Texas Youth Conference Held August 18-21

Over 1300 hundred outstanding youth leaders from throughout Texas gathered in Austin for the fourth annual Texas Youth Conference. The conference was held August 18-21 on the campus of the University of Texas under the sponsorship of the Texas Law Enforcement and Youth Development Foundation of Austin.

The conference emphasized teen injuries, tutoring programs for combating 6th grade dropouts, and community service for youth this year. A number of new films on youth problems were shown and are available to local groups through the conference.

The program is in its fourth year and involves over 250,000 Texas youths. Delegations from four states attended to gather material for organizing similar conferences.

Many law enforcement officers credit the Texas Youth Conference with playing a major role in the seven per cent reduction of juvenile crime in Texas during 1965.

Austin attorney Robert T. (Sonny) Davis served as director for the conference.

Delegates attending from Tyler county were Rodney Fortenberry and Paula Allison and Judith Sturrock was a junior counselor.

Youth Corps Jobs Open

Representatives from the Neighborhood Youth Corps district office in Beaumont will be at the Tyler County court house September 1 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. to take applications for employment and discuss the program with eligible young people.

The Beaumont district comprises 17 counties, including Tyler County, according to Rolland Ford, project director.

All interested youths between the ages 16 to 22 who are school dropouts or unemployed high school graduates can contact the representatives September 1 at the court house. Work assignments will be either on publicly owned and operated facilities or for non-profit organizations. Employment is designed to keep an enrollee occupied with useful work experience and will not displace any employed worker, Ford said.

Enrollees will be paid at the rate of \$1.25 per hour, with a 28 hour work week as an average. They will also receive vocational training, counseling, and remedial courses related to their job assignments. They will be trained as aides in medical, clerical, operational, maintenance, recreational, conservation and library work areas, Ford said.

Young people who cannot be at the court house September 1 for interviews may write to the Neighborhood Youth Corps, 650 Main Street, Beaumont.

Judge H. A. Coe of 88th District Court presided Monday at the regular fourth Monday hearing of divorce and uncontested cases.

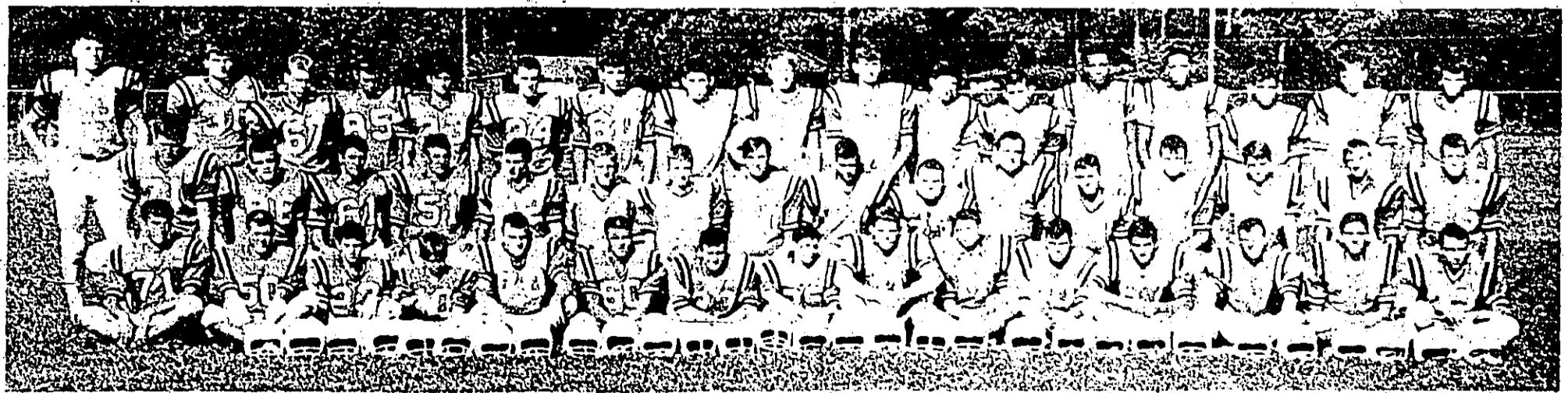

Another indication of a dominant profit motive is the use of professional techniques. For example: "A sometime photographer, with no studio, nevertheless took a lot of work on a professional basis. And the equipment he used was the kind used by professionals, not by amateurs. He too was allowed to deduct his expenses. But your assertion of profit motive is weakened if, over a long period of time, your expenses are high and your income low."

That depends primarily upon your motive. If you are pursuing the activity as a hobby, for the sheer pleasure of it, then you cannot deduct your expenses—any more than you could deduct the expense of a family picnic. But if you are out to make a profit, even though on a part-time basis, you are almost bound to take a deduction.

And what if your motive is partly pleasure and partly profit? Then, to qualify for a deduction, you must show that the profit motive is the stronger of the two. One indication is that you have what a court called "the requisite good." Consider this case: A businessman solicited a group in his spare time, but he put scant attention to holding meetings or to the financial picture of the group. Instead, relying
