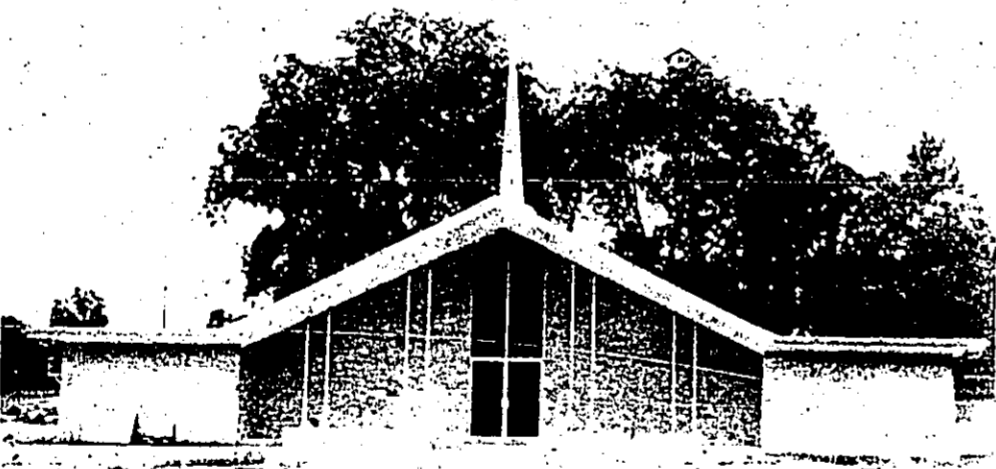

WEE WISDOM NURSERY SCHOOL MAKES PLANS FOR START-OF SECOND YEAR.

The second annual Open House for parents and children enrolled in the Wee Wisdom Day School will be held Sept. 6, at 7 o'clock p.m. in the Fellowship Hall of Woodville Methodist Church. Wee Wisdom Day School will officially open on Sept. 7, at 8:30 a.m. This school is non-denominational and enrollment is limited. Classes are held in the Educational Building, which is completely modern, centrally heated, air conditioned, and of fireproof construction. The enclosed playground allows opportunity for outdoor recreation and study.

The purpose of the Wee Wisdom Day School is to build a foundation for the first grade by developing the areas of Language, Social Studies, Number Concepts, Reading Readiness, Natural Science, Music Appreciation, Health and Safety.

There will be separate classes for 3-year olds, who will attend three days a week, and for 4 and 5 year olds, who will attend five days a week. The teaching staff consists of Mrs. Martha Sue Gregory, who will teach the five year olds; Mrs. Charles Blanks, Principal, who will teach four year olds, and Mrs. Dan Bynum, who will teach the three year olds.

When Bill Mahan of Colmesneil walked into Heritage Garden last week to place a replica of a deep sea diver which had been made at Pier 88 in New York in 1944, he was not prepared for the coincidence that would place H. L. Patterson of Texas City at Clyde Gray's museum at the same time.

For Mr. Patterson, then in the Army Engineers, was one of a group of Army diving trainees who went through a diving school conducted at Pier 88 in 1943, and the two had not crossed trails since.

Mahan, in charge of the diving school for the Navy, was training both Army and Navy divers as well as attempting to salvage the Normandy, which had capsized at the pier some time before.

Although Mahan and Patterson could not recall having met during the time the Army group was training in June 1944, both recalled the fact that Patterson's group went through the school and, since Mahan was in charge of the training, it is apparent that they must have seen each other there.

Mahan brought the replica of the deep sea diver to be displayed at Heritage Garden Saturday morning, and just as he was leaving he heard someone say, "I used to be a diver." He went back in and a reunion of sorts was held on the spot.

Mr. Patterson, with his family, was here in connection with the building of a home at Ivanhoe, south of Woodville, and decided to go through Heritage Garden. When he returns, the Pattersons will move to Ivanhoe, he said.

To get back to the replica of the deep sea diver, Mahan said it was one of five made to scale by personnel at the school in 1944. Not only is it made to scale, it is a "working model," since all parts are individually made and fitted together—valves on the lifeline can be turned to open and close, the knife can be withdrawn from its scabbard, etc.

Mahan said that while five of the replicas were made, only two of them are now on display. One is in a museum in New York, and the other is the one he placed in Heritage Garden.

A regulation deep sea diving outfit, full size, is also on display at Heritage Garden. With lead weights and metal headgear, it weighs in the neighborhood of 185 pounds—weight to most people would be a pretty deep neighborhood if they got into the water with the outfit on. Actually, with the lead weights around a belt worn at the waist, it would be good for about 500 feet for an experienced diver. If he wanted to go deeper, he would fasten another belt of lead weights around his waist.

And those readers who want to go into the subject deeper can go to Heritage Garden for further research.

Woodville Students To Register Sept. 2

It Rained, But Inches Vary Over Area

The squall line which passed through Tyler County Saturday night left varying amounts of rainfall ranging from about four inches in Woodville to only .20 in the Chester area. Rainfall varied greatly even in the Woodville area. At the Texas Forest Service gauge two miles south of town, only 2.70 inches was registered. Unofficial measurements in the city limits were as high as four inches. In the Dies community, the rain gauge at Ezra Eaves ranch measured only 1.5 inches.

The Saturday night rainfall was the only precipitation to amount to anything registered at the Forest Service gauge in July. For the rest of the month of July, only .33 of an inch had been measured. However, showers had fallen in other parts of the county, and one two-inch rain at Colmesneil did not reach this far south.
