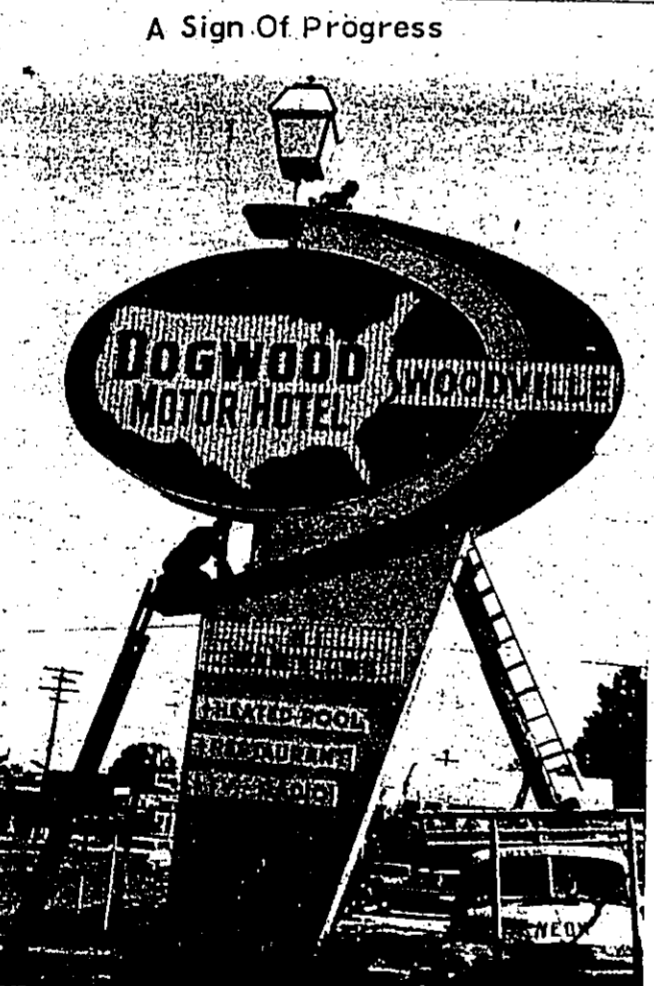

Crawford Martin Carries County, Hicks Defeated

Crawford Martin carried Tyler County in the run-off primary Saturday by a mere 36 votes, 787 to 751, in the unofficial tally.

Statewide, Martin was elected attorney general with a majority of over 50,000 votes over Franklin Spears. In local runoff contests, Herman H. Powell was re-elected commissioner of precinct two over T. T. Thornton, 232 to 136.

In precinct four, James R. Jordan defeated the incumbent, French C. Hicks, for precinct four commissioner by a vote of 471 to 345.

Precincts two and four had the only run-off primary contests for local offices. Voting was light in precincts one and three, where voters only had the one statewide run-off contest to bring them to the polls. Of the approximately 1500 voters cast Saturday, nearly 1200 of them were in precincts two

INDIAN TOURIST PROGRAM STARTS SUMMER SCHEDULE

Indian Drums will beat again in the Big Thicket every day from now until Labor Day, Texas' only remaining Indian Tribes are reliving their rich history and culture for the public to enjoy in a peaceful setting of beautiful stately pines of East Texas.

Tribal dances in the traditional buckskins, eagle feathers and colorful plumes will be performed several times daily. Superintendent Walt Broemer stated, "Visitors will have an opportunity to try their feet at Indian dancing with the Tribal Dancers after the performance."

One of the most exciting activities is a tour through the Big Thicket. "It sometimes appears to visitors that the four vehicles will get stuck in swampy areas but we have special built four wheel drive vehicles that will carry you through the interior of the Reservation," said Lester Battise, program director. The Big Thicket tour is a fifty-minute trip through some of the largest virgin pine timber in East Texas and wanders along Bear Creek where visitors see the beautiful hardwood trees of the bottom lands.

Another interesting ride is the Indian Wash Spring Wagon Ride which takes visitors through the old Indian Agency area to the stream where where springs flow from the hillside and Indian ladies used to wash their clothes and gather water for their campsite. The tour continues through a magnificent pine forest to an old garden site where guests see a unique sight of a holly tree growing out of the top of a mulberry tree. The twenty-five minute trip re-enters the Headquarters area through the old Indian school grounds.

For those persons who would rather walk through the Big Thicket there is a Nature Trail along which is growing a pine tree that is older than the Declaration of Independence.

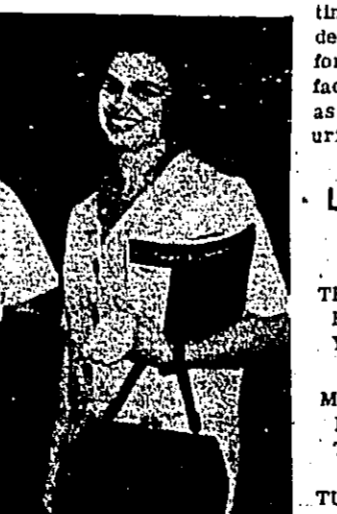
Also there is an archery range where an Indian Guide will teach persons to shoot a bow and arrow the Indian way.

You can enjoy the tribal history and culture of the tribes, the Arts and Crafts shop where authentic crafts of American Indians are sold in a dining room where you can taste Indian Fry Bread.

All activities will be open 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. weekdays and Saturdays and 1 p.m. - 5 p.m. on Sundays.

The Alabama-Coushatta Indian reservation is located 15 miles west of Woodville, on U. S. 190.

COMMUNITY INN NOW DOGWOOD MOTOR HOTEL

Woodville Community Inn became Dogwood Motor Hotel through an agreement with the board of directors and its operator, Rushing Hotel Leasing Company. It was announced recently.

The agreement, reached in May, allows Rushing to operate the motel under the new name, which was selected by the board of directors and Rushing.

Bob Rushing, manager, said that he and the board of directors felt that a name change was advisable in order to better promote the motel's facilities to secure area business as opposed to the former name of the inn that carried only the name of one town. They felt that Dogwood Motor Hotel would attract more resort business from the Beaumont and Houston areas. The management plans an extensive advertising campaign in an effort to continue to promote the motel for resort business.

Mr. Rushing has moved his family to Woodville and plans to continue to operate Rushing Hotel Leasing Company from Woodville. He is presently associated with Herbert Wilson in Hotel Fredonia and the Cowhouse Motor Hotel in Killen, and at present is working in an advisory capacity with the communities of Rusk and San Augustine, both of which hope to build community motel hotels.

Mr. Rushing said that he was real pleased with the Woodville operation since the first of the year and is appreciative of the response of local people in using the facilities and recommending it to others. He thinks this has been a big factor in getting the motel here more widely accepted and better known for its convention and other facilities, and for acceptance as headquarters for area tourism.
