Final Drive For Pine Hills Members Pushed

When Woodville was selected, as one of the 20 towns and cities in Texas where tourist hospitality seminars were to be held, congratulations were due the tourist development commission and the chamber of commerce.

Now that the seminar has been held here, Woodville was complimented by Frank Driskill, the seminar instructor, for the great amount of interest shown and the good attendance.

It seems that the seminars have been held in much larger places, such as Temple and Sherman-Denison and other urban areas, but the attendance there did not near match that in Woodville.

In fact, Mr. Driskill cited as an example the seminar in Temple, which was attended by only 20 persons. Temple is a city of 34,700, but evidently interest in tourism there is not as high as it is in this area.

Driskill and Clyde Gray, chairman of the tourist development commission, made a quick estimate Tuesday night of a round 100 persons who had registered for the four sessions of the seminar Monday and Tuesday.

Well, this area does have more to offer tourists than some other parts of Texas, and we are happy that the people of the piney woods are beginning to realize it. As Driskill said, we have a tremendous potential in this area.

Last week in the account of the historical tour, we inadvertently omitted the first stop, Peach Tree Village and the Kirby Museum at Chester. This was one of the main attractions, and we regret this oversight.

By the way, there are many beautiful drives on county highways where the dogwood is in full bloom. One of these is out Highway 190 both east and west, out the Seneca Road and on some of the county roads.

Whichever way you drive, you should find a beautiful view this coming weekend and next week.

Demonstrations of new equipment that sends handwriting, drawings and electrocardiograms over telephone lines will highlight the program Tuesday, April 12, which will be staged by Jim Sage, science demonstrator for Southwestern Bell Telephone company.

Sage is being presented in Woodville under the sponsorship of the Woman's Study Club.

All senior and junior high school students have been invited to the program, which will be at 2 p.m. in the school auditorium.

The study club will have a business meeting following the talk and demonstration by Sage.

During the program, Sage will describe the Bell Telephone System's role in providing equipment to send signals from computers, business machines and other electronic devices via telephone.

This fast-growing field of sending "machine talk" across town and across the nation is known as data transmission.

Justice Douglas is said to be gathering material for a book he is writing. He is a renowned world traveler and author of several books.

The 1966 southeast Texas Bass Fishing Tournament will begin this morning with the Friday and Saturday being the three qualifying days for the finals Sunday.

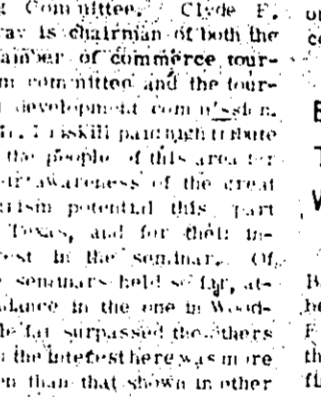
The winners will be determined on the basis of the catch made on the final day except in the contest for the largest bass, when a catch made on the qualifying days or on the final day is considered.
