### Martin Dies, Jr. Honored in Lufkin April 13

An overflow crowd of more than 300 persons was present at Hotel Angelina in Lufkin Wednesday evening, April 13 to honor State Senator Martin Dies, Jr. Dies vacates his senate post after eight years of dedicated service to seek election to the United States Congress, second district.

Supporters heard Ward R. Burke, Daboll Attorney, hail Dies as "a man of honor without blemish." In my association with Martin I have found him to possess wisdom, integrity, vision and deep rooted dedication to the people he represents.

Greeted with a standing ovation Dies spoke briefly to the group pointing out his goals for the development of East Texas. "East Texas is capable of returning to the place of leadership and respect it once held in our state and our nation. We can bring this about together by working to conserve, and impound our natural water resources and using them for the betterment of our area. Let industry and tourism and the population explosion that must follow move over to East Texas." The Senator added, "We have the very real possibility of providing the one ingredient for dynamic growth that our area lacks--competitive, freight rates. We can use our rivers and reservoirs here in East Texas to provide avenues for inland barge traffic linking our area with the markets of the entire country."

Lufkin Mayor Jim Waters introduced numerous area mayors that were in attendance.

Master of ceremonies, Clark Anderson, read congratulatory telegrams from several state officials. Telegrams of best wishes and commendations came from dignitaries such as Ben Barnes, speaker of the House, Waggoner Carr, Attorney General, Preston Smith, Lt. Governor, Chris Cole, Secretary of State. Numerous other telegrams were received from Dies' senate colleagues and members of the House.

The conclave was held in conjunction with the 18th annual meeting of the society.

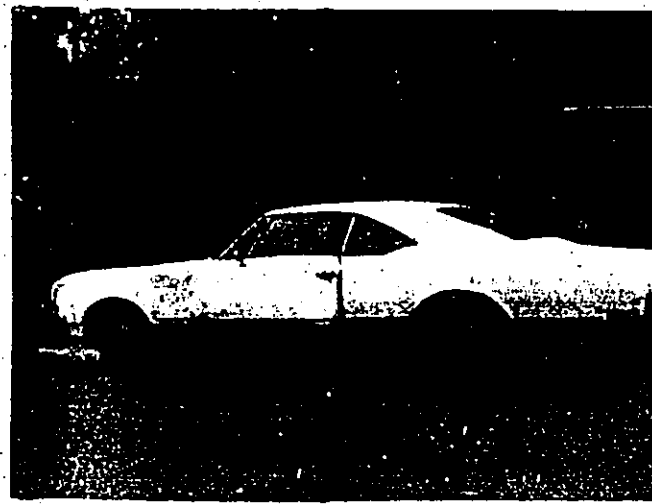

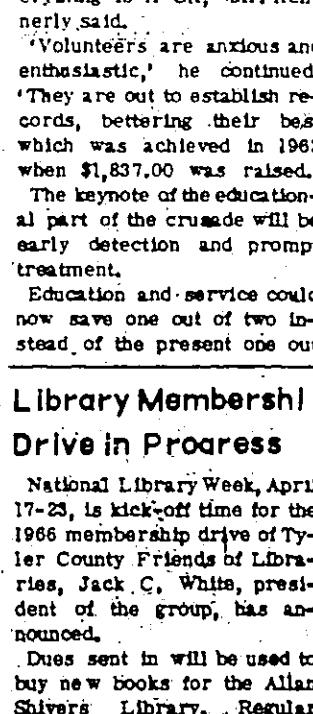

Legumes and grasses together in a pasture have distinct advantages. If fact, they supplement each other. One of the main reasons for growing a legume, such as clover, with a grass pasture is the higher percentage of protein in legumes. Legumes often contain 25 to 30 per cent protein. And much of the protein in legumes is immediately available for livestock nutrition since it is in the form of amino acids. Legumes also have several times more calcium than grasses.

But probably the most distinct advantage of growing legumes with grasses is the ability of a legume to fix nitrogen from the air. The nitrogen is held in the nodules on the roots of the legume and made available to the grass, thus stimulating its growth. Some nitrogen is also stored in the legume roots and released to the grass at a later time.

Grasses mixed with legumes help prevent heat in livestock because of the fibrous properties of the grass. Grass-legume pastures provide longer grazing seasons of high quality forage than grass or legume alone.

A word of caution—clovers and other legumes are "heat out" of pastures easily. The main reason for the heat out are low and unbalanced fertility. Low soil fertility, especially low phosphorus, is the main reason for the heat out.

Legumes also have a poor root system. Grasses root at the first table and the first choice of the plant nutrients. As a result, grasses will starve out legumes if poor management practices are followed. Clovers should be well-fertilized with phosphorus and potassium in the fall. Best fertilizing grasses with high rates of nitrogen means sure death to clovers.

Early April is the time to apply insecticides to the lawn for the control of grubs. White grubs are the larvae (worm stage) of the hard-shelled May and June beetles. They live in the soil and feed on grass roots. Damage shows up on late April and May as brown, dead spots in the lawn.

Some insecticides, aldrin, heptachlor, dieldrin, and chlordane, used either as sprays or as granules will give good control. If an emulsified concentrate form of the insecticide is used, it should be mixed with water to give the recommended strength for the material. If the granular form is used, it can be applied to the lawn as it comes from the package.

Because of the different formulations available, persons interested in treating their lawns for grub control that they come by County Agricultural Agents office for a free copy of "Texas Guide for Controlling Insects on Ornamental Plants." Detailed information on mixing and applying the insecticides for grub control are outlined as well as the control measures for many other insect pests.

If the insecticides are used during periods of short rainfall, it will be necessary to water them in, where insecticides are water-soluble, children or pets should be kept off the lawn until it is dry.

The county agent also has other information available at his office on many subjects of interest to home gardeners and flower growers.

It's almost that time of year again. That time when peach growers begin to apprehensively watch their orch-

ards for signs of the peach canker pest in Texas and severe infestations can destroy an entire peach crop. Tom Denman, researcher at Texas A & M University's West Cross Timbers Experiment Station near here, has done research which shows the timing of the spraying schedule for the cankerer. The first step in a banding system, says John Thomas, Extension entomologist at A&M, is to wrap heavy corrugated paper or burlap around trees suspected of having the cankerer. He says the bands should be wrapped around smaller limbs just before the bark becomes rough.

The cankerer crawls down the tree limbs looking for a suitable place to undergo its transformation to a moth. The hole under the band of paper or burlap where large numbers of them are caught is the cankerer's home. The next step, says Thomas, is to catch the paper and place them in plastic jars with ventilation holes. The jars should be kept in a cool place. When about 10 percent of the moths emerge, spraying should begin in about ten days.

The 8-10 day waiting period is to allow the free moths time to lay eggs and for the eggs to hatch, says Thomas. The trick is to spray within the critical period. The most of the eggs have hatched, he says.

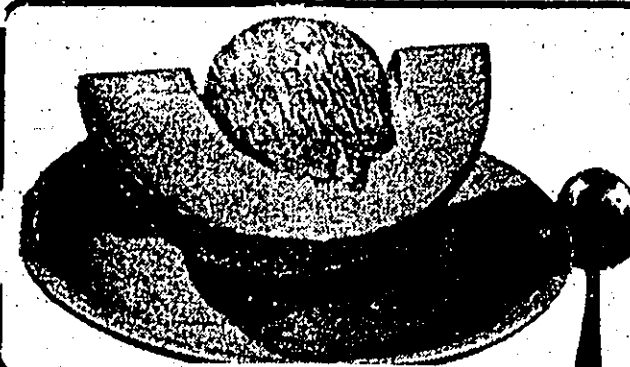
