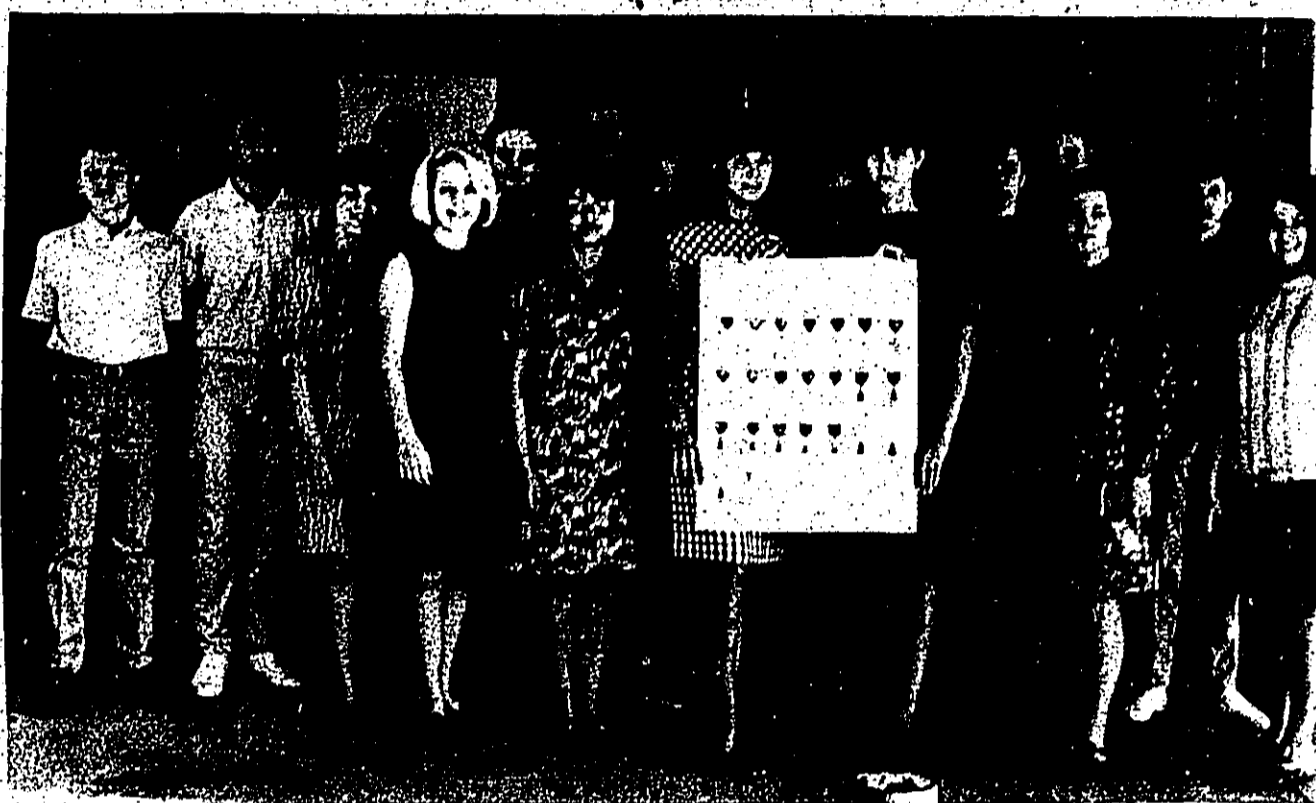

Suggestion Box

I hope this suggestion will be taken as it is meant--a solution to the problem faced by anyone needing an officer of the law at night.

I found when faced with this problem the other night that few people know how to reach an officer after dark. I tried calling the sheriff's office, but received no answer. I found later there is no one on duty there at night except on weekends.

I drove into Woodville, and went to the only service station open. The attendant told me where I could find the city's night patrolman. I located him and, although the problem was outside the city limits, he took over and I understand went to the location where an officer was needed, taking another officer or someone with him.

Now my suggestion is that the commissioners' court provide the sheriff's department with enough help that at least one person can be on duty to answer the phone and dispatch help. By the time I got into Woodville, about an hour had elapsed. In an emergency, that is too long. Too, the city needs some method by which a citizen may reach the night patrolman without having to go out on the streets and look for him.

My suggestions perhaps can be improved upon. But it is a problem that needs a solution, for when an officer is needed anywhere in the county it is usually an emergency.

SIX SENTENCED IN 88TH DISTRICT COURT TUESDAY ON GUILTY PLEAS

Six persons charged with felonies entered pleas of guilty in 88th district court Tuesday and were sentenced by Judge H. A. Coe.

Louis Ben Cloyd, charged with driving while intoxicated,

was fined \$250 and court costs. Willie McCoy received a two-year probationary term on a theft charge, and must make restitution of \$162 to the victim of the theft.

This year the parade will attract crowds of around 12,000 people and the coronation and pageant is expected to draw more than 3,500 spectators.
