

**EAGLES DEFEAT

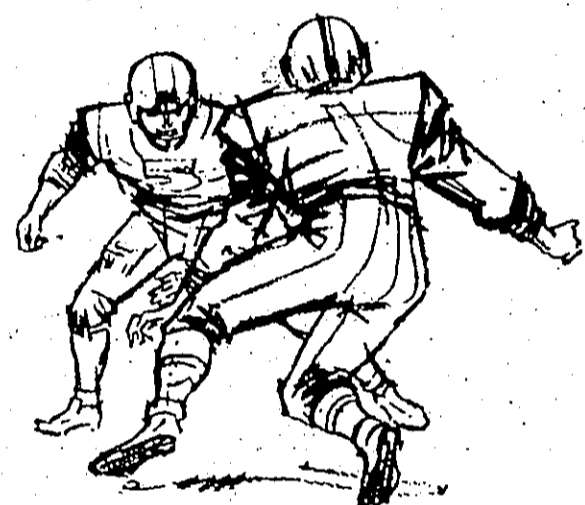

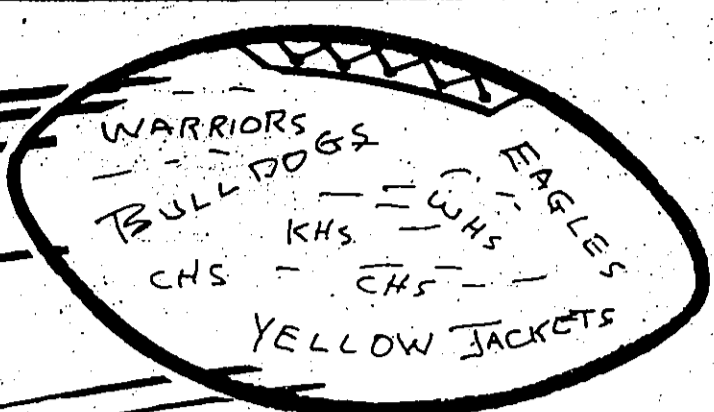

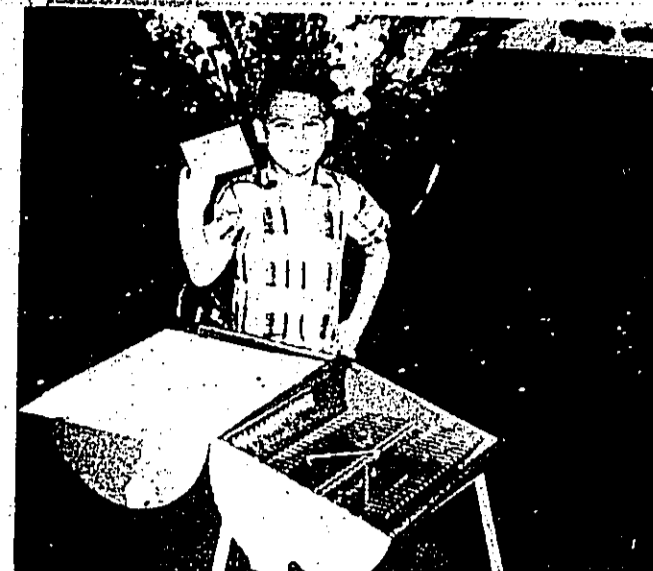
