## Many Are Visiting Rayburn Power Plant

A large number of area people have taken advantage of the guided tours through the Sam Rayburn Dam power plant during the past three weeks. The tours are conducted Mondays through Fridays at 9:30 and 10:30 a.m. and at 1:00 and 2:15 p.m.

Generation of power started about three weeks ago on a scale schedule on one of the huge turbines. Corps of Engineers guides say that both generators can turn out annually enough electricity to light 1,184,000,000 light bulbs of 100-watt size for one hour.

If you are interested in voltage, the generators can send 36,800 volts into two transformers located on the shaft tube deck and in turn 138,000 volts comes from the transformers.

Two water intakes, with two water passages each, carry the water from Sam Rayburn Reservoir to two 43,500 horsepower (maximum capacity) vertical Kaplan hydraulic turbines. These are connected to the two generators which rotate at 120 revolutions per minute, and each is capable of generating 26,000 kilowatts at normal rating.

The power generated from the plant is distributed by Sam Rayburn Dam Electric Cooperative, Inc., over Gulf States lines.

The powerhouse is about 16 stories high. The lowest floor contains the oil storage room and access to the draft tube, about 100 feet below the normal surface of the reservoir. Thirty-six feet above the draft tube access is the turbine room floor, then the generator room floor which also houses the maintenance shop.

## Vandals Remove Visitors' Registers

Two registration books filled with names of visitors to the old Indian Ball Park six miles southwest of Woodville have been taken by unknown persons, according to W. H. Risinger, president of the Tyler County Historical Society. Since the books are valuable to the historical group and to no one else, Mr. Risinger urged this week that the books be returned.

Clyde E. Smith, Jr., county attorney, also issued a statement urging that the books be returned and also citing the penalties that can be levied for taking or destroying the books.

Mr. Smith's statement follows: 'It has been called to my attention, as County Attorney, that on two different occasions the registration book for the Indian Ball Park, which is located on the Old Spanish Trail six miles South of Woodville, has been stolen from the little log house which is located within the park. This park, as most of the citizens of Tyler County know, was originated for historical purposes and is an asset to Tyler County. Many thousands have visited the park. Many Boy Scouts have been able to use the park on various occasions.

The park is furnished with a registration book and this book is of historical significance, in that the person registering gives his address and Tyler County is able to ascertain the number of people who are enjoying the park and, in later years this book will be valuable to the people of Tyler County, Texas. As a result, Tyler County has no accurate record of registering people who have visited and enjoyed the park. Ordinarily 200 Boy Scouts use the park and were able to enjoy it and receive its benefits. The park is located on 200 acres of land which is owned by the International Paper Company. This company, through its pole division manager, Byron Brodnax, furnished the logs to build the cabin thereon, and the taxpayers of Tyler County have spent about \$2,000.00 in erecting picnic tables, barbecue pits and grills for things so that the people may enjoy and spend some time in enjoyment and rest on the Old Spanish Trail.

Such action and conduct by people who would take away the registration book from such a unique park is regrettable and if such persons are found they will be penalized to the limits of the law. Such conduct carries a criminal penalty and is finable, or a person could probably go to jail for a length of time, if whoever took these registration books would return them, it would certainly be appreciated. Just put them back in the cabin where you found them. It is very important to Tyler County that these books be restored to the log cabin and that they remain intact, so that the people of Tyler County can see for themselves the great benefits that this park is giving to the citizens of this

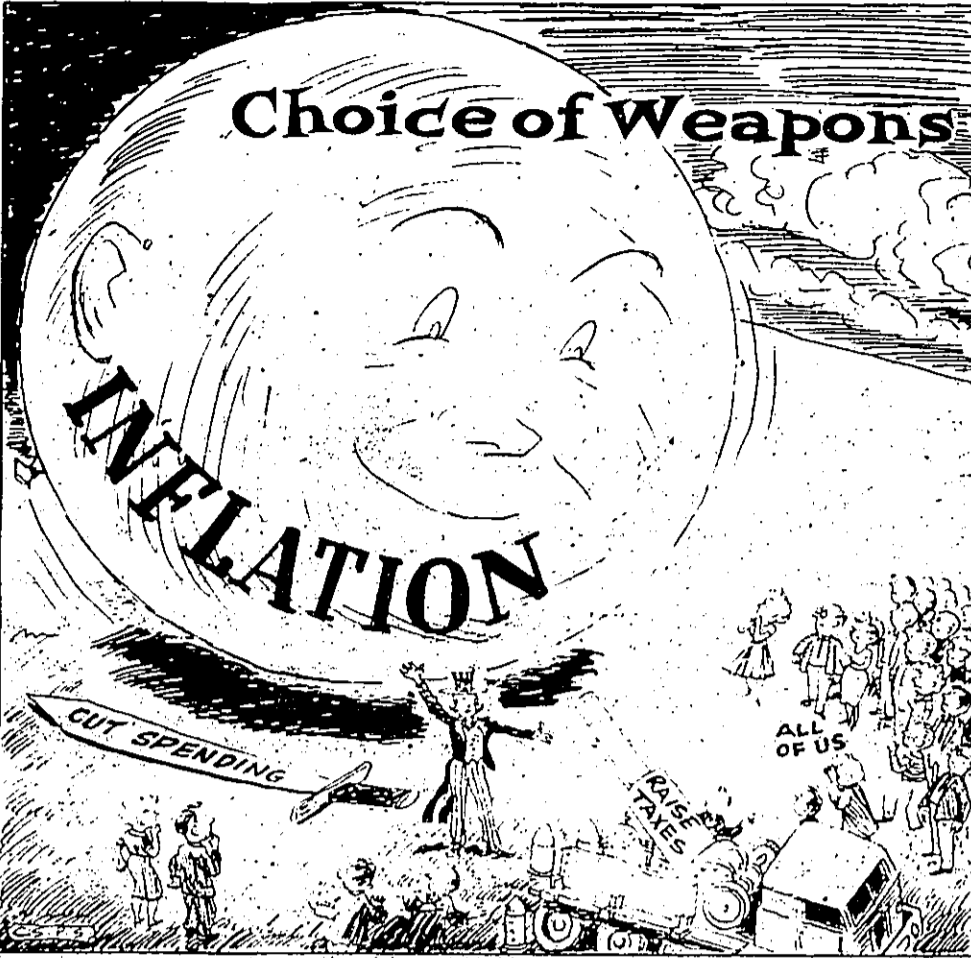

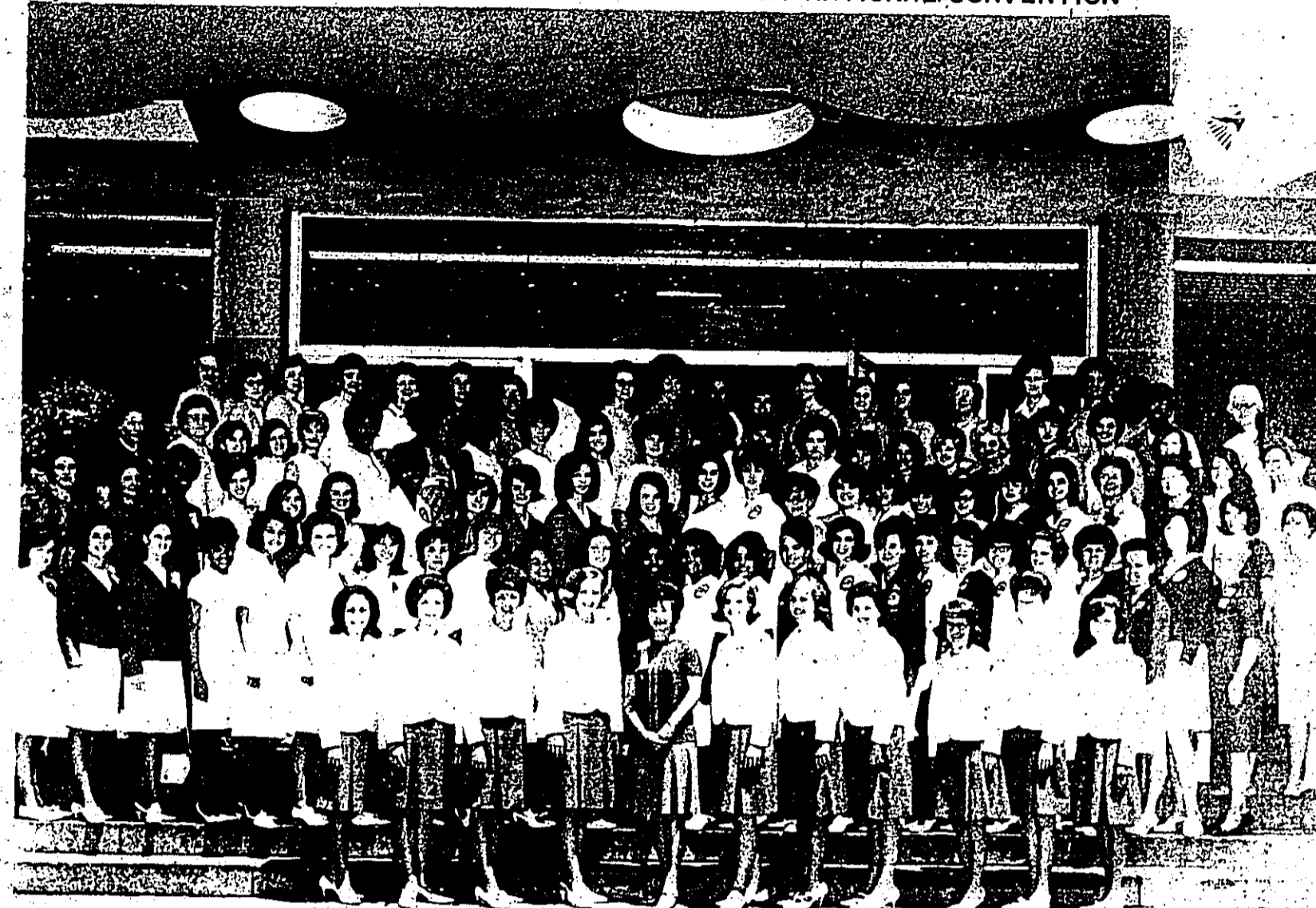

Livestock should have water facilities without traveling over one mile, or two miles round-trip.

In excessively steep, rough country, water should be available within one-half mile and in flat country could be within one-quarter mile.

The amount of apparently ungrazed or over-grazed pasture is one index that can be used to measure stocking rates.

The best situation is that 70 to 80 percent of the pasture appears to be grazed.

When grazing is high, the soil is hard, it may be hard to walk without a horse.

When grazing is low, the soil is soft, it may be hard to walk without a horse.

When grazing is medium, the soil is firm, it may be hard to walk without a horse.

Livestock. This means if a cattman has his pastures stocked at a low enough rate, the animals can pick out the leaves, leave the stems and still have plenty to eat.

After cutting regular grass hay mowdown, apply additional fertilizer and water. Under-grazed pastures can be cut out and mowed or stacked in the field. Here, too, additional fertilizer should result in more growth for grazing hay.
