Governor John Connally Monday proclaimed the week of March 19-25 as "Dogwood Week in Texas."

The proclamation cites the Tyler County Dogwood Association as an outstanding example of civic cooperation which attracts the attention of thousands of persons to the natural beauty of Texas.

The coming of Spring each year is heralded in East Texas by the flowering of the Dogwood Tree. The season of this flowering is marked by the Tyler County Dogwood Festival, featuring the coronation of a Dogwood Queen and the presentation of a historical pageant depicting some part of the history of East Texas.

The Tyler County Dogwood Festival Association was organized in 1939 to present the annual program "reliving of history in story, pageant and song" and emphasizing the beauties of Spring in East Texas. The first such outdoor historical spectacle ever presented in Texas was at the Tyler County Dogwood Festival.

The 24th Annual Tyler County Dogwood Festival will be presented in Woodville on March 25. This festival is an outstanding example of civic cooperation which attracts the attention of thousands of persons to the natural beauty of our State.

## Eight New Parks At Rayburn To Be Ready For Visitors

A total of eleven park sites including eight new ones, will be awaiting campers—estimated by some as being six million this year—flock to the shores of Sam Rayburn Lake within the next few months.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will open eight new sites to go along with the three already in operation by the U.S. Forest Service. The eight new park sites will provide facilities such as launching ramps, drinking water, rest rooms, barbecue pits and picnic tables and the Powell Park area will have shower facilities available.

In addition to these tourist attractions, three concessionaires—at Hanks Creek, Jackson Hill and Twin Dikes recreation areas—will offer boats, tackle, bait and other services to the visitors, who numbered 992,000 in 1966.

The three U.S. F.S. areas are Letney, Harvey Creek and Sandy Creek.

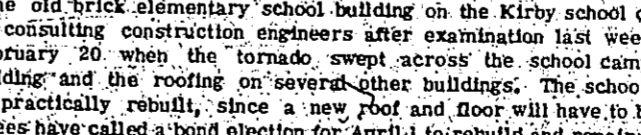

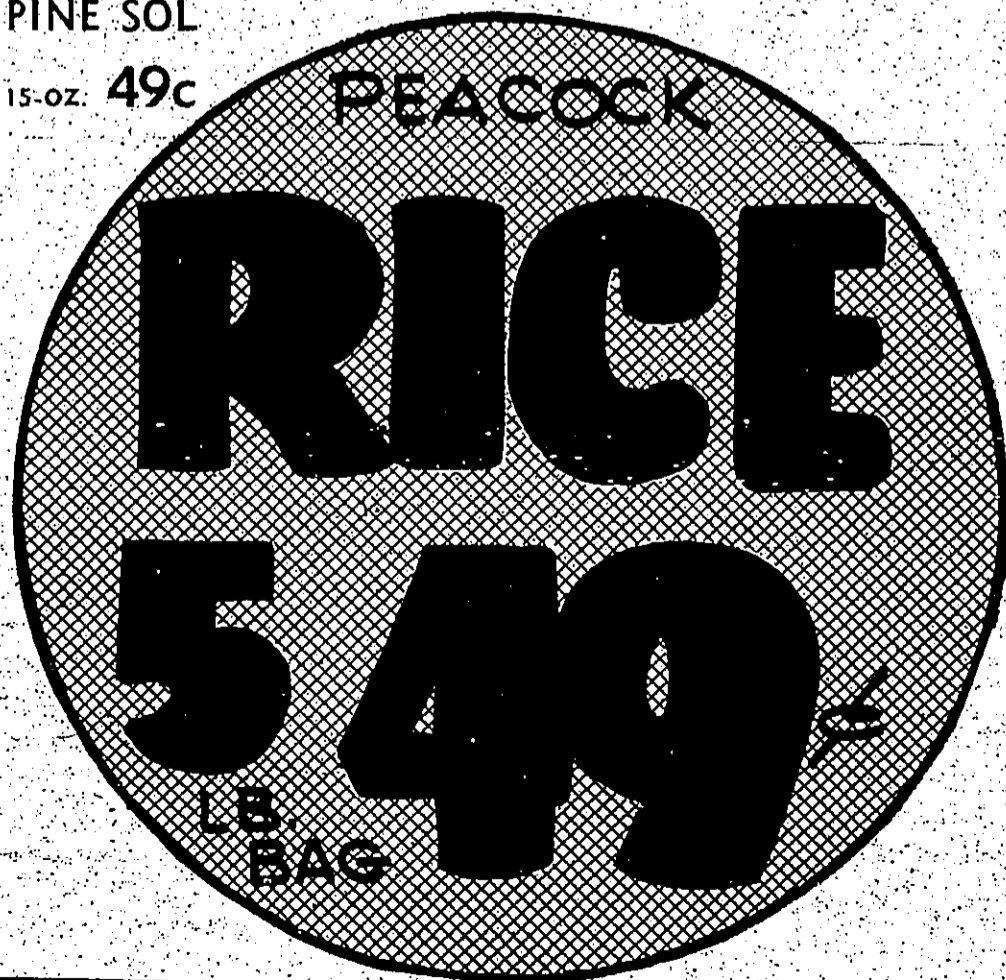

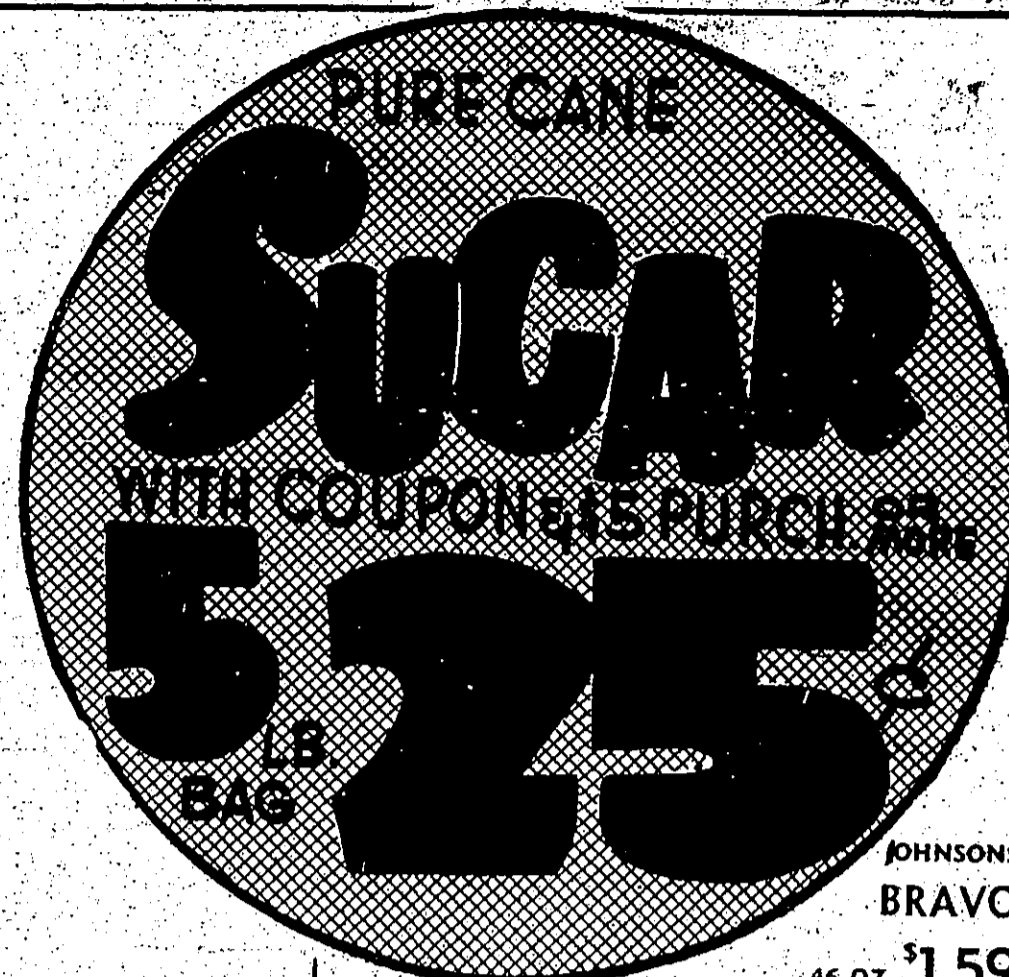
