14 Days Left Christmas Shopping

Woodville merchants began a campaign urging shoppers to buy early and buy at home during the final two weeks before Christmas.

State Audit Begins At Tax Office

Two auditors from the state comptroller's office in Austin, arrived in Woodville Tuesday to begin an audit of the books of the tax assessor's and collectors office.

The state audit was requested last week by A. L. (Pab) Thornton, Tyler County assessor-collector, after the June term grand jury returned an indictment against him in its final report alleging the embezzlement of \$16 on June 28, 1966.

Thornton said that it would take the state auditors approximately three weeks to make the audit. He said that he had also hired an attorney, R. Stanley Coe of Kountze, who would be here this week to confer with the state auditors.

The June term grand jury returned the indictment against Thornton Tuesday of last week as one of its final actions prior to ending its term. A new grand jury for the December term was impaneled Monday by District II, A. Coe.

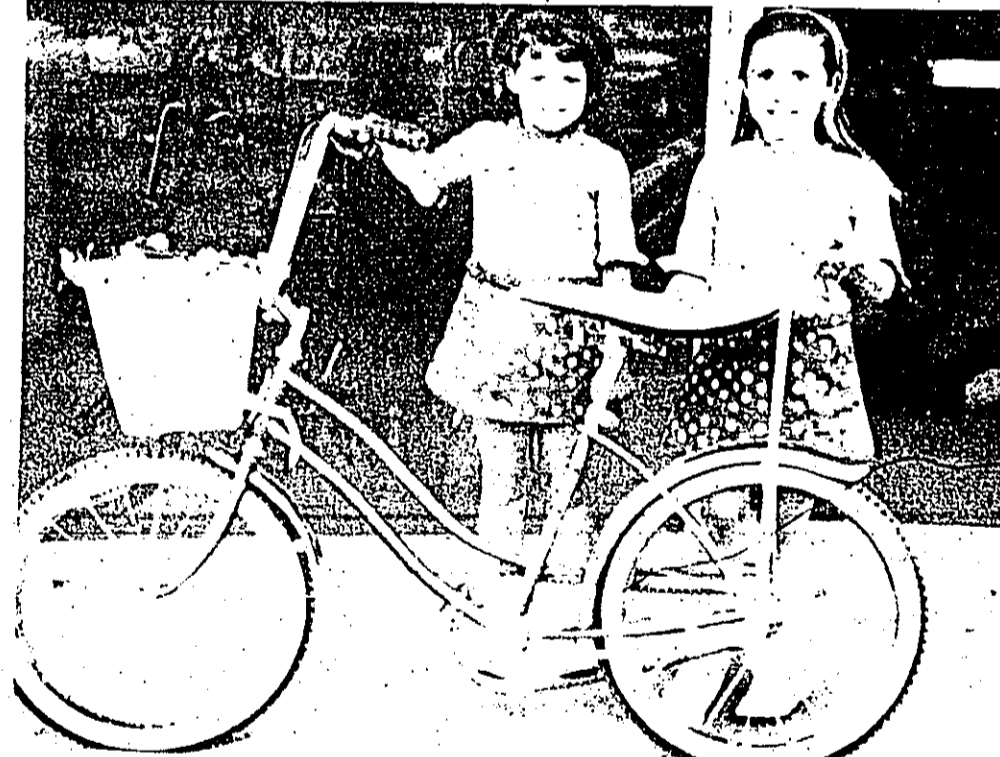

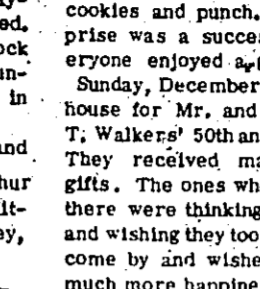

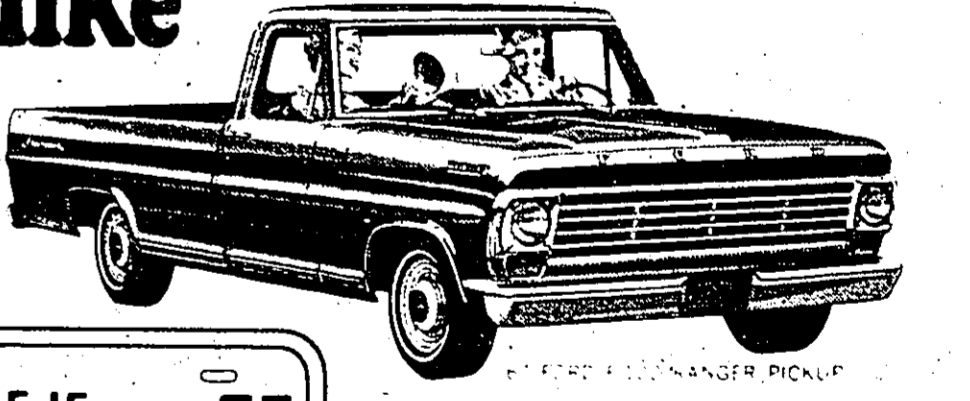
