This part of medicare is financed by a \$3 monthly premium paid by the beneficiary, with the government paying a matching amount outof federal general revenues. James explained that most people have the premiums deducted from their monthly social security, railroad retirement, or civil service retirement cash benefits. Others who have enrolled for the supplementary medical insurance protection, but who are not receiving cash benefits, pay the premiums quarterly by check or money order to the Social Security Administration or the Rallroad Retirement Board.
