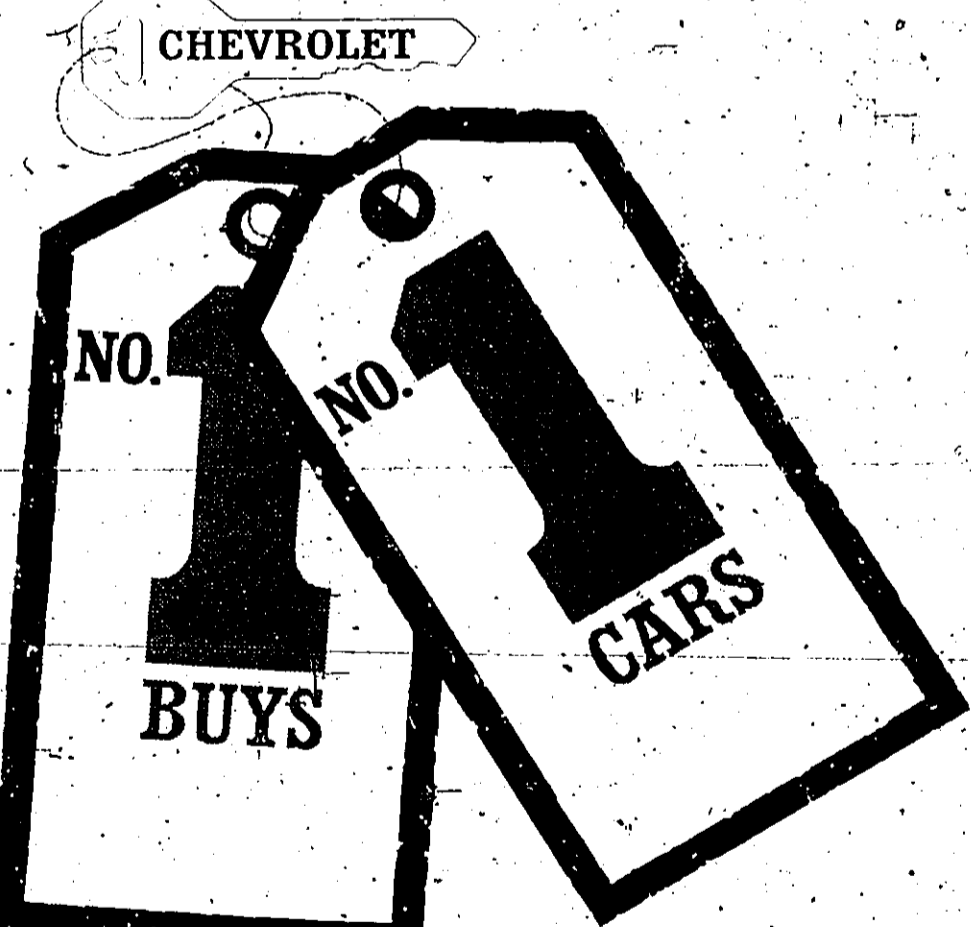
