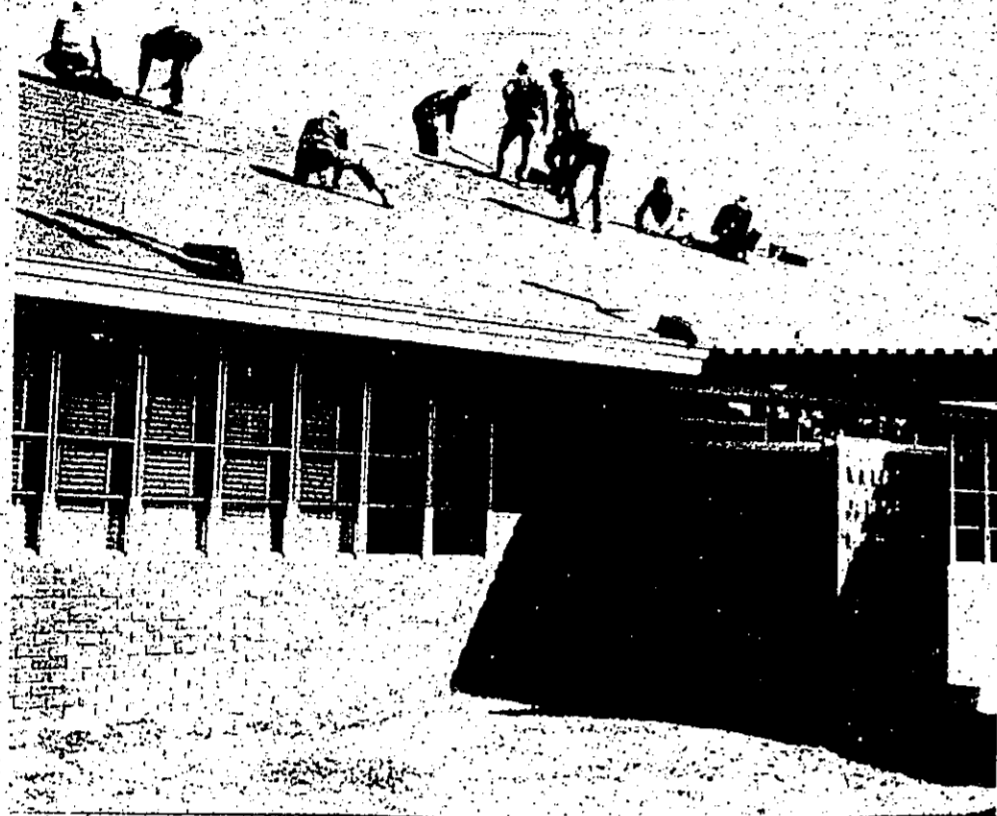

March Session Of 88th District Court Opened Tuesday

The March session of 88th District Court began Tuesday with cases docketed for the next five weeks. Judge H.A. Coe will preside. Civil cases will be heard the first, second, fourth and fifth weeks with the criminal docket slated for the third week.

On Monday Judge Coe was here to hear uncontested civil cases, including eight suits for divorce. Other cases disposed of were one adoption petition, one child support, one default judgment in a civil case, and two removal of disabilities.

Two criminal charges of theft, one each against Don R. Evans and Marcus Crize, were dismissed Monday when the complaining witness asked that the charges be dropped. The charges involved a misunderstanding on the part of the complaining witness about insurance premiums collected by the defendants.

Six new civil cases were filed in February, records in the office of District Clerk Hilda Coats show, and 13 suits for divorce were filed. The Tyler County grand jury returned three indictments Monday. Two were on charges of theft and one was for assault to murder. Only one of those charged had been arrested Tuesday.

Connally To Crown Dogwood Festival Queen

23 CANDIDATES FOR QUEEN IN FIRST JUDGING

Twenty-three high school seniors representing four Tyler County high schools entered the contest for queen of the 1967 Dogwood Festival in the preliminary judging at Dogwood Motor Hotel Tuesday night.

In the judging Tuesday night, two girls were chosen to represent their school in the semi-final judging March 6, when the four princesses will be chosen. The other four girls will serve as train-bearers in the coronation ceremonies March 25.

In each judging, which is conducted by the King's Men, the girls are scored on poise, personality and beauty through individual interviews. The King's Men is a group of representatives from each community in the county. Hugh Howard is chairman.

The four princesses who will be chosen March 6 are all eligible to serve as queen of the festival. The queen will be chosen in final judging of the princesses on March 21, but her identity will not be revealed until the coronation ceremonies on March 25. The runner-up will be princess of Tyler County, and the other two will be princesses from their communities.

TYLER COUNTY UNDER REPUBLIC FESTIVAL THEME

"Tyler County Under the Republic of Texas" will be the theme of the historical pageant presented at the Dogwood Festival of March 4.

Preceding the pageant will be the colorful coronation ceremonies in which will be presented the 1967 festival queen, her court of princesses from Tyler County, and 34 duchesses representing neighboring cities in the Southeast Texas area. Princesses and duchesses will choose escorts of their choice, and the queen will choose an escort who will reign with her as king of the festival. The queen's identity will not be known until the coronation ceremonies.

A feature of this year's festival will be the life-size reproduction of the steamboat "Laura" which traveled the Neches River and which had as one of its stops the river port of Town Bluff.

Governor Connally will be here to crown the festival queen, according to Jostan Wheat, executive director of the festival.

Women of the county are busy making the approximately 150,000 artificial flowers which will decorate the outdoor amphitheatre on the Woodville school grounds. The amphitheatre seats 3500 persons, and all seats are reserved. Tickets are now on sale at various locations, and out of town people may write Dick Davis, advance ticket chairman, at 104 West Bluff, Woodville. Tickets are \$2.00 each.

The day's events get under way March 25 with a two-mile long parade featuring elaborate floats, including the float on which will ride the princesses from Tyler County schools. The queen will be chosen from among the princesses. (See picture of steamboat at bottom of this page).

Women Injured In Car-Truck Collision Tuesday



Two Louisiana women were seriously injured Tuesday about 10 p.m. when their station wagon, shown above, was in collision with a truck-tractor at the intersection of Highway 69 and Highway 190 in Woodville. The station wagon, driven by Miss Betty Sue Terry of Louisiana, was headed west, and the truck, driven by James Dewey Buchanan of Ennis, was going north on Highway 69 when the accident occurred. Mrs. Terry and a passenger in the station wagon, Mrs. Louise W. Miteback of Fort Polk, were taken to Tyler County Hospital by an Edwards ambulance, where their injuries were described as serious. Witnesses said that the station wagon went through a red light into the path of the truck. Mrs. Terry's husband, Thomas L. Terry, is a serviceman in Vietnam. The accident was investigated by Assistant Chief of Police Ed Shumner. (Another picture on page 6).

Lufkin Man Killed In One-Car Wreck

A 40-year-old Lufkin man was killed in a one-vehicle wreck Saturday night to become Tyler County's first traffic victim of 1967.

James Everett Kenner was pronounced dead at the scene by Justice of the Peace Joe Longins. He was killed when the pickup truck he was driving went out of control on a curve north of Poyette and hit a tree. He was driving south and the truck crossed the highway, ran off the road and into the tree.

The accident was investigated by Highway Patrolman Joe Wilmon, who said that Kenner was alone in the truck. Kenner was a native of Pollock and had lived in Angelina County all his life. He was employed by Temple Industries.

The body was brought to Edwards-Funeral Home in Woodville and transferred to Oakley-Metcalf Funeral Home in Lufkin. He was survived by his mother, three brothers and three sisters.

Officers Charge Four With DWI Over Weekend

It was a wet weekend in Tyler County as far as liquor violations were concerned. Four persons were charged in county court with driving while intoxicated. One was arrested by sheriff's deputies and city police; two were arrested by Highway Patrolman Joe Wilmon, and one by Constable Jack Hayes. Two entered pleas of guilty before County Judge Jeff R. Mooney, and the other two pleas of not guilty.

The Woodville schools reopened Monday after giving students an unexpected week's vacation due to tornado damage to the buildings on the Kirby campus.

Workmen had the buildings sufficiently covered so that classes could be resumed Monday, which turned out to be a rainy day. Tuesday the sun was out again and work is proceeding on the various roofs.

Architects and engineers for the school examined all buildings on the campus and pronounced them safe for classes to resume.

Damage to the Kirby school gymnasium, hardest hit by the storm, will be made later.

Extent of the financial loss to the buildings, which are covered by insurance, has not yet been fully determined by the school board, according to W. S. Jarrott, president.

The Woodville Lumber Company, which with the Kirby campus of Woodville schools suffered most damage from the tornado February 20, again began full operations Monday.

The mill is still undergoing repairs to sheds and buildings which were extensively damaged. The smokestacks which were blown down were replaced at the end of last week. Lumber sheds which were damaged or blown away are being repaired while the mill operates.

Trail Ride Groups Organize For Festival Parade

Bob Bell, parade chairman of the Dogwood Festival, announced Tuesday that the presidents of the major trail rides which participate each year in the Dogwood Festival Trail Riders Association met Monday night and formed the Tyler County Dogwood Festival Trail Riders Association. The board of directors of the association will be made up of the presidents of the Tejas Saddle Club, Dogwood Trail Riders, Brush Riders of Spurver, Voth Night Riders, and the Carter Trail Riders.

Charles Dickens, of the Dogwood Trail Riders, was elected president of the new association. W. C. Crews, Jr. of the Tejas Saddle Club was elected vice president and John Carter of the Carter Trail Riders was elected secretary-treasurer. The new association will set the rules and be in charge of all trail rides and horses to participate in the Dogwood Festival Parade.

Man Fined \$150 By Jury Friday For Deer Hunting

One man charged with hunting wild deer with the aid of an artificial light carried his case before a jury in county court Friday. He was found guilty and the jury set his fine at \$150, which with court costs ran the cost of the deer to \$180.

Several of the persons who have been charged with hunting wild deer with the aid of an artificial light entered pleas before the Friday court session and two others changed their pleas to guilty following the end of the trial and conviction.

On pleas of guilty, Judge Mooney has been assessing fines of \$125 and court costs are \$28.75.

Historical Tour Set For March 24

Morris Clements, president of the Tyler County Historical Society, announced today that the society will again sponsor a historical sites tour on Friday, March 24, the day before the Tyler County Dogwood Festival. The tour will begin at 10:00 o'clock A.M. with registration at the Shivers Library and Museum in Woodville and after a tour of the library and museum will go to Heritage Garden where Clyde Gray has brought together the largest collection of tools and

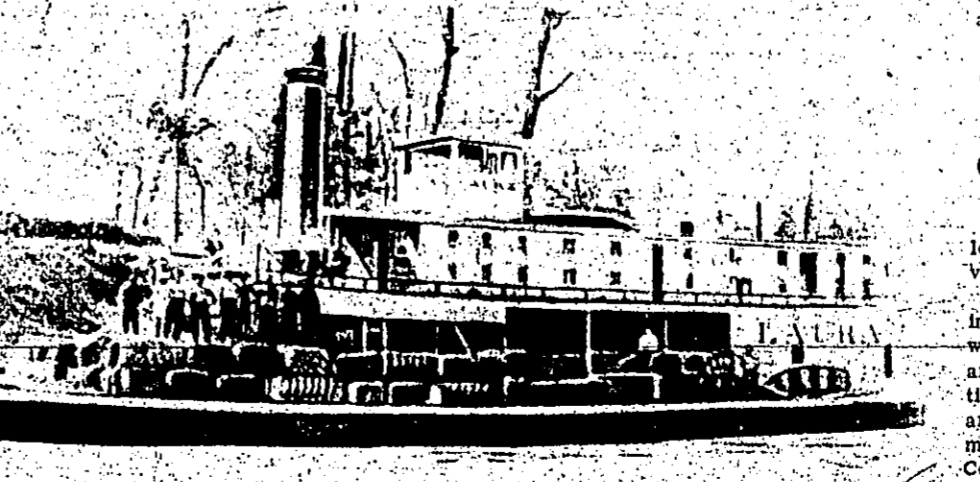
furnishings used by the early settlers of East Texas. He also has an overshoot water wheel, a grist mill, a black smith shop, an 1866 log house, an 1853 general store, syrup mill, whiskey still, and the world's only outdoor display of ceramic figurines. From Heritage Garden the tour will take a scenic Dogwood Trail to the Indian Ball Ground and then to the Indian Village, home of the Alabama-Coushatta Indians, the only Indian Reservation in the State of Texas.

Loan To Assist Indian Tourism Program Granted

Texas' only Indian Reservation, 15 miles west of Woodville on Highway 190 has received a \$125,000 loan to enlarge their accommodations for visitors, according to Walt Broemer, superintendent. Last year 60,000 people visited the Reservation and over 100,000 visitors are expected this year. Tribal members are busy building a living Indian Village, outdoor

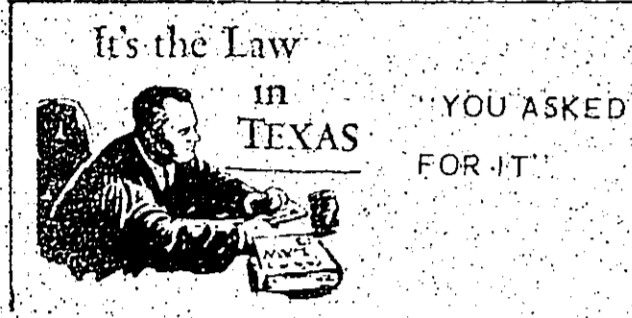

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

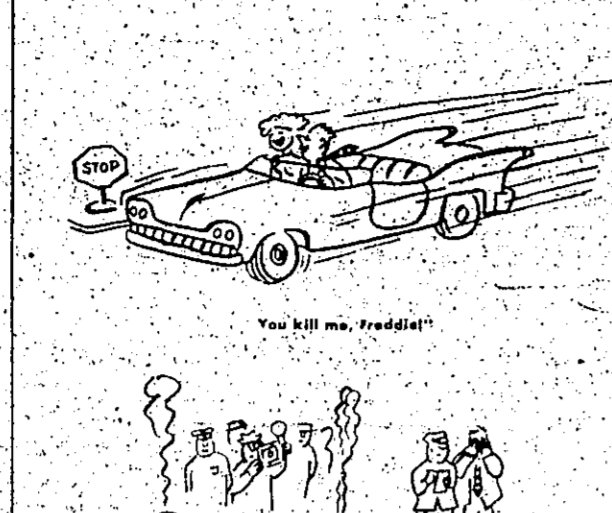

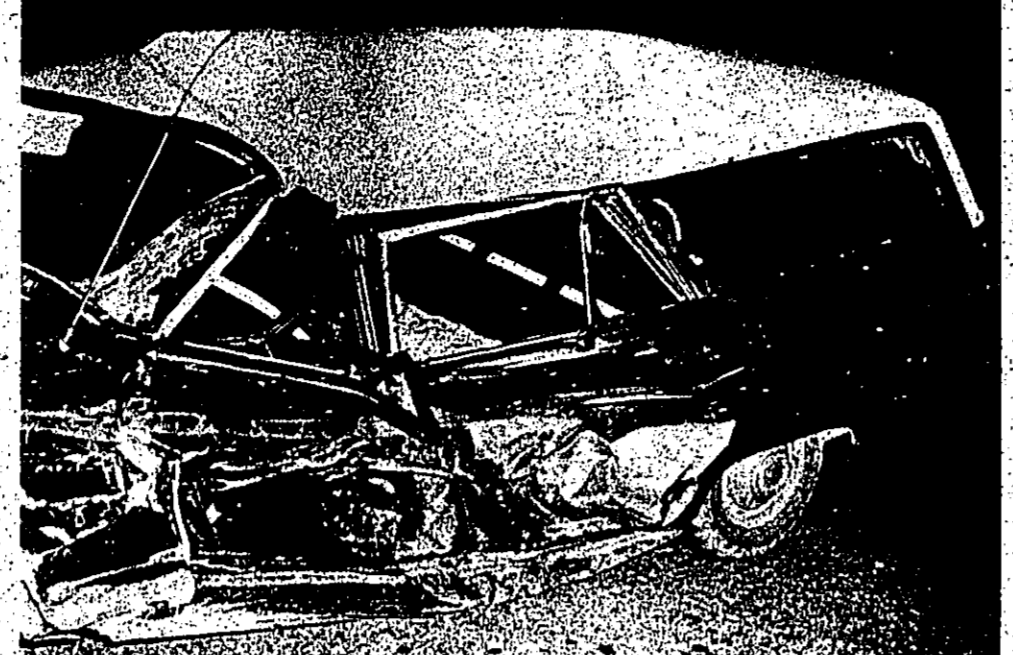
