

The county is beginning to look Christmasy with the many yard decorations and lights going up at homes. And the cool (or shall we say cold) weather this week reminds us that we may have a white Christmas--if you count a big white frost in the mornings. And people are beginning to think about shopping for the holidays. And we have had numerous boys and girls trying to earn bicycles for Christmas by selling subscriptions, and as you can see by the pictures in the Booster each week, many of them are succeeding.

Jim Dillon, the attorney who lives here and is connected with a law firm in Houston has been carrying Boosters to Houston with him whenever we have bear or other stories and pictures. We don't know what he may be telling the poor innocent city fellows about this part of the Big Ticket. And with pictures of bobcats, deer, snakes, etc., it may be that he has convinced them that he is living in primitive territory.

The Texas Safety Association has sent out a little printed Christmas message which approaches the problem of safe driving from the angle of the season. Here is its message:

A look at the high annual toll of human lives and disabling injuries from traffic accidents in our state could lend substance to the idea that we live in a jungle, that we must kill or be killed. Certainly Christians cannot subscribe to this idea, for man's spiritual enlightenment determines his concern for those in the world about him. The only possible Christian attitude in driving them must be: "I am my brother's keeper."

But what about the attitude of those who feel we live in a jungle? The instinct for self-preservation is inherent in all of us, but this does not mean in our present-day civilized society, we must kill or be killed. A better interpretation of this law of nature would be: "I am my brother's keeper, especially since there are so many times when he is mine."

When a driver takes his place behind the wheel, in a very real sense, he invokes this verse from Deuteronomy, fifth book of the Old Testament: "I have set before thee life and death; therefore choose life."

The commandment: "Thou shalt not kill" applies as much to the man or woman driving a car as it does on every other occasion throughout the day and night. It applies perhaps in greater degree, since so many people drive cars, and because the average person overlooks the fact that an automobile can be a deadly weapon.

County Officials Get The "Birds" On Annual Hunt

Four Tyler County officials went to Brant, in South Texas, for the annual quail hunting expedition which is held each year. Those making the trip were County Judge Jeff Mooney, Commissioners Herman Powell and F. C. Hicks, and Tax Assessor A. L. (Pete) Thornton. They returned Monday afternoon and reported that the birds were in ample supply--was almost impossible to keep from running over them with autos. The group with which they hunted killed around 750 birds, they reported.

Take Your Camera Hunting... Black Bear Still Around

The elusive black bear which was seen crossing Highway 190 at Big Cypress Creek west of Woodville several months ago is evidently still in this vicinity. A hunter in the Camden hunting club lease reported several days ago that he sighted the animal while on a deer

stand. He was in an area west of highway 287 about 11 miles northwest of Woodville. The Booster has been unable to have a photographer on the spot each time, so anyone else sighting the animal is asked to snap a photo of it. Deer hunters will have to arm themselves with a camera as well as a rifle in order to verify the animal's presence.

So far, no one has volunteered to take camera in hand and track the bear down. Especially no one on the Booster staff.

About three weeks ago three Vidor men, who were hunting west of Pinebluff in the San Raymond Reservoir area, shot a 300 to 400 pound black bear with buckshot, finally bringing the beast down after firing several volleys.

According to the Jasper Free-Enterprise, hunters circulated that the hunters were flooded heavily for shooting a bear out of season. The newspaper checked with game wardens and San Augustine County officials and found that the rumors were false. It is legal to shoot a bear in San Augustine County since the open season is the same as deer hunting season. In Jasper County there is no closed season on bears.

Many people have said that they would like to see bears get established in East Texas as a game animal, but there would have to be a seasonal, closed hunting period. Louisiana is buying the bears from northern states to get them established there.

Other people, of course, are opposed to establishing the bear as a game animal and prefer to have them shot on sight, which is what most people have done in the past and thus the bear is practically extinct in the area.

Toledo Bend Areas For Recreation Planned

The Toledo Bend Reservoir, which will be the South's largest when completed in May of 1968, will be developed as a recreation center, the Sabine River Authority of Texas said Monday.

Texas and Louisiana are sharing the \$65 million project to impound more than 5 million acre feet of water within 1,200 miles of shoreline. An acre foot is 325,851 gallons.

In disclosing plans for major recreational facilities, Simmons noted that outdoor recreation, and particularly water-oriented recreation, is fast becoming one of the major businesses in the nation and will continue to increase markedly in the coming years.

He said the authority will own and operate a large-scale recreational development close to the Toledo Bend Dam and indicated such activity will become a major part of the river authority's job.

The Toledo Bend Dam site is about 15 miles northeast of Burkeville. Simmons noted the authority is expanding its recreational

program at Lake Tawakoni, near Greenville, with a proposed \$300,000 Wind Point Park of 300 acres. The authority will use its funds with a federal grant of \$15,000 to build the park.

At the same time Tawakoni is attracting boaters and fishermen, Simmons said it furnishes the City of Dallas the bulk of its water. Greenville and Willis Points also share the water.

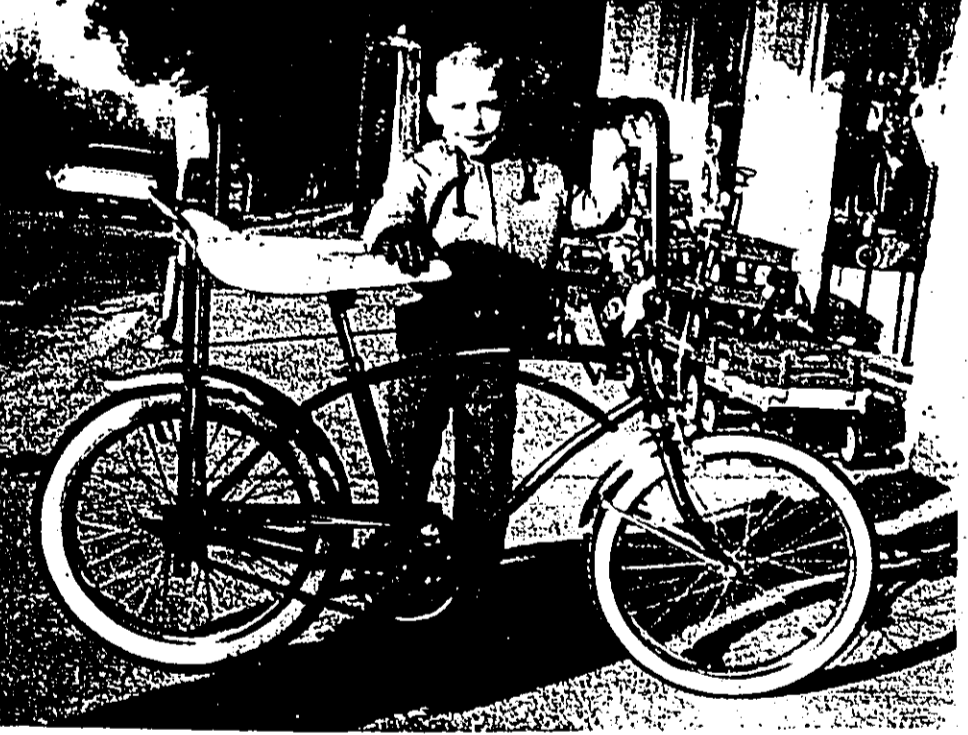
Simmons told directors the Sabine River program was progressing well. The authority is taking steps toward establishing water quality standards for the Sabine in the wake of an increasing amount of industrial development.

He said the authority is installing in co-operation with the Geological Survey a recorder-in-situ in the river at Bluff in Southwestern County which will measure the quality and stream flow.

During the past year, the manager reported, the river authority assets increased by \$8.7 million, from \$46.7 to \$55.5 million.

Mail Early, Post Office Asks, Avoid Yule Rush

Christmas is a frigid night, short this year, but those of us in the post office, Postmaster General Lawrence F. O'Brien has predicted that well over eight billion pieces of mail must be delivered between now and Christmas Eve, a new record.

We are asking that every one start mailing now. If all holiday mail were to hit the postal system at one time, it is obvious that we'd have difficulty delivering every piece on time.

The Woodville Post Office expects to handle more than 22,000 pieces of mail during the holiday rush, the Postmaster said.

Mailing early and spreading the mail flow out along the entire pre-Christmas season is the key to better mail service at this time of the year. Last year the public cooperation was tremendous, according to Mr. Furman. Virtually every piece of holiday mail was delivered before Christmas Eve.

Postmaster Furman offered these mailing tips:

- 1. Use ZIP Codes on all mail. If there are some ZIP Codes that you still need for your mailing list, come to the Post Office and pick them up in our ZIP Code directory or give us a call.
2. ZIP Codes are more important than ever this year. All parcels must be ZIP Code before mailing.
3. Prepare your first list now. The earlier you do your mailing the earlier will be the delivery.
4. Wrap your packages well. Include sufficient packing. Remember that your parcels may be shipped in a mail sack with a set of one-cloth riding on top.

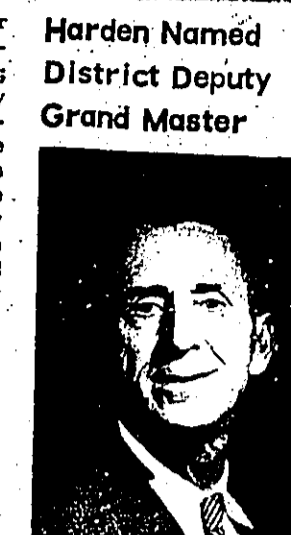

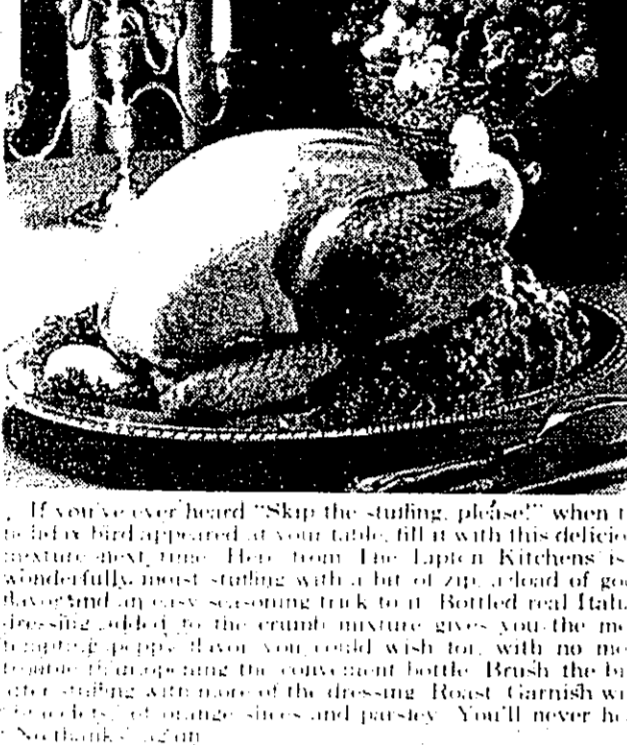
