The ballot shown is for precinct 1. Below are the changes which will appear on the ballots in the other precincts:

Tyler county voters will go to the polls Saturday to nominate candidates from United States Senator down through precinct officers.

Both Democratic and Republican parties will hold primaries, with the Democrats voting in the court house in Woodville and at the regular polling places in other parts of the county. The Republican primary voting will be in a box for the county, which will be at the Woodville school recreation center. There are no candidates for county or precinct offices.

In the Democratic primary, there are no contests for nomination for county or precinct offices in the county, but there are contests in pre-

dicts two and four for county commissioners.

Nomination in the Democratic primary for county office in Tyler county is by a majority of electors, while in the Republican primary it is by a majority of voters.

In precinct two and four, there are three candidates for three and five-year terms respectively. Both candidates will receive a majority and a vote of the primary will be necessary.

In precinct two, the candidates are: Powell, the incumbent; and two others. The incumbent is the son of the late J. B. Miller, who served as a state senator from 1935 to 1941.

In precinct four, the candidates are: Head, J. L., incumbent; and two others. Head served as a state senator from 1941 to 1947.

A national conference on Indian affairs is being planned for June 7-10 in Tulsa, Oklahoma, Walter Broomer, superintendent of the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation. Mr. Broomer is chairman of the Governor's Interstate Indian Council Board of Directors which is planning the conference, at which representatives from each participating state will review existing and new Indian programs.

The council serves 25 states which have sizable Indian populations and its purpose is to assist in coordinating tribal, state, and federal Indian programs. Special emphasis is placed on developing means by which state governments can assist Indian people in civil and political rights, education, economic development, health, and welfare.

At present Mr. Broomer is involved in plans for the opening of the tourist program at the Alabama-Coushatta Reservation 17 miles east of Livingston March 5. Sponsored by the tribal council, the tourist program is administered by Mr. Broomer.

## CHESTER SENIOR PLAY IS SET FOR FRIDAY NIGHT IN SCHOOL AUDITORIUM

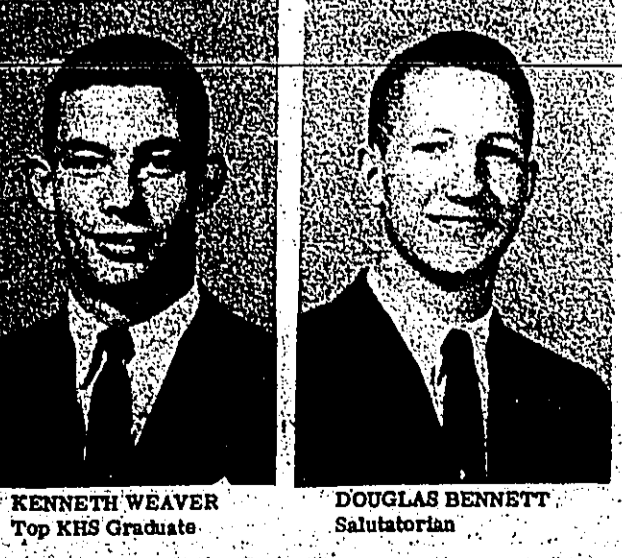
The senior class play at Chester High School will be presented Friday night in the school auditorium beginning at 7:30 p.m.

**Internal Revenue Questions-Answers**

Q-1 had a big tax bill to pay when I filed April 15. Will the same thing happen next year?

A-If your income is subject to withholding, the graduated withholding rates which become effective May 1 should reduce the size of the final bill you have to pay.

Q-You may also reduce your final bill by payments of estimated tax, by decreasing the number of withholding exemptions you claim, or by having additional amounts withheld from your paycheck.

Q-We are moving and our refund hasn't come through. How can we be sure of getting it?

A-Notify the IRS office where you filed your return of your new address. Be sure to include your old address and your Social Security number so that your return can be identified.

Q-A change of address card should also be filed with your post master at your old address.

Q-Getting all my records together to fill out my tax form was a problem. Do you have any suggestions that might make it easier?

A-The most important thing is to be sure you have good records to start with. If you don't pay by check, always get a paid bill as a record of your payment.

Q-Keeping all your tax records in the same place will also insure that you have them available to you when you need them.

Q-When is the second installment of estimated tax due?

A-Individuals must pay their second installment by June 15. The same form will be used for either method.

Q-My boss says I have to file a new Form W-4 withholding statement. Is that right? What happens if I don't?

A-If you are married, the law requires you to file a new W-4 withholding statement. If you are single, you will be treated as a single person for tax withholding purposes. If you are single and wish to file a new W-4 to correct the number of withholding exemptions you claim, and thereby prevent incorrect withholding after May 1.

Q-I didn't have a Social Security number when I filed. I just got one. Do you want me to send it in now? The back of my return will show the number on the return will be notged when it is processed. You will be notified and asked to apply for the new form.

Q-I just took over my father's business. Do you have anything that would minimize my tax liabilities?

A-The Tax Guide for Small Business, Publication No. 334, should answer many of your questions.

**Medicare Doctor Bill Form Announced**

A single, easy-to-fill-out form for the older people and physicians to use in requesting payment under the Medicare program has been designed, according to L. R. James, social security district manager at Lufkin.

The "Request for Payment" form will be used for claims under the voluntary doctor bill insurance part of the Medicare program, James said. Beginning July 1, people 65 and over who are enrolled in the voluntary program will get payment for 80 percent of their doctor bills and other medical expenses, after they have met the first \$50 of these expenses.

The one-page form was developed in close cooperation with representatives of the American Medical Association's Council on Medical Services, James said, and was designed and recommended for adoption by the Health Insurance Benefits Advisory Council, a group appointed under the law advise on administrative policies and regulations. Nine of the 16 members of the advisory council are physicians. It has also been approved by the health insurance industry.

There will be two ways to claim payment for doctor bills and other medical services covered under the medical insurance part of Medicare, James said. The same form will be used for either method.

Under one method, the doctor will bill the patient, and after the patient has paid the bill, the patient will claim reimbursement. Under the other method, the doctor and patient agree, the doctor will send in the claim and receive payment. This method of requesting payment can be used where all of the items of a medical bill still remain to be paid.

Under the payment-by-doctor method, the patient will fill out the bottom half of the form and give the necessary basic facts about the services rendered and when and where they were furnished.

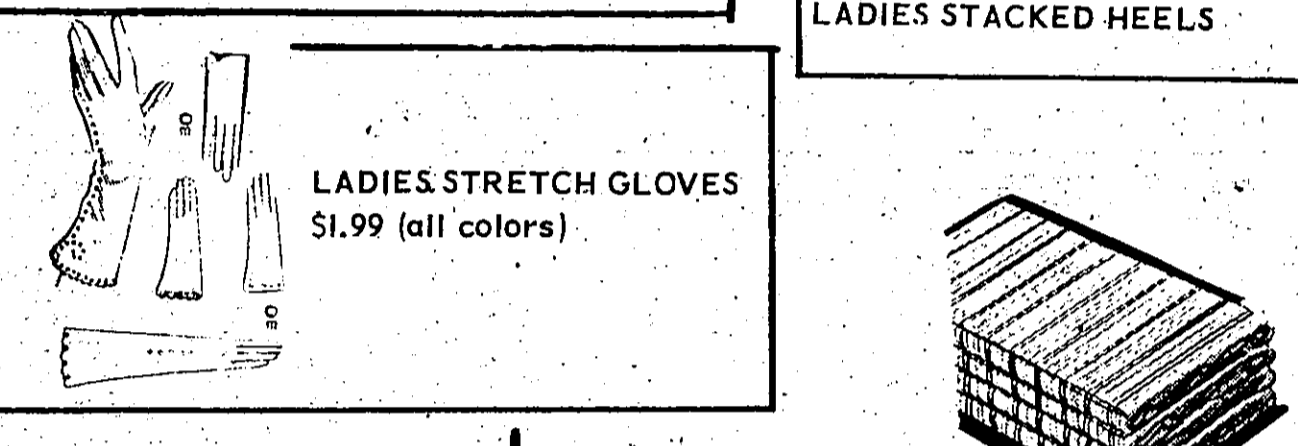

### Veterans Questions And Answers

Q--I am a married employe of 27 years old and I plan to retire in 1967. I am also a veteran of World War I. My railroad retirement benefits will be about \$200 a month and the benefits for my wife will be about \$76 for a total monthly income of \$276. This will be my only source of income. Am I correct in assuming that my \$276 will not be considered as income when applying for a WW I veterans pension?

A--All income received during the year is counted by the VA when determining a veterans eligibility for a non-service-connected pension. This included wages, salaries, dividends, interest, profits, annuities, pensions, Social Security payments, etc. Q--If I convert my term guaranteed annuity to a life annuity, will my premium remain the same throughout the duration of the contract?

A--Yes, the premium on Modified Life, NSL, will remain the same throughout the duration of the contract.

Q--I lost my son in the service about five months ago, as a dependent parent receiving VA compensation, would I be eligible for the GI home loan or does the VA require the veteran be alive to be eligible?

A--GI loans are available only to veterans who are married widows of men who served in either World War II or the Korean Conflict and who had a service-connected disability. Parents are not eligible.

Q--In the recent medical report that I received it stated that I have a stomach tract, that I received while in the service. Is it too late in life for a disability pension from the VA?

A--There is no time limit as to when a veteran may file a claim for a disease or disability which was incurred while serving in the armed forces.

Q--I am a veteran's widow and received a monthly check from the VA of \$50.40 a month up until the time of my remarriage. My second husband died shortly after our marriage and I would like to know if I am entitled to all six first months VA pension, since I am no longer married?

A--Remarriage following the death of the veteran makes the widow permanently ineligible for a pension from the VA, based on the death of that veteran, unless the reported marriage is void or has been annulled.
