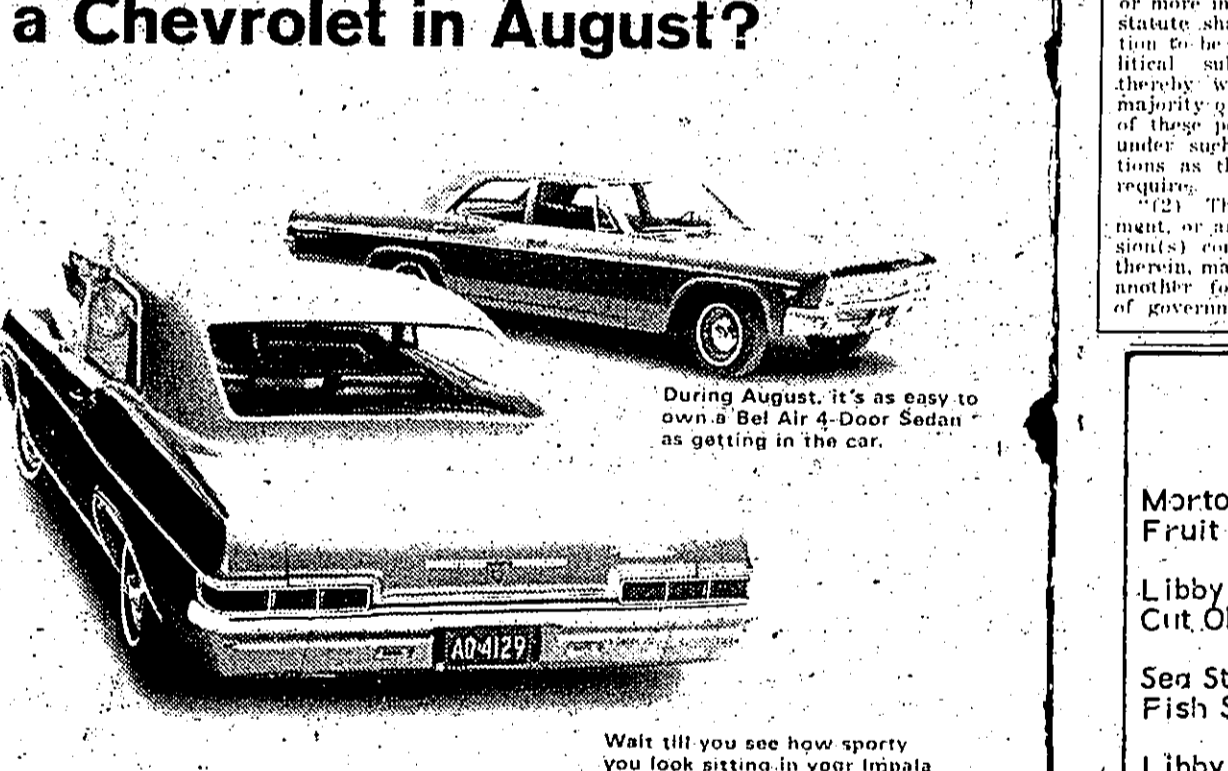

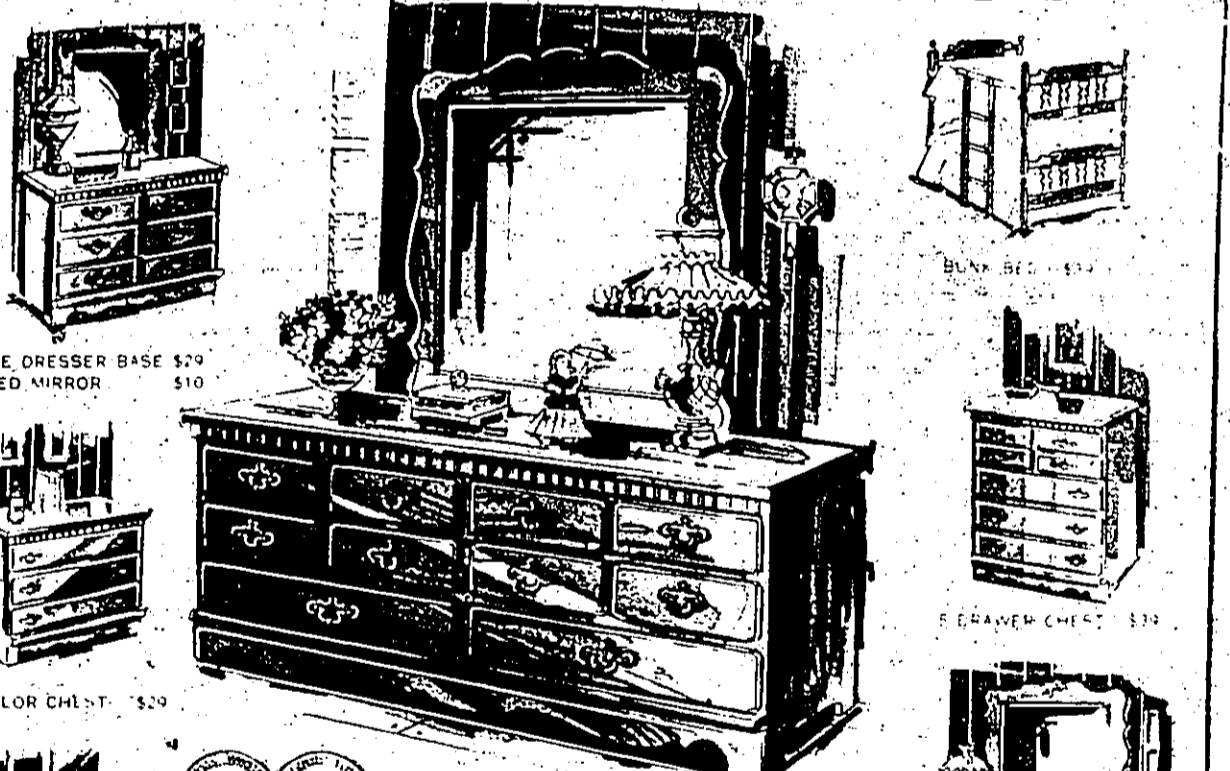

Two Millionth Telephone Is Installed By SW Bell

Installation of the two-millionth telephone in the South Texas area of Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. was observed August 4 in the home of a San Antonio couple. Installation of the phone was a major milestone in the rapid growth of the company's South Texas area, a geographic region covering about 107,000 square miles in the southern half of the state. The area includes four divisions—Houston, Gulf, San Antonio and Austin.

4-H Speakers Try Out For 3 Top Awards

Believe in your message and others will believe you. This is the advice given to 4-H Club youth striving to become effective public speakers. From numerous reports, it seems that the young speakers do talk about things they believe in such as democracy, citizenship, 4-H, family and community life.

In this state and 25 others, nearly 100,000 boys and girls have researched, written and delivered speeches. They are enrolled in the 4-H Public Speaking program supervised by the Cooperative Extension Service and sponsored by the Pure Oil Company. There is keen competition among members not only for the awards offered, but for their personal satisfaction of being able to stand up before an audience and communicate. Awards given annually by the sponsor are: medals of honor for county winners; an engraved wrist watch for the top boy; and a chest of silverware for the top girl in the state.

In addition, Pure Oil offers two \$500 scholarships annually to the boy and girl judged best from all state semifinal candidates. Two national champions also are chosen by the sponsor among the National 4-H Club Contest held in Chicago the week following Thanksgiving.

Among 4-H speech topics given are: (1) Get before your audience rested; eat sparingly. (2) If you are nervous, breathe deeply, several times before being introduced, and relax. (3) Smile. (4) Be natural, friendly. (5) Know your subject and talk in terms your audience will understand. (6) Never talk about stopping. Stop. Boys and girls enrolled in the public speaking program say that even limited experience has helped them thoroughly. The 4-H projects are just about wrapped up, but are interesting in that a 4-H public speaking project for next year should contact the county extension office, or agent in charge of 4-H work.

The specially designed antenna, Mr. Williams went on, will provide the best in color transmission as well as black and white. The move of the tower and antenna from the old site near Sabine Pass to the new Mauriceville location has taken over three months, and in the meantime Channel 12 service has been provided from a temporary antenna located at the station's studio building on Calder Street in Beaumont. Mr. Williams reminded viewers of Channel 12 that those who had outside antennas pointed toward the old location at Sabine should be careful to check the adjustment on their antenna to be sure that it is rotated properly toward the new tower.

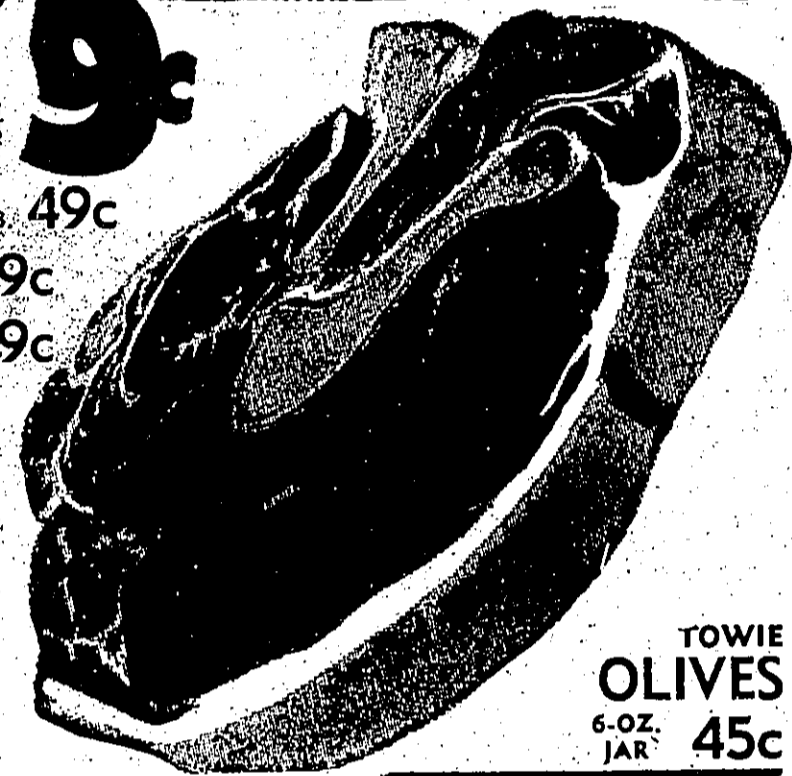
