There are three important dates for Tyler countians to remember during the next week.

First, there is the right-of-way bond election Saturday. All eligible voters are urged to vote in order that they may register the sentiments of the majority.

Eligible voters are those who have a poll tax receipt, who own property rendered for taxation in the county, and who live in the county. (The new voter's registration certificates will not be good for voting until elections after March 25).

The second date to remember is March 15, the final day that charter membership will be accepted in the Pine Hills Rural Recreation development.

The third date to remember, and while we are listing it as third, it is as important as the other two, is that March 17 is the final date to register to vote under the new voters' registration law passed by the special session of the legislature.

Now if you bought a poll tax before the January 31 deadline, you MUST NOT register under the new law because you are already a registered voter for this year. Or if you got a non-paid poll tax to vote in federal elections, you do not have to register. But if you did neither of these, you must register to vote in this year's elections before March 17 in order to be able to cast a ballot.

We are printing an application for a conditional voter registration certificate which you may fill out and mail to A. L. Thornton, tax assessor-collector. It must reach him by March 17. The application will be found on another page.

She mentioned that Tyler county is in the beautiful part of the state, one that has been off the beaten path of the tourist trade for too long. From the brochure, she lists the attractions to see—the Indian Reservation, Heritage Garden in Woodville, Sam Rayburn and Town Bluff reservoirs, the Allan Silvers Museum, the Kirby chapel at Chester, our state champion trees, and the Dogwood Festival the last Saturday in March. Charter Memberships In Pine Hills Close Tuesday

The charter membership drive of Tyler County's Pine Hills Rural Recreational Development has really moved into high gear, according to Morris Clemmons, Jr., who is chairman of this county project.

By last Saturday there were nearly 150 family memberships in at the headquarters located at 602 West Bluff St. near the Woodville Methodist Church with persons coming in every day, writing and calling on the phone asking questions about the recreational park, Clemmons stated.

From the questions asked, many people do not know what type of project is being built and for what purpose. Prior to opening the membership drive many of the civic clubs and organizations were brought a special program on this park how it started and what was its purpose, he pointed out.

Early in 1965 it was brought to the attention of the Recreational and Parks Committee of the Woodville Chamber of Commerce that the federal government under the direction of the Farm Home Administration which is headed locally by Irwin MacIn, that Tyler county was eligible to start a recreational development program in the form of a non-profit corporation to provide facilities for recreational purposes for all ages for those persons now living here, to attract new industry to our area, and attract persons retiring who require types of programs to be provided in this park.

All of this is to help rural areas to raise their economic status by meeting one of the most important facilities that rural communities must have if they plan to go ahead and as the citizens of Tyler county have shown in many times and ways before that we are leaders in Texas for showing the way in county progress. This recreational park is not for the rich man as one or two persons have misunderstood what this park is. The charter membership fee is \$100 per family with a \$10 per month fee per family when this development is open.

Nursery Notes

How to make a success of your Amaryllis is given in the following tips:
Use a pot which is about an inch larger in circumference than the bulb.

Hold the bulb with one hand in the top part of the pot in such a way that the roots are hanging down into the pot and get soil between and around the roots.

After the flowering of the first spike, keep the plant growing. Add from time to time a little manure which is obtainable from every garden store.

By the end of May, put the pot outside in full sun and take it back inside before the frost can hurt it. When taking the pot indoors, cut off the leaves, but leave the bulb still in the pot for about 2 or 3 months, preferably in a normal house temperature.

If you cannot put the pot in its place until October giving it from time to time some water and the bulb with remaining foliage on, still in the pot, in a cupboard for 3 or 4 months. Repeat the bulb after this rest-period in fresh soil.

When the bulb throws leaves and the bud appears, there press the bulb somewhat down and give the bulb a firmer position. Never give water on the saucer, but on the soil. The soil should never be wet, just keep it moist.

The pot should be placed at the back and the possible spot where the heat rises from below, such as the mantelpiece or radiator of the central-heating system.

Failures arise from keeping the bulb too wet before the roots start growing out and also when the bulbs lack sufficient warmth.

Temperature should be approximately 70-75 deg. F. If the temperature is sufficient the flowering takes place approximately 8 weeks after potting.
