Run-off Election Is Saturday

All voting precinct boxes will be open for the Democratic run-off primary Saturday evening through there is only one statewide run-off contest, according to Morris Clemmons, Jr., county Democratic chairman. The voting boxes will open at 8 a.m. and remain open as usual until 7 p.m. In commissioners' precincts two and four there are contests for county commissioner and a good vote is expected in boxes in these precincts. In commissioners' precincts one and three voters will cast ballots only in one race, the run-off for attorney general.

Clemmons urged everyone in all boxes to cast a ballot Saturday. The run-off in precinct two is between the incumbent, H. H. Powell, and a Chester businessman, T. T. Thornton. In precinct four the incumbent, French C. Hicks, is in a run-off with James R. (Bo) Jordan.

These are the only local races in the run-off election. The statewide run-off contest is between Crawford Martin and Franklin Spears. Martin was serving as secretary of state when he entered the race for attorney general. Spears, a state senator, is making his first state-wide race.

Woodville Couple Makes \$10,000 Gift To College

East Texas Baptist College has received a \$10,000 gift in negotiable securities from a Woodville couple, Mr. and Mrs. J. N. Jordan, according to M. V. Runnels, vice president for development. The gift is to be applied to the college endowment fund held by the Texas Baptist Foundation. It is part of the college's current campaign for funds to match the \$250,000 challenge gift of Carr P. Collins of Dallas. Each dollar given to the college during the campaign will be matched by Mr. Collins.

Mr. Jordan, a long time resident of Woodville, is a retired lumberman. He is a deacon in the First Baptist Church. The Jordans are active in civic and religious affairs in their community and are interested in Christian education. Mr. Jordan visited Marshall and East Texas Baptist College as a guest of Mr. Runnels last fall. East Texas Baptist College is a senior, co-educational, liberal arts college, owned by the Baptist General Convention of Texas. The college was chartered in 1912 as the College of Marshall, a junior college. In 1944 the school became a four-year college. Dr. Howard C. Bennett has been president of the Marshall school since 1960. A number of students from the Woodville area attend the college.

Triana To Attend Spanish Institute

Francis Triana, Spanish teacher in the Woodville public schools, has been accepted as one of the 60 high school Spanish teachers who will attend the NDEA Institute for Advanced Studies in Spanish at the University of North Carolina this summer. Triana was selected from over 250 applicants to attend the institute.

The purpose of the institute is primarily to train teachers in the most up-to-date techniques of language teaching and to upgrade their language skills. During the six-week period, beginning June 12 and ending July 22, the secondary school teachers will pledge to speak only Spanish both in the classroom and during all other phases of the program.

Southeast Texas Resource Planning Meeting Is Held

Travis Edwards, representing the Texas Commissioner of Agriculture, met with the Directors of the Southeast Texas Resource Planning and Development Area in Kountze on May 26.

Edwards explained the Texas Department of Agriculture's interest in controlling the imported fire ant. He stated that to date no state funds have been designated for control of this pest, however his department is becoming increasingly aware of the rapid movement of the fire ant and damages resulting from it.

Directors of the Area requested that representatives of the Agriculture Research Service and the Texas Department of Agriculture develop and present a plan for controlling the fire ant by June 30, which is the next regularly scheduled meeting. Request for natural resource development throughout the ten-county area were reviewed and discussed and priorities of assistance were set. The requests ranged in nature from water storage needs to extension of railroad facilities.

The directors decided to ask the Soil Conservation Service to make preliminary engineering investigations on Sandy Creek in Jasper County, Long King Creek in Polk County, and Trout Creek in Jasper and Newton Counties.

The Governor's official memorandum was issued Monday, May 30, in advance of the annual convention of the West Gulf Division of the American Radio Relay League.

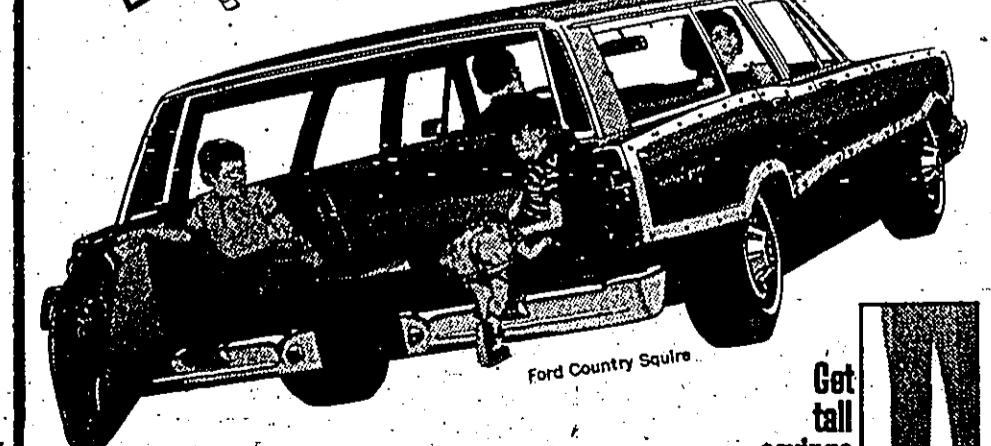
