## STATE CAPITAL Highlights AND Sidelights

As Municipal Water District No. 1, the City of Irving, and the U.S. Corp. of Engineers, who have completed the construction of Cooper Dam Reservoir and Texas Water Reservoir, the Board of Engineers for Rivers and Harbors, Army Corps of Engineers, has approved the Aquila Reservoir on Aquila Creek.

Approximately \$2,000,000 dam and reservoir for flood control, water supply, recreation and fish and wildlife enhancement between Hillbush and Waco.

Texas Water Rights Commission announced plans and specifications for Livingston Dam Reservoir in Polk County. The dam would be located on the east fork of the Brazos River about a mile north of the dam site.

State geologists reported that the state's oil reserves are estimated at 40 billion barrels, with approximately 10 billion barrels being recoverable under present technology.

The House of Representatives passed a bill on May 11 to reduce the federal estate tax from \$1 million to \$500,000.

Gov. Price has signed a bill to allow the state to purchase land for parks and recreation at a reduced price.

### 28 Wells Drilled In County In 1965, 21 Are 'Dry Holes'

The county's oil reserves are estimated to be substantial, providing a long-term source of income for the community.
