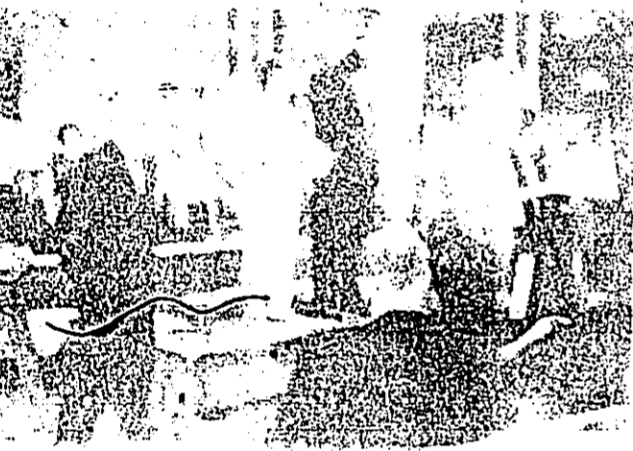

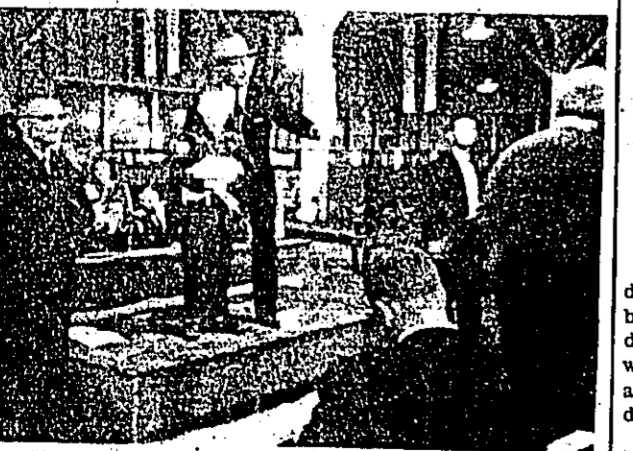
Judy Hickman, Chester 4-H, took 5th place. Her broiler was bought by Chester State Bank for \$45.

## Scenes For Film Are Made Here

When Clydd Gray began assembling the old buildings at Heritage Garden Museum, including the old Collier Store, the Pluck, Texas, post office, the old-time barber shop, and blacksmith shop he didn't realize that he was building a perfect movie set.

But Frank Dobbs, director of a documentary film on the legends of Santa Anna's treasure, said Saturday that a set like the ready-made one at Heritage Garden Museum would cost \$300,000 to build in Hollywood. And it was perfect for the town scenes needed in the movie.

Dobbs, director for Legend Production in Houston, was making the most of Heritage Garden Museum's authentic old-time buildings Saturday as the group, headed by producer Billy Joe Schindler, completed shooting the scenes in one day.

Legend Productions is composed of a group of men most of whom are connected with KTRH-TV, channel 2, Houston. Here for the shooting of the town scenes Saturday besides Dobbs and Schindler were George Chahin, cinematographer; Bill Henry, sound and lighting; Charles White,

who played the storekeeper; Del Englishby, who played the "oldtime" or stranger; Will Sinclair, a channel 2 newscaster who played the part of the town blacksmith; Larry Woldman, a actor and production assistant; and Carol Dobbs, wife of the director, who is in charge of continuity.

In the scenes shot here Saturday, several local persons were used in the scenes. Jerthro Holmes and his oxen were in a scene before the old country store to give atmosphere to the film. Jerry Risinger played a small boy, Jack Bynum the town barber, and Dan Bynum was pressed into one scene as a customer at the barber shop.

## County 4-H Sponsors Rat Killing Campaign

Rats are one of the most destructive and dangerous pests to have around a farm or ranch. They contaminate stored grain and exposed food and feed; they kill poultry and young livestock, and they start fires. Diseases such as leptospirosis, contagious abortion, trichinosis, distemper, strophic rhinitis, plague, typhus, salmonella, food poisoning and rat-bite fever are carried from place to place by these pests.

The rat population on your place can be controlled, however, if you will put forth a little time and effort. An extensive sanitation program, coupled with the use of anticoagulant baits, will effectively control the rat population. Once the rats have been eliminated, a small number of permanent baits and continued sanitation will help prevent reinfestation.

As long as there are rats in the area, however, your farm or ranch is in constant danger of becoming infested. A county wide rat campaign is being conducted by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Tyler County. Orders must be turned in at one of the following stations listed below by October 29, 1966. The orders will be 3 pounds for \$1.00. A rat must eat this bait 3-5 days before it will kill the rat. The bait is not harmful to pets. The stations for turning your order in are: Hutto's Grocery, Warren; Fred Grocery, Fred; J. W. Foxworth Grocery, Hillister; Spurger Mercantile Co., Spurger; Dean's General Merchandise, Colmansell; H. W. Lewis Grocery, Chester; Gillette Grocery, Doucette; Farmers Feed and Supply Co., Woodville; C. A. Williams Sporting Goods, Dam B.

You can pick up your rat bait at the station where order was turned in the first week or the second week of November. The Tyler County 4-H Clubs of Tyler County would like to urge everyone in the county to participate in the rat campaign, and help control the rats in Tyler County. Turn orders in by October 29.

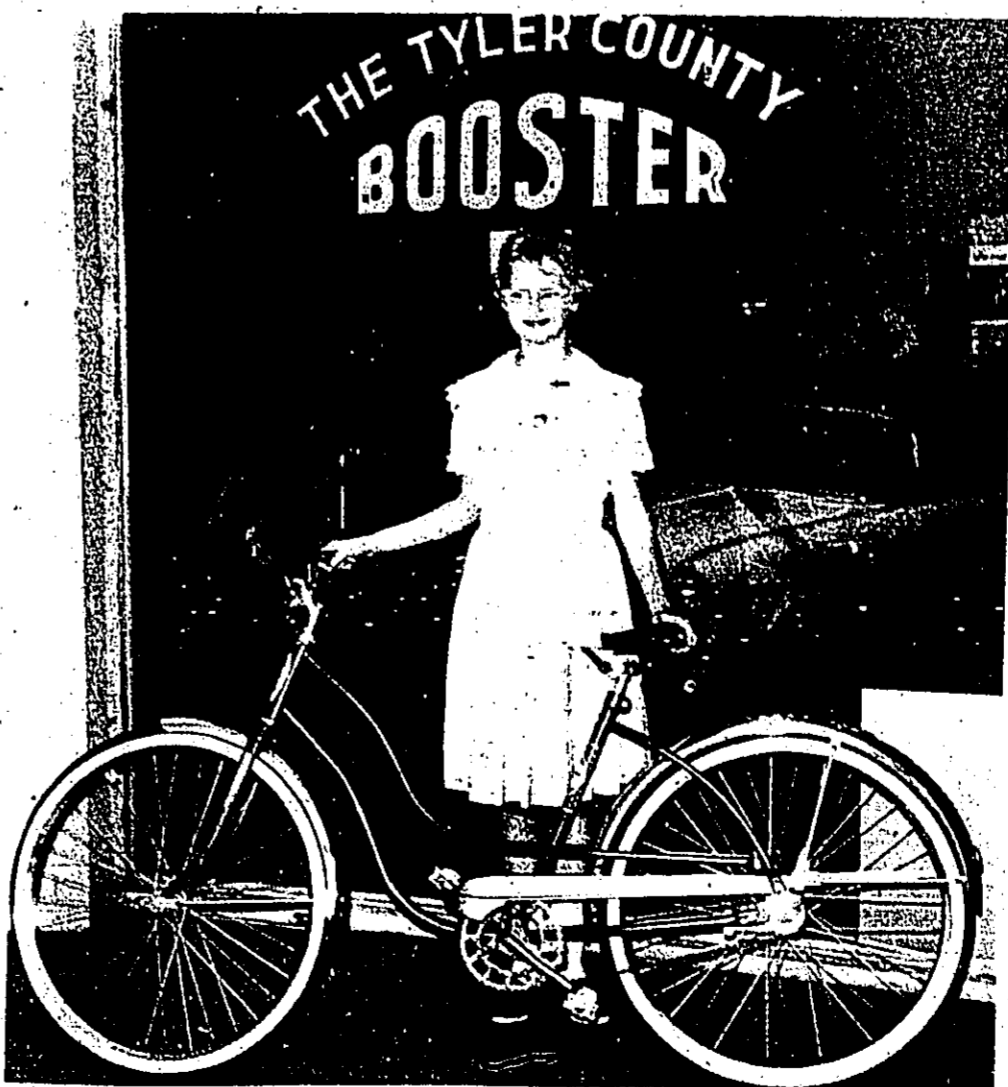

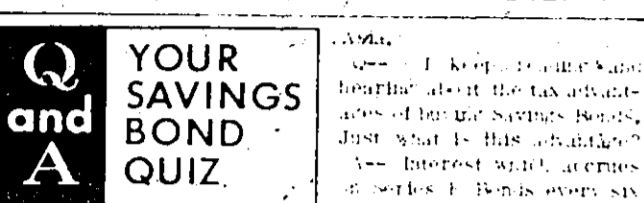

Current annual taxes paid to the various government agencies in Tyler County totaled \$14,502, it is announced by the Texas Railroad Association.

That amount was the county's share of the nearly \$90,000,000 the railroads paid in Texas and other property.
