County seat, on 200-acre plot donated by Josiah Wheat, named Woodville, for George T. Wood, sponsor of Bill in First Texas legislature, creator of the county, and 1847-49 governor of Texas.

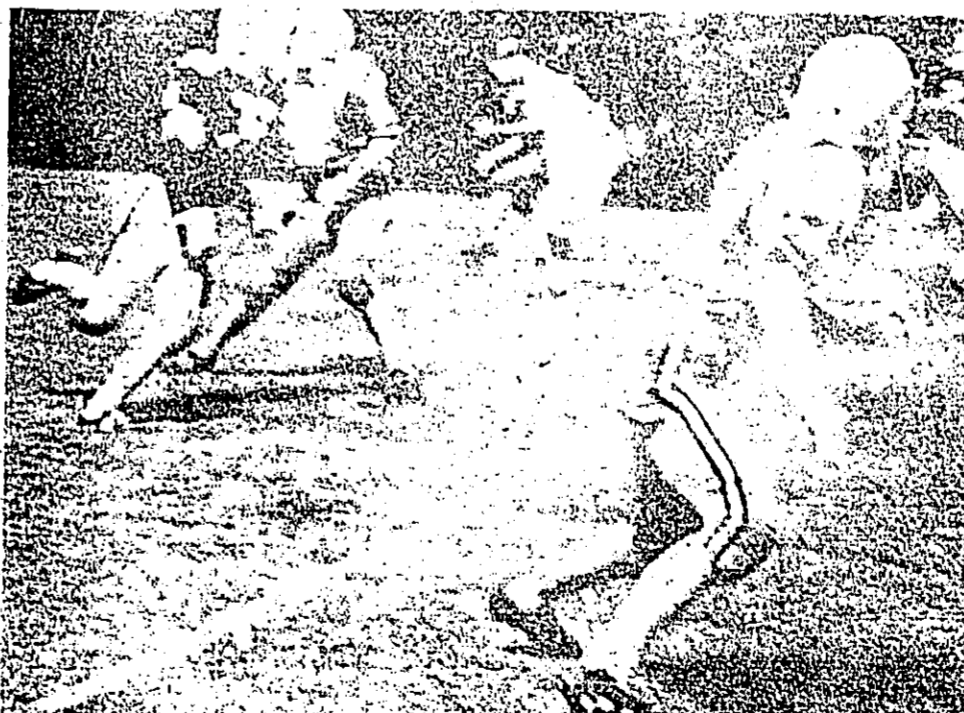
City Sets Clean Up Week Sept. 26-28
